1. Background:

The Government of Yemen has received a grant from the International Development Association (IDA) and intends to use part of the grant's proceeds to pay, under the Public Finance Modernization Project, for the post of Monitoring and Evaluation Specialist

MOF has created a Project Management Unit (PMU) whose purpose will be the implementation of Public Finance Modernization Project, the integrated administrative component, under the leadership of a Executive Project Director (EPD) assigned by MOF. Three core functions will be the responsibility of the PCU:

- i. the overall management and coordination of the project;

Military reinforcements sent to Ra'ada district, government continues fight against Al-Qaeda

SANA'A, March 3 - Although officials say the situation in Ra'ada district has calmed since the military launched a campaign at the end of January to "purge" the area of Al-Qaeda affiliates, they say they are prepared should confrontations break out again.

"We have taken all necessary security measures, and we are prepared for any confrontations with Al-Qaeda," Ra'ada's security chief, Hamoud Al-Amari told the Yemen Times.

President Abdu Rabu Mansour Hadi ordered the deployment of 1,000 Central Security Forces (CSF) last Thursday to the area in order to maintain stability in the area.

The president also ordered the establishment of an independent

branch to accommodate these forces, Al-Beidh Governor Al-Dahiri Al-Shadadi told to the Ministry of Defense's online newspaper, September 26.

Ra'ada is a district within Al-Beidh governorate.

Al-Beidh's governor confirmed to September 26 newspaper that the city of Ra'ada has been purged of Al-Qaeda militants, although many in the area say affiliates are still hiding outside the city.

One leading sheikh in the Ra'ada area, Ahmed Saeed Al-Dahb, believes that Al-Qaeda affiliates can be found in many areas of Ra'ada district.

"The purging of Al-Qaeda was only carried out in the Al-Manaseh area, not the entire district of Ra'ada," he said.

He does not believe that the gov-

ernment is serious and committed to purging Al-Qaeda from the area. "The government lies and covers

Capital city takes action to ban weapons carrying in public spaces

SANA'A, March 3 - The Interior Ministry ordered security authorities to enforce a public weapons carrying ban in the capital city on Saturday.

The ban is actually a part of a 1992 firearms organizational law that has been loosely enforced.

The law stipulates a ban on carrying firearms unless permitted by concerned authorities.

Following a year of increased assassinations, officials say the plan to implement the ban is in line with a larger security campaign that has been beefed up in anticipation of the National Dialogue Conference.

Dr. Omar Abdulkareem, Sana'a's general security chief, said the ban is not just applicable to public markets, but includes mosques, as well as parks.

Marib power station resumes work after attack

SANA'A, March 3 — The Marib power station was back in full action Saturday midday, following an attack on Friday by unidentified armed men, leading to power outages all over the country, some lasting longer than 24 hours.

Abdulrahman Saif Aqlan, the director of the Public Electricity Corporation, said engineers fixed the targeted power lines, ending power outages in all governorates.

Asked if the corporation has future strategies to hinder these attacks, Aqlan said, "We can't talk about strategies amid the crisis Yemen is currently witnessing," adding that Yemen in general needs strategies to solve its problems.

Aqlan made a plea to residents to stand by the side of the corporation and protect electrical stations, power lines and transfer stations.

Attacks like this are often carried or by disgruntled tribesmen with grievances against the state. Many Yemenis also accuse political bodies of hiring mercenaries to carry out acts of sabotage on electricity lines.

Residents are growing increasingly frustrated with power outages. The Public Electricity Corporation issued a report in December that revealed 148 attacks have been carried out on the Marib-Sana'a electricity lines since 2010.

Omar Saleh, a local resident, said that the Interior and Electricity Ministries need to take stronger action to solve the issue.

Residents are also questioning the ability of security forces to shield electrical stations from future attacks.

Dr. Qasim Al-Taweel, a security

affairs expert, recommends establishing a special forces team dedicated exclusively to protecting electricity stations.

He also said the problem will never be resolved unless the state takes serious action to negotiate with area tribesmen who are likely carrying out the attacks.

Over a three year period, the Public Electricity Corporation has sustained over YR33 billion losses due to the continuous attacks on electricity lines, including the costs of spare parts costs, repairs and alternative energy.

Yemeni-Turkish agreement to boost tourist cooperation; growing ties between countries

SANA'A, March 3 - A Yemeni-Turkish agreement was signed in Istanbul on Saturday to facilitate medical tourism between the two countries.

Tourism Ministry deputy Mutahar Taqi told the Yemen Times that cooperation between Yemen and Turkey is at its zenith due to a protocol the two countries signed in 2011. The protocol enhanced Yemeni-Turkish relations and encouraged tourism.

Turkey's medical centers have become a destination for many Arabs, Taqi said. This interested Yemen, and it has secured discounted prices for Yemenis for many procedures and activities.

Turkey says that Yemen's own medical and health facilities have potential and investment into these centers would go far. Turkey said it was positioned to help improve these centers and that Yemen will benefit from Turkish expertise in

these fields.

Yaseen Al-Tamimi, head of the Yemeni Tourist Writers Association, told the Yemen Times that Turkey will benefit from this agreement because it will encourage Yemenis to head to Turkey for treatment.

Diplomatic ties between Yemen and Turkey are growing. The countries recently announced a cancelation of visas, a decision that is still pending the Turkish Parliament's approval. Moreover, several Turkish events took place in Yemen this week.

The Strategic Thinking Turkish Institute in Yemen and the Democratic Stream of Consciousness held a workshop on Saturday about Yemeni-Turkish relations and the ongoing changes in the two countries.

In an interview conducted earlier this month, the Turkish ambassador, Fazli Corman, said Turkey is committed to helping Yemen develop, especially in the health sector.

160 hazardous, unliscenced gas stations to be shut down in Sana'a



SANA'A, March 3 — The Yemen Gas Company (YGC) says it will shut down over 160 gas stations in the capital city of Sana'a because they are not meeting safety standards.

The stations include locations where people refuel their vehicles and locations where residents fill gas cylinders for household needs like cooking.

"All unlicensed gas stations will be shut down because of their potential danger for residents," Manager of the Public Works office Abdulrakeeb Ata said.

Abdulhakeem Mohammed Qasim, manager of the VIP Consumers Department at the YGC said the company has already closed three of the gas stations.



Gas stations in residential area,



Prominent jambiya trader Obad AI-Ozairi to the Yemen Times:

"The original jambiya will prevail despite the invasion of 'Chinese' ones"

or about 60 years, Obad Al-Ozairi has been a jambiya trader, entering the business when he was a young boy. In his long tenure, he has seen the profession evolve from a reveled career to one that draws the ire of environmentalists. Through ups and downs, including a recent threat to the trade by international markets, Al-Ozairi still begins each day by training young to carry on his legacy.

A Jambiya is a type of dagger with a short curved blade at that is traditionally carried on decorative belts by Yemeni men. Historians believe its use dates back thousands of years. Today its appearance is still deeply rooted in Yemeni culture. Very few men are not given a dagger as young boys and tribal sheikhs, judges, businessmen and social leaders are often found boasting about their belted weapon.

Al-Ozairi is a part of this history. He inherited his business from his predecessors who began selling jambiyas over 200 years ago. The 70-year-old's family are considered pioneers of the jambiya trade in Yemen.

Al-Ozairi sons and grandsons decided to follow in his foot steps and are now running their own shops in Sana's and other governorates. Living for years in Kenya, Al-Ozairi brought back traditions to Yemen. He used to buy rhinoceros' horns to use them for making high quality and costly janbiyas, called

and environmentalists started a campaign several decades ago to stop this practice because it was endangering native rhino populations.

În 2009, the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) declared Yemen as a major threat that encourages rhino poaching for the use its historic daggers. The IUCN called on Yemen to ban janbiya traders from using rhino horns.

Al-Ozairi found himself on a black list for using horns of endangered rhinos and left Kenya.

But, since he and many Yemenis have complied with the IUCN's wishes.

"We've adhered to the agreement of banning rhino horn trading and stopped importing them," Al-Ozairi said.

However, the jambiya trader feels that environmental groups must also keep in mind people's livelihoods, "We demand compensation from the government and the IUCN because this agreement has highly affected our trade and caused a big financial loss.

While groups like the IUCN feel they may have gained ground in the rhino battle, Al-Ozairi says he and others still import elephant ivory and cows and buffalo horns now because they are less expensive than rhino horn.

Although he opposes the plastic versions out of principle, Al-Ozairi still offers this type of janbiya in his shops. "The high turnout for this type of jambiya forces

"Thos who make fake, plastic jambiyas have swindled many people out of a lot of money, convincing many customers that their jambiyas are unique," he said, taking it as a personal affront on his beloved profession.

Dr. Saeed Al-Amiri to the Yemen Times: Southerners have the right to raise the ceiling of their demands but peacefully

Dr. Saeed Al-Amiri, a leading figure in the Islah Party, says his political party upholds a modern civil state, furthermore asserting there is no contradiction between a civil state and Islamic law

Al-Amiri also stated in an interview with the Yemen Times that the Islah Party supports women's political participation

He also commented on recent clashes between The Southern Movement (SM) and the Islah Party in the South. He defended the SM's right to peacefully assemble. He condemned the use of what he calls excessive force in the South.

Also in the interview, Al-Amiri said former President Ali Abdulla Saleh and his former Vice-President Ali Salem Al-Beidh want to complicate the situation in Yemen and are attempting to foil the upcoming National Dialogue Conference (NDC). However, Al-Amiri remains hopeful that the dialogue will proceed peacefully and efficiently.

Let's start with the Southern launch a march as well. Movement (SM). It is said that the SM aims to deliver a message through rallies that it is still influential. The Islah Party wanted to send the same message through its latest march in Aden. During Yemen's current turbulent situation, is there a need to show off influence?

The Islah Party is a civic party that struggles peacefully. We haven't said the SM is armed, but there are factions that carry weapons. It is Ali Salem Al-Beidh's faction, who is regionally and externally supported by countries like Iran. However, there has been a peaceful SM in governorates since 2007. The peaceful SM inspired the Arab Spring revolution. Our brother Southerners should preserve this peaceful influence. It is an honor for them. With regard to exerting influence, the SM organized the Reconciliation and Tolerance Festival which was well received. Private and state-run media outlets welcomed the festival.

The February 21 Festival was celebrated on the first anniversary of the peaceful transfer of power. This day is a historical occasion that all Yemenis take pride in.

The Islah Party and other revolutionary groups wanted to celebrate this day in a peaceful manner by means of a peaceful civil festival. Then our brothers in the SM disrupted this event. Why?

The Islah Party's march may ing to say it any time. If the SM have provoked the SM. Why

Those who held the march were not all from the South. Did the Islah Party mobilize people from the North in order to appear larger in numbers? I followed that issue up, and I found out such claims are inaccurate. Over 90 percent of the attendees were from Southern governorates. I read an interview with engineer Haider Abu Bakr Al-Atas, whom we respect, but he said the participants were Northerners and the evidence he cites is the Bara dance. This speech is really reprehensible. Apparently, he has been living abroad for a long time, and he is no longer able to distinguish between folklore activities of the South and the North. Anyway, the people of Aden know who attended the festival.

Why did the Islah Party hold the festival in Aden's Parade Square, which the SM always uses to celebrate such occasions? Why this venue? This was not a problem. Is this place the SM's property?

Let's suppose revolutionary youth went to Tahrir Square to celebrate a particular occasion even though the square is known as the home of Ali Abdulla Saleh's supporters. What would happen?

I am telling you this, and I am willwants to hold a festival in Al-Siteen

nor of Aden Waheed Rasheed belongs to the Islah Party? The governor belongs to the Islah Party, but the rest of the authorities still belong to the former regime. In the end, violence is denounced by the Islah Party. SM affiliates wanted to break into the festival's venue by force. Politically speaking, the state is the only one who can use force, not individuals. No one is allowed to resort to force.

There are rumors that there was coordination between the Islah Party and President Hadi to hold such a festival one year after the presidential election.

As a matter of fact, it was not only to commemorate Hadi's election. It was a celebration of the peaceful power transfer, the ousting of the former president and an achievement of the goals of the revolution.

Did you expect riots when you planned the festival?

From my perspective, the festival was peaceful. What justification did the SM have to spark riots. All violent acts are punishable and condemned by international conventions and laws. Today, the peaceful option is the modern way to change any regime.

The Islah Party is the only group that has accepted the issue of unity. Abdullah Al-Nakhibi, one of the SM's leaders, said the attack on Islah's headquarters was meant to prevent it from adopting the Southern Issue. The main party that currently recognizes the Southern Issue is the Islah Party.

You refuse secession, so what do you mean you recognize the Southern Issue?

Southerners have the right to raise the ceiling of their demands but peacefully. Anyone can come to Sana'a's Change Square and talk about it. I'm the head of the political forum in the square and I'll support that by all means.

Does Islah have a vision to end the festering situation in the South? Islah isn't a state yet.

But isn't it a partner in the government? President Hadi has paid a visit to Southern governorates and met with SM leaders, but the media exagger20 percent of seats for youth, want a Southern state, secession less than 30 percent for women and less than 50 percent for Southerners. Is it reasonable that the Islah misunderstood this percentage?

I think this has been reviewed.

It has been reviewed and resubmitted to the committee, but some say political parties should not mistake such information?

No one is infallible. The Islah Partv is broadly represented in many areas. This causes such a shortcoming.

Some say Islah has excluded some of its youth members, who have been active squares, but have differing opinions of than Islah. Why were they not included on the lists?

This is because of the small percentage allotted to the Islah Party. Islah received 50 seats in the NDC, and then the number went down to 47. This isn't representative in comparison to its large size. In spite of this percentage, Islah accepted the number for the sake of Yemen.

Why wasn't Tawakul Karman among the names listed to represent Islah in the NDC?

Karman has become a universal figure and is a Nobel Peace Prize winner. Even though her name wasn't included, she will be monitoring the situation.

It is said Islah has included the names of some Al-Ahmar sheikhs because the General People's Congress (GPC) has included the names of controversial figures?

Names have not been announced clearly yet, and the Technical Committee is still sifting through them. The Gulf Initiative stipulated that those accused of violating human rights cannot be included.

What is Islah's vision for the NDC regarding the form of the state: federalism for several regions, two regions or another option?

There are several visions. Some

and federalism.

But what is Islah's vision?

All opinions will be presented at the NDC. I don't know what Islah's vision is prior to the NDC, but Islah will welcome whatever is agreed upon.

So you don't have a clear vision prior to the NDC?

We do, but it will be presented at the NDC.

Will you support a civil or Islamic state?

We support a modern civil state. I have conducted research about this. The civil state began in Medina at the time of Prophet Mohammed. The principals of a modern civil state were implemented at that time.

This will be an Islamic State? Actually, a civil state doesn't contradict Islamic Sharia.

Will Islah support women politically and grant them 30 percent of their political positions?

Personally, I support including women in all positions because they are partners alongside men.

Is it possible for a woman to be the head of the Islah party or the secretary general in the future?

Why not, but the Islah Party would have to agree about that.

Some say that Saudi Arabia supports the Islah Party in efforts to oppose Iran. What are your thoughts on the relation between Islah and Saudi Arabia?

The Islah Party has open relations worldwide, even with Iran, but we refuse Iran's intervention in Yemeni affairs.

So you confirm Iran's intervention in Yemen?

Yes, for sure. There was an Iranian weapons shipment that was sent to Yemen and it has a relationship with Al-Beidh, who supports secession. This is well-known.

was this the first time the Islah party celebrated the anniversary of Yemen's unification?

The Islah Party's festival was to celebrate the first anniversary of President Abdu Rabu Hadi's election as well as to celebrate the ousting of [former President] Ali Abdulla Saleh from power. In one day, the former regime was ultimately toppled. The festival was held in Aden, and everyone had the right to celebrate. Aden belongs to everyone. Aden is open for all people, from Hindus to people from Somalia. Therefore, Aden is not owned by a particular side. The SM has the right to organize a festival in Al-Siteen Street in Sana'a or any other place. We support them doing that.

Some say that the Islah Party should talk the SM into taking part in the dialogue, instead of provoking disgruntled Southerners through marches?

The participants of the marches are not only from the Islah Party. As far as I know, Southern groups also took part, but the Islah Party was the dominant force in this march. The Islah Party always leads revolutionary activities. Since the beginning, the Islah Party was the major organizer of the march. This is not provocative. Festival organizers were from the South. Why is it that Southern Islah is not from the South? Are the armed SM affiliates representative of Southerners? The Southern Islah man has the right to Square, the same place revolutionaries hold their festivals, they have the right to do so. What is important is to be peaceful and civil. This is the most important issue. Violence is rejected.

What took place in Aden was violent. Excessive force was used to crack down on some SM affiliates? Violence is rejected.

Who used power against the SM affiliates?

The festival was announced two weeks prior to kicking off. Suddenly, SM affiliates broke into the festival on that day. They wanted to break into the venue by force. The situation escalated to the point that some ordered hotel owners not to accommodate Northerners.

Security forces attacked Southerners under the pretext that they were separatists. Is this justified?

No, we denounce repression. We condemn detention. This is inappropriate. However, we also condemn riots started by SM affiliates.

Why did the Islah Party not release a statement denouncing the riots that took place in Aden?

The Islah Party condemned the violence that erupted in Aden and Hadramout.

Did the Islah Party resort to using power because the gover-

Do you think holding the event affected the National Dialogue Conference (NDC) and caused some Southern members of the **Dialogue Committee to leave** in protest of what happened in Aden?

Some internal and external bodies are playing in Yemen and want to create disorder, but I assure you, the NDC will continue. What is the justification of the armed SM? What was their motive to oppose security forces? Some former regime affiliates support the activities of Ali Salem Al-Beidh, the former President of the south.

Ali Abdulla Saleh and Ali Salem Al-Beidh want to create havoc in Yemen and obstruct the NDC, but I believe nothing can really affect it because the only way to solve our problems is through dialogue.

Do you think Islah's behavior could have caused the attack on its headquarters?

Setting fire to Islah's headquarters is a direct attack on the aims of the 2011 revolution because the Islah Party was its main component. The revolution belongs to all people. Shaking up the political atmosphere before the NDC is also another possible cause.

ates the situation. Hadi did his best to calm the situation. He said he won't stand for the spilling of blood in the South and threatened to try those who create havoc in the International Criminal Court. Islah and all its partners in the Joint Meeting Parties are working to restore tranquility.

Only three weeks left before the NDC and the situation is still unstable. What should be done to pave the way for the NDC?

I think all political bodies should work together to pave the way for the NDC. First, the state should speedily implement the 20 Points put forth by the Dialogue Committee.

Is there enough time to implement them?

The most important of these points, including following up the committee that was assigned to tackle the issue of land in the South and also the point regarding retired Southern military men should be implemented urgently. The official media should create an appropriate ground for the NDC.

All people, political and civil parties should support the NDC and tolerance should be the dominate message on the channels.

The Islah Party submitted the names of its representatives for the NDC to the Technical Committee, allotting less than

تهيئة مناخ الحوار الوطنى في تقديري مطلوب من عدة جهات تعمل علّى تُهيئة المُناخ. أولاً على المستوى الرسمي لا بد أن يتم الإسراع في تنفيذ النقاط العشرين.

النسبة بسيطة جداً، في تقديري إنه تم مراجعتها.

تم تعديلها وتسليمها للجنة لكن هناك من يقول يفترض أن لا تخطئ الأحزاب في أشياء معلومة وثابتة؛ أي عمل بشري يتعرض للخطأ، ولكن النسبة بسيطة وتم مراجعتها وتعديلها. أنت تعلم أن الإصلاح حزب كبير موجود في كل قرية، المساحة الكبيرة لحزب الإصلاح يولد مثل هذا القصور.

هناك من يقول أنه تم استبعاد بعض الشباب الإصلاحيين من قوائم الإصلاح والذين لهم أنشطت كبيرة بالساحة لكن لهم وجهات نظر قد تكون مخالفة للإصلاح رغم استمرار انتمائهم إليه، لاذا لم يمثلوا في قوائمكم؟

ضالة النسب هي المشكلة. الكل مدرك أن النسبة التي حصل عليها الإصلاح ٥٠ مقعداً ونقصت إلى ٤٧ وهي لا تساوى حجم الإصلاح الكبير. النسبة ضئيلةً ومع ذلكُ الإصلاح قدم تنازلات من أجل الوطن، وهذه النسبة الضئيلة لا تستطيع أن تقارب فيها، ولكن حتى يمضى الحوار وخروج اليمن مما نحن فيه لابد أن نقدم تنازلات.

لو عدنا إلى قوائم حزب الإصلاح هناك بعض الأسماء مثل مشائخ من آل الأحمر يقول البعض أن الإصلاح وضعهم في قوائمه لأن المؤتمر وضع أيضا شخصيات ذات خلاف عليها؟ الأسماء لن تعلن حتى الآن بشكل واضح، واللجنة الفنية تعمل عملية غربلة، وما ورد في المبادرة الخليجية أن هناك خطوطا حمراء لمن لديهم انتهاكات لحقوق الانسان وقتل الشباب وقتل الثوار. هؤلاء الذين عليهم خطوط حمراء ما عدا ذلك فالمسألة عادية.

هلستدعمون فكرة الدولة المدنية أم

دولة حسب الشريعة الإسلامية؛ نحن مع الدولة المدنية الحديثة. أنا لدى بحث حول هذا الموضوع، الدولة المدنية هيّ أصلاً بدأت في المدينة المنور بقيادة الرسول صلى الله عليه وسلم، كل مفاهيم الدولة المدنية الحديثة فيما يتعلق بالمساواة والعدل وسيادة القانون كل ذلك طبقت في دولة المدينة.

هذه دولة حسب الشريعة الإسلامية؟ أصلا الدولة المدنية لا تتناقض مع الشريعة الإسلامية ولا تتعارض معها.

هل سيعمل الإصلاح على دعم المرأة سياسياً ومنحها نسب ٣٠ ٪ من المناصب السياسية؛ أنا شخصياً مع أن تتولى المرأة اي منصب في الدولة، المرأة شريكة للرجل.

هل ستكون المرأة رئيسة للإصلاح في المستقبل أو أمينا عاما للحزب؟ لو ارتضت قواعد الإصلاح لذلك فلم لا؟.

كيف نستطيع أن نقيم علاقة الإصلاح بالسعودية؛ هناك من يقول إن السعودية تدعم الإصلاح وأن الإصلاح يناهض إيران حرصا على علاقته بالسعودية؛

الإصلاح علاقته مفتوحة مع الناس كلهم حتى مع الشقيقة إيران لكن يرفض التدخل السافر في الشأن اليمني. ما يحدث اليوم هو تدخل من قبل إيران وهذا ليس من مصلحتها في الشأن اليمني، نحن علاقتنا طيبة مع العالم كلُّه.

أنت تؤكد أن هناك تدخلات إيرانيت في اليمن؟

جداً والدليل شحنات الأسلحة الإيرانية التي وصلت اليمن وعلاقتها بعلي سالم البيض الداعم للانفصال ودعم إيران له. هذه مسألة معروفة لكل الناس.

بالنسة لعلاقة الإصلاح بالحوثيين، كيف تنظر لذلك خصوصاً في ظل الصراع الدائر في حجة الذي يهدأ ويعود من جديد؟

علاقتنا كانت جيدة في الساحة وما زال هناك تواصل. وندعو الأخوة الحوثيين إلى ترك السلاح والانخراط في العمل السلمي السياسي وتشكيل حزب سياسي. خلافنا مع الحوثيين في صعدة وحجة هو حملهم للسلاح والاعتداء على مقرات الإصلاح في صعدة وبعض أعمال العنف

في حجة.

هناك من يقول بدلاً من أن يساعد الاصلاح على دعوة الحراك الجنوبي إلى الحوار الوطني، ذهب الإصلاح لًاستفزازهم بالمظّاهرات التي لا يرغبون بها؟

Schools failing to get books in the hands of students

libraries lthough are recognized by local educators as benchmark of quality schools, few teachers in Yemen can say they are able to provide their students with the valued institution. An estimated 94 percent of schools in Yemen lack libraries, according to the Yemeni Center for Historical Studies and Future Strategies (Manarat).

"Children cannot acquire knowledge in the absence of libraries inside schools," said Abdulla Al-Olfi, the studies and training coordinator at the center.

Even schools that do have small makeshift collections of books, are neglected by state funding and failing to help students in a well above 50 percent, according to figure from the United Nations Development Program.

"There is no typical school library that provides sufficient services in Yemen. Most libraries lack either books or equipment such as computers and Internet," said Khaled Al-Okbi, the activities coordinator at the Education Ministry.

Libraries provide a chance for the children to hone their talents and improve their learning, according to Dr. Salah Al-Deen Al-Jumaei, a sociologist at Sana'a and Amran Universities.

He criticized a current overall lack of resources like books and magazines in schools, which are depriving children of creative and critical thinking skills.

Afaf Al-Haimi, a sociology professor at Sana'a University, said

country where illiteracy rates reach one large issue is that most schools do not even have a room for a library. If a classroom does have a library, she says it is usually a small space with limited resources.

The Social Development Fund (SDF), in coordination with Yemen's Foundation to Spread Culture and Knowledge, provides books for several libraries in schools. However, the SDF say they lack adequate funding and this hinders their work.

Without the government to provide him books, the Vice Principal of Al-Bonian School, Abdulhakeem Al-Moafa, said that the school requested the SDF provide books for his school's library seven years ago, but they never received them due to funding issues.

"We prepared a large room and kept waiting for the SDF," Al-Moafa said. "Now we use it to keep old equipment and furniture."

Dr. Mohammed Ali Saif, a researcher who studies the issue, says a library rarely is established with the purpose of becoming one, it is usually an afterthought thrown together with whatever resources a school can find.

He says only about 20 percent of libraries in schools have extras like televisions to show educational films or computers.

"All the libraries fall short of computers. If available, there are very few and are used by the librarians for some administrative works and information recording," Saif said.

Librarians

A lack of modern sources in libraries is not the sole problem.

have specialists to manage them.

AliA-Ezi, a teacher in the state-run Hael Boys School said the majority of employees in the libraries are not qualified to do such a job.

"If there are no specialists for this job, the school administration simply chooses one of the teachers as a librarian," he said.

Educators stress the importance of librarians having certain characteristics such as sympathy,

intelligence when dealing with children, which they say can be hard to come by as no one trains them specifically in such skills.

Majed Al-Humaidi, a lecturer in the Social Service Department at Sana'a University, said the few librarians that do exist tend to be female because of the societal attributes that are associated with them. Al-Humaidi said this is true all over the world and gave

The libraries that do exist do not compassion, tactfulness and the example of France, where approximately 80 percent of children's library employees are women.

> Educators and researchers continue to advocate for an increase in funding and increased awareness of the current lack of facilities and awareness.

> "If [books] are offered to school libraries, we will have an educated generation capable of building the country," said Al-Jumaei.



Cairo Declaration on Community Media

Editorial

practitioners and representatives of community media, took part in the second regional conference for community media in North Africa and the Middle East under the title, "Channeling our Voices," held in Cairo Feb. 25-27. The conference was organized by the Community Media Network (CMN) from Jordan and Community Media Solutions (CMS) from the United Kingdom, in cooperation with UNESCO and AMARC. It was also supported by the Swedish International Development Agency and the British Foreign Commonwealth Office.

After many specialized meetings and workshop sessions aimed at reaching common ground regarding the legislative, political,

social and cultural environment basic requirements for success on support and to sustain the work of surrounding community media, we have concluded that the radio frequency structure remains restricted in favor of governmental and commercial use. This discourages the possibility of community radio's growth and its emergence as a major contributor to sustainable development as has been proven in other parts of

the world. Legislation, for the most part, still gives public and commercial broadcasters a monopoly and fails to recognize community broadcasting.

The current political, social. economic and legislative landscape is not enabling community media to reflect the desires of civil society and it denies the possibility of an interactive media culture.

We have also concluded that Internet broadcasting lacks the

technical and professional levels, which therefore lessens its ability to continue and be effective. We note the absence of orga-

nized and coherent measures to

community media which reduces its quality and is not consistent with international standards guaranteed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, and



similarly in the International Covenant for Civil and Political Rights. Freedom of expression is also guaranteed in numerous Arab and African declarations that grant broadcasters ample opportunity to interact freely in media outlets owned by local communities. • Therefore we recommend the

following: • Amendment of legislation, regulations and orders that restrict the ownership of community media to align them with internationally accepted criteria as established by active international bodies. Furthermore, there should be a reduction in fees and other financial requirements for non-profit community media organizations, as well as a cancellation of customs on equipment for community radios. We call for an advocacy campaign to accomplish these legislative, regulatory

and administrative changes.
