As Yemen Times Closely Monitors the Escalation at the Yemeni-Saudi Borders

Yemen Times visited Yemen's borders with Saudi Arabia to have a close look at the tribal sites owned by Wa'elah tribe and other tribes affiliated to it. YT also got informed on the military confrontations between Wa'elah tribe and the 3000 strong soldiers military camp there under the command of Brigadier General Abdullah Darass.

YT met with tribesmen from both countries living on both sides of the border line and learned about their military force. YT discovered about the military weapons owned by Wa'elah Tribe headed by sheikh Mohammed Bin Shajae, including 22 military sites equipped with heavy, medium and light weapons, cannons and 200 military vehicles. Sheikh Bin Shajae stressed the tribe's strong rejection of Jeddah treaty signed between Yemen and Saudi Arabia on 12 June, 2000. He said that the treaty was a violation of the tribe's lands. He said that they possessed 240year- old tribal documents signed between their tribe and Yaam tribe from the Saudi side. The tribesmen said that they do not understand the new demarcation and that they would not recognize them. Bin Shajae expressed his readiness to face and prevent any company that would come to demarcate the borders, adding that they were ready to risk their lives in defense of their land.

Military confrontations which erupted between Wa'elah tribe and Darass military camp have claimed the lives of 24 tribesmen and 15 soldiers, said Bin Shajae.

On the other side of borders, specifically in some villages affiliated to Wa'elah, such as Najran, more than 500 Yemenis were granted the Saudi nationality.

Some tribesmen said that in case a conflict with the government complicated the situation and they could not get their basic needs, they will obtain some supplies such as oil, kerosene and other food-stuffs through a path called al-Khadra'a area.

Yemeni-Saudi borders suffer from the lack of security attention as many people in al-Buqa and Saywoon Yemeni governorates saw many Saudi tanks infiltrating into Yemeni territories. It was reported that military confrontation between Yemeni and Saudi border patrols took place claiming the lives of three Saudis, two Yemenis and wounding many others from both

ABU DHABI- A United Arab Emirates' leading newspaper Sunday criticized the extensive flow of Israeli goods recently into the Yemeni markets. Commenting editorially on the issue, the Abu Dhabi-based Arabic Daily "Al Ittihad" said that the Yemeni markets had witnessed recently extraordinary flow of Israeli goods, whereas these goods are demonstrated openly at stores, shops and business firms by the virtue of its low price. The paper noted that, according to news agencies, many shops present these products at the capital Sanaa and other several cities like Aden, Taiz, Hodeidah and Mukalla at a price cheaper than their similars.

"The trial of invading the Arab markets has been a

newspaper.


"What is serious in this matter is that, the Israelis are not satisfied by invading the Yemeni markets with their goods only," the paper warned. (Xinhua)

With Sanchez' right eye swollen, Hamed hit him with a three-punch combination in the forth that sent him staggering to the floor. Sanchez tried to get up before falling back into

Referee Michael Ortega immediately stopped the fight, and doctors swarmed the ring and loaded Sanchez onto a stretcher. He was taken to the trauma center at Backus Hospital in Norwich; Dr. Joseph Carpentieri said he probably suffered a concussion.





1500 AIDS Cases in Yemen

Official statistics indicate that about 1500 people are afflicted with AIDS in Yemen, 40% of whom are from Africa. However, some information show that the number of AIDS cases in Yemen is more than what is officially declared. The first AIDS case in Yemen was discovered in 1987 in one of the students who used to study abroad. It is worth mentioning that there are about 52 million AIDS cases in the world.

Foreigners Residence Law Amended

In a statement to 26 September newspaper, Brigadier Saeed Abdu Al-Khameri, director of legal affairs at the Interior Ministry said that some amendments had been done to law No. 47 for 1991 concerning foreigners entry and residence in Yemen. Foreigners arriving in Yemen have to enroll their names and the purpose of visiting Yemen at the nearest police station to their residence within one week from arrival. Illegal residence fines according to the new law increased to 6 month imprisonment and YRs 30 thousand. Same punishment is imposed on those who enter illegally or do not renew their residence, he said. He added that such procedures would help limit illegal arrival, departure and residence.

Yemeni-Saudi Committee Meets

The Yemeni-Saudi Committee headed by Ministers of Interior of both countries issued a statement following its meeting last Tuesday in Sana'a. The statement included ways of military withdrawal and border demarcation. The two ministers agreed on meeting next October 15 in an attempt to give the other committees a chance to final-

ize their work and agree on the company that stake. (Xinhua) would carry out the demarcation task.

First Agricultural Census Launched

More than 2500 researchers are taking part in the First Agricultural Census since unity. Covering 2,200,000 families, the census aims at the creation of a relationship framework among farmers and outlining the structure of agricultural sector.

Digital Mobile Phone to Be Introduced

The Yemeni government has approved the Sabaa Phone Company to execute a digital mobile phone project before the end of the year, said a source at Telecommunications Ministry here on Saturday. Under the project, capital Sanaa, Aden and other main cities will be covered by the mobile phone network within one year, and the network will extend to the rest of the country in a couple of years, the source said. Under a contract between the company and the government, Sabaa Phone Company will pay the government 10 million U.S. dollars for the operation permission, he added.

To head off monopoly and guarantee high quality services, the government also allowed Space-tel Company, owned by investors from Yemen and Oman, to take part in the project. The Sabaa Phone Company is expected to spend roughly 50 million dollars in the first year, and the total investments may amount to 130 million dollars. The firm is owned by Yemeni Al-Ahmar Trade and Industry Company with a 41 percent stake, Egyptian Orascom Company with 32 percent stake, Greece Hailascom Company with 22 percent stake and the International Contractors Union Company with 5 percent

Who Will Protect Judges From **Interference of Influential People?**

Tudge, Abdu Rahman Abu Taleb was released last Monday after a week-long kidnapping by Bani Dhubian tribe East of Sana'a. Constitutional Amendments

The first chapter of the constitution and all political articles are subject to referendum. The remaining chapters can be amended by the majority in parliament and the wouldbe al-Shoura Council.

Power of the legislative authority is to expand in a way enhancing democracy in Yemen. With changing the Consultative Council into a Shoura Council, the latter is to embrace technocrats and economists. Political and economic articles are to be amended to agree with Yemen's tendency towards the free market economy, encouraging and facilitating investment through legal legislations.

President Ali Abdullah Saleh had previously referred it to an ad hoc committee headed by Sheikh Abdullah Ben Hussein Al-Ahmar, speaker of the parliament. The committee included Vice Premier and Minister of Foreign Affairs Dr. Abdul Qader Bajammal, Head of the Constitutional Committee at The Consultative Council Mr. Abdul Wahab Al-Anisy, Minister of Justice Mr. Ismael Al-Wazeer and Minister of Legal Affairs Mr. Abdullah Ghanem before presenting it to the parliament.

On the other hand, heated debates have been risen between the PGC and Islah party which has rejected any amendment to the present constitution. Newspapers have reported Sheikh Al-Ahmar as refusing the suggested amendments because they aim at adjusting some of the parliamentary power to the Consultative Council. However, Mr. Abdul Wahab Al-Anisy denied such statements.

Some sources attributed the Islah's acceptance of such amendments to pressures practiced on it by the PGC as a result of the recent crisis over Al-Thaqafiah newspaper and as a bargain to stop defaming Islah leaders by official newspapers.

Sources from Opposition Coordination Council criticized the amendments describing the whole story as a deal between the PGC and Islah.

As far as tribes' reaction is concerned, an official source in the Supreme Council for Mareb and Al-Jawf Confederation refuted in a press statement all excuses to amend the constitution. Moreover, he pointed out that extending the parliamentary period was a sign to the government's unwillingness to accept results of democracy.

The statement stressed necessity of respecting the constitution and called for stopping unjustifiable amendments which weaken power of the constitution.

Six kilograms of Hashish have been seized and destroyed in Al-Baidha'a governorate, stated director of security in the government. Owners were referred to court for trial.

University fees' Case Referred to Justice Minister

Judge Mansoor al-Arjali, head of the West Secretariat Court, Tuesday adjudicated reference of the case of Sana'a university students to the Justice minister to take measures on implement the court's verdict on cancelling the Cabinet decision on raising university fees. Judge al-Arjali's decision came after the Cabinet's refusal to carry out the court's verdict. It was mentioned in the verdict that the Authority should be an example for individuals in respecting judiciary verdicts. The decision of raising fees aroused resentment among students who had staged protest demonstrations and peaceful strikes.

The measure was described as a violation of the constitution and legal rights to education.

Bani Jabr Pleas for Help

Tribesmen of Bani Jabr, Khawlan, appealed in a statement sent to human rights organizations to help free 65 people who had been detained in the Military jail since June 28 2000. Tribesmen gathered in front of the Presidency Office, following the President's orders to compensate them for damage to their properties during military attacks late December in 1999. However, instead of receiving compensations they were arrested and taken to prison.

Branch Lawyers Union's **Election Date Fixed**

The Lawyers Union council last Wednesday discussed a number of issues relevant to the council and branches. Held under the chairmanship of Lawyer Abdulfattah Al-Baseer, Dean of LU and Lawver 'Muhammed Naji Allow, in charge of branches, it adopted a resolution calling for holding of elections at all branches according to the time-schedule approved by it.

The Council also approved acceptance of fresh requests for membership enabling applicants to obtain licenses for practice and opening offices. It is understood that a special form has been prepared for this purpose with copies available at all branches, preparatory committees and the secretariat of profession affairs. The Council, through its branches, has urged all its members to see that they meet all conditions so as to enable them take part in the forthcoming elections.

Investment Press **Conference Put Off**

The Chamber of Commerce and Industry in Sana'a has postponed investment press conference until Wednesday owing to the illness of Hussain Ali Al-Witari, chairman of the general federation of chambers of commerce and industry.

The conference was scheduled for Sunday. It will be attended by a number of MPs, advocates, academicians and businessmen. Discussions will center on premises of encouraging and attracting investments and importance of cooperation between private sector and the state to achieve the targeted oals. Moreover, a number of financial viola tions that affect investment process in our country will also be reviewed.

Japan Funds Polio Center

The Polio National Center funded by the state of Japan in Aden amounted to YRs 1,533,000,000. The center serves the southern and eastern governorates and aims to train people who work in this field.

Mps Worried About Loans

Thirty MPs raised a memorandum to Speaker of the Parliament, Sheikh Abdullah Ben Hussain Al-Ahmar expressing their worries about expenditure channels of USD 610,690,000 constituting 23 loans received

by Yemen from June 1997 to June 2000. They called for addressing shortcomings in implementing programs that loans had been offered for. The memorandum noticed that parts of those loans were spent in violation to loans programs.

British Council to Manage a US\$ 500,000 Project

The Royal Netherlands Ambassador, Mr. Arend Meerburg, and the Minister of Planning & Development, Mr. Ahmad Sufan signed a two-year agreement on 31 August, to provide human resources training support to the Yemeni Government.

The British Council Director, Mr. Adrian Chadwick, signed a separate agreement with the Ministry of Planning & Development under which the British Council will manage all aspects of the project.

The \$500,000 worth project is funded entirely by the Royal Netherlands Embassy, and aims over the course of two years to provide training and work attachments to between 46 and 56 Yemeni civil servants in the areas of economic, financial and administrative reforms. The straining and work attachments will take place in Yemen and Jordan.

UNDP Visits Parties

A delegation from the United Nations Development Program (UNDP) conducted last Tuesday a number of visits to political parties offices in Yemen. While parties envisage confidentiality in results of the meeting with the delegation, Sons of the Yemeni League told YT that discussions focused on the League vision towards democracy and preparations for the forthcoming elections. The UNDP delegation expressed readiness to help in the preparation for the forthcoming elections in case any constitutional amendments are made.

Two workshops on Water

Organized by the National Authority for Water Resources, two workshops on water were kicked off last Saturday in Taiz. The workshops will last for four days, two days in Taiz and two in Ibb. The workshops were attended by governors of both governorates. The first workshop focused on the countryside sector while the second on the town sector. They aim at considering the executive plan to handle water resources from Wadi

The plan will play a guiding and organizing role to make the best use of available water resources, considered to be the main factor in developing the region.

Female Consultative Meeting On Rational Use of Water

Under the slogan of : "Women's Participation in Rational Use of Water", the General Board of Water Resources (GBWR) organized a consultative meeting to discuss the possibility of finding out joint cooperation within different women circles. The objective was to polarize women and perform their effective roles in different fields aimed at saving water at different places of work and production. Another objective was to create a tangible organization for participation through water-work-team in residential areas to correspond with organizational formations in women complexes in cities and

Kursk: Foreign-Aided Rescue Efforts Continue

OSCOW British and Norwegian rescuers joined their Russian counterparts late Saturday in efforts to rescue the Kursk nuclear submarine that has been stranded at the

bottom of the Barents Sea for a week.

Reports from the northern port city of Murmansk, where the rescue efforts were head quartered, said Norwegian divers with video equipment have started to descend to Kursk Sunday morning in a final bid to find possible survivors aboard. However, Russian officials said Saturday that all 118 submariners were probably dead.

The Norwegian and British teams were brought to the disaster site by two Norwegian ships which moved into position above the mangled Kursk before dawn. The divers, working at a depth of about 100 meters, would assess the damage suffered by the submarine when it sank August 12, a task that would take "several hours," a spokesman for the British Defense Ministry said.

According to Russian reports, the divers would try to manually unscrew a lid leading to the sub's escape chamber. Pressure-measuring devices located inside the hatch would give the rescue team an idea about conditions inside the Kursk. Pressure within the vessel must be low enough to provide for survival. The divers would also assess chances for the British mini-submarine to latch on to the damaged escape hatch.


The Russian Navy announced Saturday that most of the crew apparently died when a massive explosion shattered the Kursk on August 12, slamming it to the bottom of the sea. The authorities said most of the Kursk's crew apparently died in the first minutes of the disaster, and that any survivors likely drowned as the ship filled with water. "Most possibly, we will have to admit that our worst expectations have materialized," Vice Admiral Mikhail Motsak, chief of the Northern Fleet, told a special program on RTR television in the starkest statement so

Russian rescuers continued struggling to reach the submarine, but were hampered by powerful currents and near-zero visibility on the seabed. The escape hatch they were trying to reach at the rear of the submarine is badly damaged, and repeated efforts to dock have

There is still no final word on what caused the accident, but Motsak, the chief of the Northern Fleet, said there were three possible versions. The first is a powerful dynamic blow that may have occurred on collision with another object. Motsak said three foreign submarines were spotted in the accident zone, which is an area under constant observation by foreign intelligence services. He said the Kursk's collision detonated three or four torpedoes, resulting in a blast equivalent to 1-2 ton

The second is an explosion inside the submarine with subsequent flooding of the sub's first and second compartments. And the third possible cause is that the Kursk hit a World War II mine, the admiral said. The final suggestion should not be completely discarded since six such mines have been discovered in that part of the Barents Sea over the last few years, he added. Russian Deputy Prime Minister Ilya Klebanov, who heads a government commission probing the causes of the accident, said the crewmembers in the first, second and pos-

when the Kursk struck the seabed Saturday. However, Klebanov said that there is still a chance that some sailors may still be alive in the eighth and ninth sections, but

that this chance is more of a theoretical nature, Interfax reported.

As the nation and the world pray for the sailors aboard the Kursk, the relatives of the submariners are having an especially hard time. The government has allocated funds to help those that have arrived at Murmansk and other places near the accident site.

In one moving episode, the director of a train bound for Murmansk turned off the speakers of a carriage that housed the relatives of the Kursk crew - to stop them from hearing radio broadcast of comments from military officials that the submariners' chance of survival was almost zero. Across the country, donations are being collected for the relatives and religious ceremonies held to pray for the crew's safe return. (Xinhua)



Last Three Malaysian Hostages Freed by Abu Sayyaf

MANILA_ The last three Malaysian Hostages were freed Sunday morning after being kept for four months in the jungle lair of the Abu Sayyaf in the southern Philippine island of Jolo.

The three Malaysians arrived in the southern city of Zamboanga, some 150 kilometers northeast of Jolo, together with a special envoy of Lee Peng Wee, a government negotiator working for the release of the Malaysian hostages, the ABS-CBN TV station reported. They were turned over to chief government negotiator Robert Aventajado and Malaysian ambassador to the Philippines M.H. Ershad at an air base in the city. So far, the Abu Sayyaf has released all the nine Malaysians of the 21 mostly foreign hostages it kidnapped from Malaysia's diving resort of Sipadan on April 23. The nine are workers at the resort. Speaking at a press conference held at the air base, the Malaysian ambassador extended thanks to the Philippine government for its efforts in managing the hostage crisis.

He also conveyed to negotiators heartfelt gratitude from the family members of the nine Malaysians. It is very difficult to deal with the kidnappers, but the Philippine negotiating team got substantive results, Ershad said. Earlier reports said the three Malaysians were released Friday.

Negotiators said heavy rains and atrocious weather conditions had hampered their release, preventing their transport from Jolo to Zamboanga

Ershad also expressed the hope that more hostages of the Sipadan group will be released soon. The Abu Sayyaf rebels are still holding 10 hostages of the Sipadan group - two Germans, two French nationals, two Finns, two South Africans, one Lebanese and one Filipino.

Besides, they have in their hands three French TV journalists and 12 Filipino Christian evangelists who went to Jolo last month to cover the hostage crisis and pray for the hostages. Up to now, the Abu Sayyaf has released in batches nine Malaysians, one ailing German woman and one Filipino of the Sipadan group, and one German journalist and two local TV reports.

The rebels Saturday reneged on an agreement with government negotiators to release all its hostages in one batch, alleging the military is preparing an offensive against them.

Palestinians Oppose Jerusalem Internationalization

GAZA_ The Palestinian side totally opposes the idea of internationalizing the holy sites in Jerusalem, said Secretary General of the Palestine Liberation Organization (PLO) Abu Mazen. At a press conference held in the West Bank city of Ramallah, Abu Mazen, also known as Mahmoud Abbas, denied reports that Egypt had put forward new initiatives regarding the future of Jerusalem during his recent visit to Cairo. He said that the visit came in the wake of a short visit by Palestinian leader Yasser Arafat to Egypt to discuss the latest developments in the region. He bitingly blasted Jerusalem Mayor Ehud Olmert for granting Palestinians in Jerusalem Israeli citizenship, terming the move as a scheme to annex the holy city, sacred to Muslims, Jews and

The PLO official also stressed that the Palestinian side was willing to resume negotiations with Israel provided that good preparations be made.

The Israeli-Palestinian Camp David summit on July 11-25 failed to reach an agreement due to wide gaps between the two sides over the fate of Jerusalem and the return of Palestinian refugees. The Palestinian leadership is keen to reach a peace deal with the Israelis before the September 13 deadline, which might restore the Palestinian national rights, Abu Mazen said.

He added that "We are seeking to bring about a just and permanent peace which guarantees the rights of Palestinians, especially regarding Jerusalem, Israeli withdrawal to the June 4, 1967 borders, cessation of Israeli settlements and release of(Palestinian) prisoners and detainees." On holding a new three-way summit, Abu Mazen said such a summit was proposed by U.S. President Bill Clinton at the end of the Camp David summit. The Palestinian party did not object to such a summit, but good preparations should be made, he said. (Xinhua)

EgyptAir Chief "99% Sure" Flight 990 Downed by Technical Problems

U.S. investigators hinted the relief co-pilot, Gameel el-Batouti, "brought down the plane in a suicidal act." The Egyptian side has strongly opposed the speculations, stressing technical failure might cause the tragedy.

Egyptian and U.S. investigators "were seeking to know exactly what happened to the EgyptAir plane," Rayan said. The U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) "has given credence to the Egyptian theory" that a prevalent malfunction in the elevator control system could result in a fatal accident, referring to FAA's decision to intensify inspection of Boeing 767s' elevator system. Qadhi Ashami, 75, was born in Sadda, Ibb Governorate and he is one of the famous Judges and scholars. During his long career he occupied the post of Vice Minister of Justice in the first government after the revolution in 1962 and became the governor of Ibb in the '70's, while in the '80's he had chaired the Court of Appeal in Taiz.

At the beginning of 1990 he became secretary general of Al-Haq party. In 1997 he assumed the post of minister of Endowments but resigned.

Judge Ashami took part in a large number of Islamic symposia and conferences inside Yemen and abroad, the last of which was last year in Muscat on Islamic sects.

In the pursuit of sounding out prominent Yemeni figures about these developments, Yemen Time interviewed the Qadhi Sheikh Mohammed Ahmed Ashami.

Q. Do you think the Yemeni political leadership is really serious in realizing all reformative aspirations through activating all operative laws, auditing judiciary reforms, removing corrupt and the corrupted, issuing a law on declaration of assets with retroactive effect, protecting the citizen who refuses to succumb to extortion and bribery and increasing employees salaries proportionate to their necessities?

A. No doubt citizens used to take into consideration justifications of the authority on negligence in realizing their legitimate aspirations and confronting the aggravated corruption. Surely, such justifications have now become invalid after signing of the border treaty between Yemen and Saudi Arabia. The political leadership is now facing the test of carrying out its responsibilities towards the citizen and realizing his ambitions by activating the laws, reforming the judiciary, fighting the corrupt officials, ending all discrepancies and unifying the educational system.

After all the political leadership has two options: either to realize all these ambitions in order to gain the citizens satisfaction or continue with existing procrastination and negligence; but the latter will result in the citizens' loss of confidence in his political leadership. This is what the coming days would reveal.

Q. Recently heated media wrangles took place between several top figures and at mosques over 'infidelity' campaigns sponsored by religious and political symbols against a number of writers and authors. What is your opinion on these events? What are their dimensions?

A. Those media controversies and disputes reminded me of the "Traffic Week". It was a mere imitation. It never leads to genuine solutions. Even if the media disputes are settled, that will not end the phenomenon of blaspheming, terrorism and violence. We have to stand firmly in the face of their motives, reasons, reality of its practicing them and the dangerous dimensions which may be concealing a sedition.

The media wrangles had not reflected seriousness in dealing with the issue. They have reflected domination of compromise and leniency means in dealing with sanctities by both parties conditions is the cheating, disaccording to prevalent climates. At respect of teachers, careless-

> Q. Recently an "Iftaa(legal opinion) Committee has been formed composed of a number of respectable Religious Leaders. In your opinion what is the criterion according to which these men have been selected? Has selection of the religious committee any political or sectarian dimension that may involve your "Al-Haq" Party in the dispute between the GPC and the YRC?

> A. Undoubtedly, a lot of factors are taken into consideration as criteria in selecting Ullamas viz. education, qualification, efficiency, rank as well as politics. As far as my Respected

colleague, Mohammed Mansoor is concerned, he is a well-known weighty religious figure. His personal qualities, aptitude, ability, history, education and his very presence qualify him to be selected. This never means "Al-Haq" Party should be part in the ongoing dispute between the two allies. His esteemed status was the basic reason behind his selection, I believe.

Q. What is the real stand of "Al-Haq" Party on the Jeddah Treaty?

A. The clear stance of "Al-Haq" Party towards the Treaty was mentioned in its statement and also in the statement issued by the Coordination Council. "Al-Ummah" organ of our Party, had also published it. We welcomed the treaty and affirmed that now the authority should carry out its duties in realizing citizens' ambitions and confront corruption after the disappearance of justifications of negligence.

Q. Where does "Al-Haq" Party stand versus the oppo-Coordination Council? Does your party agree with their opinions and visions?

A. "Al-Haq" Party, like other parties, is a member of the Coordination Council. Everything is within the regulations and objectives which organize the Council. Anything issued by the Council represents all parties. I do not think this affects the particularity of any Council member.

Q. What is your opinion on the present educational status. What about unifying the educational system and application of the Law on **Education?**

A. "Al-Haq" Party was in the forefront for urging unification of education system; it called for the application of the seven-year-old Law on Education. I say that first the authorities on top and the Yemeni Reform Congregation (Islah) are mainly responsible for deterioration of education and for not implementing the Law of Education. What confirms gravity of affairs and deterioration in educational



A. The economic situation is improving only in what we hear in the official news. The citizen does not tangibly feel it. The situation is getting from bad to worse. Potions are successive and hope is fading away. Corruption is dominating over everything. With existence of corruption, reforms would not produce any helpful results.

Dr. Bafadel to Yemen Times:

"Where do the funds for subsidies go?"

emen is suffering a lot from different economic problems including unemployment, lack of investment, inflation, smuggling and many others.

Dr. Abdul Rahman Bafadel is a very outstanding economist. He has got a PH.D. in Industrial Engineering from France. He was the MInister of Trade and Supply(1993-94) and Minister of Fisheries (1995-1996). He is now member of the parliament and a prominent figure in the Islah Party. Mohammed Bin Sallam of Yemen Times met Dr. Bafadel to highlight various economic issues and filed the following interview.

Q: The government issued new bank notes of YR 500 and YR 1000. Some economic sources say the government is planning to issue new bank notes of YR 5000 and YR 10,000. How will it affect the national economy in general?

A: Printing currency with very high values such as 500, 1000 and more will have its influence negatively on our economy.

First, it facilitates black market traffic of our currency towards neighboring countries. Secondly, it eliminates low value currency such as one riyal, five riyals which have already disappeared. It might lead to the elimination of ten riyals as well as twenty. Thirdly, it increases inflation. Fourthly, it leads to price increase and limited salary people will suffer more by having two or three bank notes to spend for the whole month

Q: Smuggling is dangerous to the national economy. What are the reverse affects, hazards and economic damages of this phenomenon?

A: Smuggling is one of the most economy disasters. It is enough for this government to resign. In a debate held by government they announced that 70% of goods in the market come through smuggling; not only that, but a list of names of smugglers was presented to the government. However, nothing was done.

The Minister of Finance himself declared on Wednesday 17.11. 1999 in a debate held in the Finance committee of the parliament that smugglers are protected by high post leaders in the government.

The minister and the government 'REQUESTED' those high post authorities to give up protection of smugglers. (I wonder why this government should stay in power, smug-

gling is her policy that damages our economy severely?

Q: What is the economic value of treasury bonds and how do you assess them? Are you of the view that these measures can solve the economic crisis in the country?

A: Such policy is fictitious. It will lead sooner or later to economy collapse. Firstly, it liquidated investment, increased idleness and jobless labors. Such high rate guaranteed profit margin lead private sector to abandon business, industry, agriculture, real estates as all are risky without guarantee to have such profit margin. Moreover the Central Bank gives profit against no work. People sleep without no effort to do and they get guaranteed profit. That is why Islam forbids interest as Islam encourages those who work but not who sleep. Those who take risk are not those who want guaranteed profit.

The biggest question that we pose here for the Central Bank as well as World Bank authorities, who has been the advisor of the Central Bank is "Where does such billions of local currency are invested so as to get such fixed high rate of profit? Does such high amount of private sector billions is invested? At least to create jobs? Moreover, the creation of the bourse will lead to severe economic situation for the simple reason that such activities are not real in a sense that money is not exploited in industry or agriculture or anything that will flourish the economy and provide job opportunities for all categories of man power.

Q: In your point of view, what are the main flaws that have affected the Yemeni economy and led to the visible deterioration and how do you think we can solve them?

A: Government's shortcoming as well as killing mistakes for Yemen's economy as per budget alternative presented to the parliament by the opposition parties: Ba'ath, Nasserist, independent and Reform party (Islah) during budget discussions are:

1) Budget deficit was put as 34 billion meanwhile after verification we found the following:

a) Oil barrel price was US \$ 17 only, but today it is \$ 29. We requested them at that time to modify it to US \$ 21 as an average, but they refused. They claimed that oil price will shoot down. b) We requested them calculate dollar



price YR 160, they refused. The government insisted to consider it YR 155 only for the dollar. It claimed that dollar price will shoot down.

c) Quantity share for government is around 92 million barrel but not 85 mb as government claimed. So oil income is more by 78 to 80 billion YR to what government stated.

2) Government budget for 2000 showed interest to be paid is YR 28b which means selling treasury shares at YR 165b with interest rate 17%.

YR 165b with interest rate 17%.
3) Economic Units based in sectors are all negative as shown by the govern-

ment budget: profit from agriculture & fisheries sec-

- 35.2%. (negative)

Profit from industrial sector: - 4.7% (negative)
Profit from construction sector: -

34.6%. (negative)
Profit from commercial sector:

92.4%. (negative)
All this indicates corruption policy carried by the government. It recognizes not only corruption but also

encouraging it.

What solutions and remedies they have taken? Simply nothing.

4) In brief: YR 80b from oil + YR 11b of wheat subsidy in 2000 (nothing in principle for 2000) + YR 28 accredited for fictitious jobs and multi-job posts non engaged, all this will lead to YR 84b profit rather than YR 34b as deficit

Q: How do you assess privatization?

Do you think it serves the national economy in this critical stage?

A: We believe that it will lead to more problems and severe standard of living as well as increase in unemployment.

In fact, the government has no transparency at all. They want to do it alone away from the parliament. Maroc created a Ministry for Privatization. Our government created an office!! The mechanism to execute privatization is not clear. Our main problem in public sector is "MANAGEMENT". Unfortunately, the government wants to sell all in all fields in all governorates. Some say they have already nominated those who will buy cement factory in

Amran, Bagil and Barh in Amran, Hodeidah and Taiz governorates respectively. This is an example of the government's corruption. Such non-defined methods and mechanisms will lead to more poverty, more jobless people etc....,

If foreigners are allowed to go into privatization, situation will be worse. We might loose country sovereignty and even foreign economic lobbies to manipulate the society politically. Worst is the engagement of Jewish tourists in privatization. Another Palestine situation will take place for Yemeni people. Government office for privatization has full freedom to evaluate assets, to make tenders, to choose clients, to define conditions, etc. It is expected that assets will be sold with tenth of their prices which will mean big loss for the country. Really, we are pessimist towards the process of privatization due to mechanisms and environment, besides corruption factor that leaves nothing for the country.

Q: Could you please brief us on the reasons that make foreigners avoid investment in the country and what are the obstacles facing investment?

A: Investment in Yemen lacks every thing. The government has done nothing towards the creation of good environment for investment. Security reinforcement comes first, efficient judiciary, commercial tribunals are a must, laws for investment need to be developed, governmental investment needs

to be eliminated. The only large scale investment is in oil fields which goes to previous governments and not the current one. Aden Free Zone project is going very slowly. We started this project in 1993-1994; yet time goes quickly, work goes so slow!!

The presidency did too much to create stability for the government to work. The agreement with Saudi Arabia should lead to smooth business relation as well as free movement of Yemeni as well as Saudi Capital towards Yemen. The government unfortunately is paralyzed by corruption and lack of administrative as well as technical cadre to grasp this fruitful occasion.

Its policy is based on loans and taxes. Loans that go to unknown resources with only 20% to 30% for the defined projects. The taxes, on the other hand, proposed by the World Bank nobody knows where it goes. Individual income decreases with time, and development is negative. As published by the government that one third of the nation gets two thirds of national income meanwhile two thirds

of the nation share only one third. Tax system with corruption policy lead to severe living standard mainly government staff with exception of high posts and poverty covers large sectors in the country. Individual income does not match with the increase in prices such as electricity, water and telephone more over elimination of subsidies, all lead to a big question mark for the government: Where does money fund for subsidies go? 

Investment just Needs Law Enactment

nvestment plays a very important role in the development and economy of any country, particularly in this era of globalization where the geographical barriers between countries are to be abolished. It also provides a lot of job opportunities and brings out hard currency.

What is more interesting is that Yemen is among the countries that have lots of laws. But the problem is that our laws lack enactment. The most important for us is not passing laws; it is rather their enactment.

The Investment Law No. 22, for instance, was issued in 1991 and was amended twice in 1995 and 1997. This law, like many other laws, is not enacted. It gives some privileges and facilities to investors. However, investors do not enjoy their rights as nominated in the law. There are two main problems faced by investors

The first is that the judiciary which should be instrumental in making investors have their due rights is completely absent and unfair. This is one aspect of the plights of investors. Yemen should have fair and independent judicial system to protect the rights of investors. Otherwise, no investors would drop in the country. Not only that, local businessmen will leave the country.

The other headache of investment is the dirty game played by some influential crooks at the power center against investors flowing in into the country. These crooks tell them that they would like to be their shareholders. This is fine right now. But they do not want to pay their share of the money. Their share in the business would be to protect their intersts in the project in question. Protect against whom? It is nonsense, isn't it? This naturally makes Arab and foreign investors fly back home looking for a better and safer place to invest their money. In this way we have lost many investment projects which could have brought a new life into our fragile economic infrastructure.

A friend of mine who is a foreigner told me that he had started a project and it was going fine. But because he refused to be blackmailed by some people, he was denied to have access into the project and now it is demolished.

It is corruption that is working as a stumbling block on the way of any efforts to reform the system and refresh our economy. With existence of corruption, our efforts for development and prosperity would wither away.

COMMON SENS

By: Hassan Al-Haifi How Credible is Our Educational System?

It is not the intent of this observer to use this column to highlight personal issues faced by the latter, or to take advantage of this commentary to further personal aspirations or ambitions. However, in most developing societies, and even in the most developed ones, one is bound to encounter certain situations that reflect general shortcomings in a system or system which the general public as a whole must deal with and find that in such systems are matters of equity and detriment to the welfare and well being of the general public at large, which are worthy of sharing with that public.

For developing societies, the educational sector represents one of the most significant service sectors, and the way it operates and the results it achieves are often considered the key indicators that will show the progress made in the efforts towards human development and general progress of the society. Thus the sector is, by its nature, has a pivotal role in setting the course for the development of a society, in terms of the output it produces, quantitatively and qualitatively, and in terms of the example it sets for other service functions to follow by its operational standards and procedures. More important, the educational sector also sets the kind of values that we hope will be engrained in the society to produce a healthy society in terms of moral persuasions and ethical standards of conduct.

Finally, the educational sector literally touches every citizen in one way or another, especially in a populous country with about half the population who are of schooling age. Because of the poor awareness on general educational norms that is widespread, one would expect that the educational sector should be applying above standard criteria in all of its operational and procedural systems, thus ensuring that the public is getting the best results from its children, for whom the sector is regarded as a guardian and mentor that makes up for any shortcomings of the parents, in view of this widespread lack of awareness.

The educational system in Yemen suffers from many flaws. In all fairness to the country's educators, one cannot blame all these flaws on them, as the general state of the country is not fully supportive of an up to standards educational service and the scanty resources that are appropriated for this vital sector in the country's development efforts are not reflective of the proper attention the sector should be given by development planners and those responsible for the allocation of the available resources of the country accordingly. On top of that, Yemen's educational sector used to enjoy significant foreign and regional support to bolster the sector's growth and general operational needs and the generous amounts of funds and technical support that were once provided a decade ago have since been cancelled due to poor policy decisions of a government without any foresight or long term outlooks on the consequences of its hasty decisions based on emotional or narrow minded implications, that truly fail to take the interest of the country to heart.

Thus with all these circumstances, the observer should pro-

ceed with caution in criticizing the state of the educational system in the country, and would be unfair in purely blaming the overseers of the sector for the significant shortfalls of the system.

One of the biggest shortcomings in the general development approach followed by the government, even in times of plenty and availability of resources, has been a notorious disregard for the human resource development of the country. This is especially true of the educational sector, where our high dependence on foreign teachers at the start of the drive towards development, did not trigger a concerted effort to ensure that resources are

channeled to ensure that this heavy dependence on foreign personnel, both at the teaching and administrative levels is gradually overcome, with the graduates of the system itself. Yet, we find that the efforts in this respect were minimal, as though our development planners felt that the country would be able to support an indefinite dependence on foreign personnel, thanks to an indefinite availability of funding! In fact, careers in the educational sector were not encouraged due to the lack of incentives and lack of proper career guidance that the system was unable to provide for one reason or another. Furthermore, vested interests had been allowed to set in within the sector that in fact worked against the replacement of foreign personnel hiring by local staff since the gains that were made by these vested interests were going to end, and a strong element of the corruption in the system was to be eliminated over time if the local personnel were allowed to take over the role of foreign staff, with the proper training and incentives. But the sudden

stop of the flow of foreign support lead to a drastic reduction of the gains that such vested interests enjoyed and other means of lucrative finagling were needed to replace the appetite of hungry officials who saw no reason that their interests cannot be served by other means accordingly. We shall not go into the detail of the corruption to which the educational system is subjected to, for surely the Central Organization for Control and Auditing has volumes of investigations into this and anyone is able to look further into this, if they so desire.

Nevertheless, getting down to the nitty gritty, we come to the matter of the tests that the Ministry of Education prepares and administers to the students, especially for the secondary school general diploma. Here there is a great example of the inhuman nature that the educational system is characterized by and of the monstrous attitude of the overseers of these exams. For one thing, students are expected to be tested for all the three years of secondary education at the end of a journey as horrible as crossing the Amazon Jungle barehanded. Most modern educational systems usually go on a year to year basis, but three years that is really stretching the intellect too far, for students who have the poorest resources and conveniences of high school students anywhere. On the other hand, students are expected to hand in their completed exams and become subject to the results determined by Ministry appointed correctors, without having any criteria set up to ensure that this work will be done fairly and adequately guided by the highest ethical and professional standards accordingly. Of course, because of the total lack of transparency in the system in general and in the educational sector, in particular, these criteria are either absent or ambiguous and are not free of any questionable conduct, as one judges from the stories related by the students, which are really scary. Even if one should not believe all that is heard, but what is heard is enough to indicate that surely there can be a greater degree of honesty and regard to the laws of equity and fair competition among the students. What happens is that students who generally show significant academic acumen throughout their schooling, all of a sudden loose their status, either because they have fallen apart when taking the exam after so much cramming or because something went wrong during the correction of their exams.

Thus, this observer was taken aback h when finding that my son, who had been a generally high achiever (generally above 90% all along), was hit with a meager 79% total. Why? Because, in one of the subjects, he had been given only 58%. Yet, the boy insisted that the subject was one he had been sure that his result could not go below 85%. There is no reason not to believe that this could have been probably an honest mistake or a typing

error, but there is no recourse for the students to appeal such results, because Ministry officials have declared themselves to be omnipotent and trustees that cannot be appealed, or objected to. But the truth of the matter is that there are students who hardly attend classes and yet come out with results that are in the 90s or are passing, when they have never passed the normal exams given throughout

their schooling. Before we start hitting our kids for their lack of aptitude, we as parents would like to be assured that we would not be unjust to our kids, because some educators were negligent in carrying out their duties, or were guided by prejudice and mischief rather than fairness and the highest of ethical standards that are expected to be applied in this most important sector. Speaking on behalf of a number of other parents who have echoed some concerns as well as to the authenticity of the results announced, I would urge the Minister of Education to reinstate the right of appeal for the high school examination results, which is a constitutional right in all free and democratic societies. Our further support to education can only come if we are assured that the overseers of the sectors are seriously intent on applying the highest standards of fairness and conduct, when processing the end of a long journey across the Amazon jungle.


In order to enforce laws, strenuous work has

Rectifying the judiciary system is another more complicated issue. However, it is not impossible to solve. There are some tangibly positive aspects that can be seen in the Supreme Court since the appointment of Judge Zeid Al-Jumrah who set out making strong and strict measures to ensure enforcement of laws. He defined the court's members rights and obliged them to finish deciding the accumulated cases which were about 7000 cases. I also came to know that he had sent some judges for questioning and dismissed others. Therefore, if the judge is given the power to implement law and order and is protected against interference by the influential tem of the country would have healthy recovery. However, it is impossible that there will be a complete recovery in the system.

It is first to identify the corrupt and then try them, punish them and recover what they have illegally taken away. That is, the authority should apply the policy of "Where did you get it from?". This will be of great benefit for it would protect the corrupt themselves and rid the citizens of their evils and extortion.

So as to protect employees who stand against the bribery, we need to reconsider employment so as to choose the most proper person for the proper job. Employment should also be based on competency and not on any thing else. However, with this over-manned employment cadre and deeply rooted corruption that is spreading over all the dimensions of the society, one could easily discern the



reasons that led employees to this stage of ignorance and disregard of laws.





Direct Marketing in Tourism

word "Tourism" is used very widely and I am thankful to Mr. Najeeb Yousef Mahyoub Sultan, State Authority for Tourism State Administration for Ecotourism who wrote a very good article under the heading "Ideas for Development of Tourism in Yemen" published in Yemen Times on Monday 10th July 2000 issue No 28 who gave the definitions of tourism and tourist very accurately. Now I think a lot of people must have cleared their concepts of tourism and tourist. Kindly allow me to quote Mr. Zafarullah Siddiqui, what he wrote in "Dawn" Karachi about Direct Marketing in

"Tourism is no doubt a complex industry, because of its multi-facetedness. Its complexity lies in the fact that tourism promotion has to be directed at large number of people having different needs, wants, attitudes, tastes, expectations, and behavior patterns. The role of tourism marketing therefore, is to investigate the market very carefully, identify potential segments and then develop a marketing plan-strategy to get desired results while meeting consumer demands and expectations. The most important aspect in tourism marketing is to penetrates into the target market through direct contact and create an 'image' that could influence client preferences and predispose them in favor of the product/service offered. The direct marketing approach is therefore important in the sense that tourist is likely to be motivated to buy his holiday, airline ticket or accommodation



in a hotel for a destination where most probably, he hasn't been before or wishes to go again. Hence it is psychological aspect for the potential tourist which he cannot evaluate, sample or taste before purchase, which needs to be addressed through one-to-one approach.

Before we discuss the scope of direct marketing in tourism, let us see how marketing in tourism is defined.


"Marketing in tourism is defined as the systematic and coordinated execution of business policy by tourist undertaking whether private or state owned at local, regional, national or international level to achieve the optimal satisfaction of the needs of identifiable groups and in doing so to achieve an appropriate return"

Having defined tourism marketing let



us see the dimensions and dynamics of tourist product. Tourist product is a composite product, a combination of natural or man-made attraction, transport, accommodation and entertainment. Each of these components may be marketed for sales directly by its individual supplier or on a package through an intermediary called tour operator.

In terms of quality tourist products is assessed on its site or event attraction, its facilities, accessibility and on the efficiency and standard of service. As a matter of fact the range of tourist product elements encompasses total experience like beauty of a scenery, antiquity of a civilization, gentleness of a beach, etc.. and other factors for example safety, security, socio-cultural reactions, availability of infra-structure, utilities,



entertainment, shopping and more importantly the behavior of fellow users and 'snob' appeal of the product. In other words, the good or bad assessment of tourist product depends on consumer's perception of experience and involvement.

There is however, a word of caution before launching aggressive direct marketing campaigns. The marketer must know the distinguishing features of the tourist product that; firstly, it cannot be moved from the place of consumption. Instead of bringing the product to the customer the consumer must be brought to the product.

Secondly, in terms of supply, the tourist product cannot be stocked in the sense that an empty airline seat is a product lost forever and thirdly product offering must meet the requirements of the local law and environment regula-

Marketing specialists in tourism have a wide range of promotional tools e.g. advertising, direct mail, films, press articles, editorials, window displays, posters, brochures, travel trade contacts, seminars, exhibitions, conferences, familiarizations, tours of journalists/travel trade, attractive trade commission, lunch on vouchers, bonuses, prizes and many many more tools. Although the relative value of these promotional tools varies according to each potential market and nature of the product, all tourism marketing experts however agree that these promotional tools as marketing activities aimed at attracting travelers will fail to motivate the potential market, if three perceived risks viz. Psychological, Physical and Financial are not addressed in a personalized manner. It is here the concept of direct marketing in tourism takes its roots. It is now a common practice for most

airlines, hotels, tour, operators and even souvenir traders to maintain mailing lists of first time, repeat and of prospective consumers of their product offering. The computer has made this job easier to track down the airline passenger hotel guest or vacationer and keep record of their socio-economic indicators and consumption behavior which are used as a resource for direct marketing purpose.

The readers may recall the powerful impact of frequent flyer programs of airlines, where passengers are encouraged to travel the same airlines and earn "free mileage points." Through this program the airlines keep a personal record of its customers and awards them with Silver, Gold or Platinum membership cards using the knowledge of individual customer needs, air-

lines develop facilities of special lounges on the ground to pamper them. Customers on board get addressed by name and served with special preordered meals. The passenger even get served with birthday cake and cheers if his date of birth coincides with the travel date.

Likewise most hotels now maintain a profile of their Commercially Important Patrons (persons) (CIP) and address their guests by name while they check-in or check-out from the hotel. This way the clients feel honored and get "ego" satisfaction.

In order to tailor-make holiday programs most tour operators regularly organize destination shopping sessions for potential clients where they are shown videos of hotels/rooms and facilities, on board airlines services and attractions of the holiday destination thereby substantially reduce their perceived risks.

Tour operators maintain videos and brochure libraries and potential clients are encouraged to borrow cassettes, browse brochures and help themselves with complementary catalogs for choosing the product. Large tour operators have experienced tourist guides who through individual sessions guide vacationers on their choice of destination.

To sum up, the increasing competition, and the emerging highly demanding customers have made direct marketing not just an option but a marketing need. Direct marketing besides ensuring a tailor-made and satisfying product for the customer also helps suppliers to minimize marketing and promotional budget wastage. "A penny saved being penny earned" which helps marketers to stay competitive in price, quality and service sensitive tourism industry.

Direct marketing in tourism is thus the only viable answer for having satisfied customers: a prerequisite for successful sustainable and growing business.

Proposed Study on Prevalence of Mother-Baby Transmission in Selected Infectious Diseases in Yemen

he maternal mortality and morbidity in Yemen is high. The maternal mortality ratio estimated for the year 1990 is about 1,400 per 100,000 live births (UNICEF & WHO 1994). The 1997 YDMCH survey reported that maternal deaths represent 42% of all deaths to women at reproductive age for the ten-year period before the survey. The study on maternal mortality factors revealed that the obstetric indirect causes of maternal deaths constituted 39% of all maternal deaths and hepatitis was the leading cause (Abdulghani, 1994). The study in a hospital in Sanaa City revealed that the prevalence of HvsAg among pregnant women is 15.3% (Abdul-Rahim et al. 1991). These figures indicate that viral hepatitis is a major health problem in Yemen.

The contribution of prenatal transmission to the overall burden of disease is related to the prevalence of HbsAg and HbeAg among pregnant women. Pregnant woman with both HbsAg and HbeAg are positive, 70%-90% of her infant become infected if not given prophylaxis at birth compared to 5%-20% transmission in case of mother with HbsAg-positive and HbeAg-negative. Data on HIV and syphilis infections is available because it is done during blood donation but almost for men. There is a total lack of information on Clamydia and Toxoplasmosis infection. There is no study done on pregnant women in STDs infection and Rubella as well as the extent of transplacental transmission of these diseases to babies. Therefore, there is a need to explore the extent of the problem of infectious dis-

eases that could be detected serological- A cross-sectional design will be used as ly among pregnant women. The infec- the methodology for this study. It will tious diseases which is preferable to be studied are: Hepatitis B,C, E, Rubella, Toxoplasmosis, Syphilis, and HIV infections. These viral infections and syphilis are transmitted through placenta and have profound adverse effects on newborns outcome. It is worth mentioning that two of the global monitoring indicators on reproductive health are: 1) The positive syphillis serology prevalence in pregnant women. 2) HIV prevalence among pregnant women.

Objectives

The ultimate objective of a proposed study on prevalence of mother-baby transmission in selected infectious diseases is to provide guidance to decision makers on specific policies to review on hepatitis B and rubella vaccinations as well as interventions to reduce maternal and prenatal mor-

bidity and mortality. On the other hand, immediate the prevalence of hepatitis B, C & E, Toxoplasmosis, Rubella, Syphillis, HIV and Clambydia among pregnant women. Another immediate objective is to identify the risk of perinatal transmission of these infectious diseases in different areas of

Yemen and to explore the prevalence of HbeAg among pregnant women.

OPHTHALMIC EDUCATION (9) **Understanding DRY EYES**

What is the tear layer?

Everyone knows that tears run when the eye is inflamed or when we cry; but tears is a daily thing far much important that what we think. The tear layer covers the front part of the eye and when we blink it makes the eye surface smoother and that helps us to see clearly. Without the tear layer it is impossible to see clearly.

The tear layer is formed from three parts: an oily layer, a watery layer and a mucous layer. Different glands form each part of the tear layer.

What are the types of tears?

There are two types: tears produced regularly to lubricate the eye and tears produced in response to inflammation, a foreign body or emotional changes.

What is a dry eye?

enough tears to lubricate the eye and make it moist we call that a dry eye. Some of the symptoms of dry eyes REMEMBER: are: -

- Foreign body sensation 1.
- 2. Irritations 3. Itching
- 4. Mucous discharge
- Feeling uncomfortable in smoking areas
- 6. Occasionally increased tearing can be the earliest symptom of dry eyes.

What are the causes of dry eyes?

- Σ Ageing it is normal for the tear production to decrease with ageing especially at menopause. Remember that it can happen at any age.
- Σ Certain types of joint problems (arthritis) can be associated with dry eyes and dry mouth. Σ Certain drugs can cause dry eyes by decreasing the tear production.

How can dry eyes be diagnosed?

The eye doctor can diagnose dry eyes

can be done to measure the amount of tear production such as using a strip of paper put in the lower lid.

What is the treatment of dry eyes?

- Σ The main treatment of dry eyes is using artificial tears. Artificial tears are sold in every pharmacy and it helps to lubricate the eye. There are different types of artificial tears and your eye doctor will choose the one suitable for you.
- Σ Rarely a small operation to block the tear ducts can be performed in those with advanced stages of dry eyes.
- Avoiding dry atmospheres such us smoking areas, kitchens or near a heater can help in reducing the symptoms of dry

Who can treat dry eyes?

Patients with mild dry eyes need only to use artificial tears but those with When the eye is not able to produce moderate to severe dry eyes need to be treated by an eye doctor.

- Σ The tear layer is very important for clear vision
- Σ Patients with mild to moderate dry eyes can be easily treated by artificial tears
- Σ Avoid dry atmospheres to decrease the symptoms of dry

Routine eye exam by an eye specialist is very important.



Vengeance, Crime Threatening Society

t is that complicated social problem in our country which appeared during olden ages and thrived during colonial rule. Then it continued as if to last for ever. It has been the product of injustice among people in addition to suppression and various kinds of fanati-

Vengeance in our country represents a threat to the society and heralds serious consequences. With the increase of awareness and education, this phenomenon has drastically receded but its spectre is still overshadowing some areas, particularly remote regions where ignorance is still prevailing.

All religions have denounced this crime and set the severest punishments against those committing it. And, like all other religions. Islam too has put restrictions on this crime and Holy Quran through different verses has warned against it.

Illiteracy and spread of weapons are the fuel of this crime. The Muslim people of Yemen look at vengeance as an acute behavior which can kill even an inno-

We have talked to few citizens over means to eradicate revenge in our soci-

ety. Abdulrazzack Mehdi Ali Salem, a student of Islamic studies at the faculty of arts, University of Sana'a, said:- " Besides the blind tribal discrimination, revenge is generally a problem. It is an act where a person decides to be a judge without referring to the official channels such as courts. From olden days to date vengeance has created a state of unrest. If we take the reasons, we see that the perpetrator is debarred from respect to his

own religion. He does not fear the Creator. He has no regard to the consequences of his crime. Bribery, injustice and slow proceedings at courts mostly lead to

killings. Appointment of unqualified judges who lack knowledge of Islamic Sharee'a should cease and proper appointments made particularly in remote areas.

Sufyan Ahmed Ismail, a court clerk is of the opinion that pride plays a role in acts of revenge. The doer feels himself degraded to go through courts. He prefers to take the law into his own hands. Of course this is attributed to ignorance. He does not care for the serious consequences. Perhaps such criminal could have got justice done to him and in his favor; but he loses everything. Most vengeance cases are linked to dispute over land and heirship.

Nasser Muhammed said that delay of legal proceedings makes the family of the murdered feel that justice is out of reach. In some cases instead of killing one person against one person, a whole family is wiped out. The authorities concerned have not been active enough to curb this uncivilized act, we see that the citizens themselves should come together to confront this phenomenon. Muhammed Ali Al-Iryani,

Secretary of "Al-Qadaeeya" newspaper blamed the careless role of the media. Citizens must be told how revenge creates widows and orphans. "Wellorganized radio and TV programs, as well in the press, can help a lot to make people know what is fair and what is not. Drama series and touching short stories could assist; but I think continued and repeated symposia would be better."

Less than two years ago, Mr. Abdulrehman Al-Marooni founded Assallam Arbitration House which carries out mediations between individuals and tribesmen over disputes and feuds. Among its dissemination program, the house works on spreading awareness on murder, assault on sanctity and bloodshed at religious, human and cultural levels. Until this date the house has been able to solve 52 cases of feud

some of which were 30-year-old. Dr. Muhammed Awadh Ba-Obaid, Head of Psychology Section at Sana'a University sees that vengeance is a socio-cultural phenomenon. It has

more than a dimension. including criminal; but the element domi-

nating

this

state is sociocultural-psychological. It all starts from the culture of violence in form of family violence, violence against women and the worse is violence among the youth which in fact generates since childhood. A child is taught to become the hero of his family by avenging. You can hear a boasting father telling people his son is a man! Unfortunately, in the eyes of unqualified judges a hungry man who steals is believed to have committed a crime more serious than killing someone on grounds of vengeance.

Another psychologist at

University, Dr. Abdulla Gassem Abu Ragheef after reviewing historical background of revenge said that Arab families

keep feeding their children since childhood that vengeance is part of one's personality. The avenger's action is symbolized with courage and dignity. The child is taught since his early age that tribadism is the honor of an individual. And a right to killing is not taken but is snatched. The psychologist could not condone educational institutions for their coma. These are too far away from the social problems of our society. "The same is with the media", the doctor said.

House That Curtails Tensions

here there is a will there is a way. Based on this proverb a way has now been opened for settling tribal issues and civilian lawsuits in quite a unique manner in

Hodeidah Province. Here, courts are overcrowded with different-nature cases; some protracted and some complicated; yet citizens always want quick solutions and settlement of their cases.

An experienced, heavyweight Sheikh who cares for the value of life has eventually offered his services to stave off bloodshed. He is aware that illiteracy in itself is a killer. Yemen Times's Mrs. Sabah Al-Qutaili was in Hodeidah. From there she has dispatched her interview which she had with Sheikh Abdulwahab Sinan, Head of the Arbitration

Q. While in Hodeidah, I heard of an Arbitration House (Dar al-Tahkeem). Would you please tell us about it?

A. Yes, we have

nature cases. I never mean to say that all courts have failed to deal with these cases; but in many instances, courts needed time whereas citizens do not like protracted proceedings. They do not like any delay. In some cases courts find themselves overweary with that heap of pending and current files which await action. This situation has in many instances aggravated the problems and sometimes caused disputes develop into fightings and 'civil wars,'. Therefore, in an attempt to minimize such cases, an Arbitration House has been established.

Q. What solutions does the House offer to these increasing number of cases and, so far how many cases has the House solved?

A. Normally we have one sheikh from each tribe at this House. For example, there, where a 'civil war' ensues, the sheikh of that area rushes to the scene. With the help of his men he imposes an immediate 'cease-fire' followed by a truce. Such cases are solved purely on tribal norms. Such kind of reconciliations carry many a meanings.

Q. How do you finance running the House? How do tribes and the state deal with the

A. To this moment there is no source for funding this House; but in itself it represents a symbol of an authority. I do not know when the State shall come to our assistance. Tribesmen find that this House brings peace to them. However, to some extent, donations are accepted with gratitude.

Q. Is the House a substitute for courts?

A. No. Never. Courts have never proved failure; but the piles of files are so big in number that they can not deal with all these in time. The House is no more than a helping-hand to courts. Minor cases related to Islamic Shari'a and those of tribal nature are immediately solved, so the number of cases does not

Q. Do official institutions cooperate with this House? Do they assist in any way?

A. Suffice it to say that the President himself has called for the necessity of cooperation while dealing with blood and feud issues.

Q. Is there any difficulty which your House faces? How do you think such could be solved?

> A. Until this moment we do not have any difficulty other than financial support. The House's expenditures are high.

Q. What are your future expec-

A. Our aim is just to keep affairs going on smoothly through understanding and reconciliations; particularly where blood and feud are involved. Should such issues come under control, security is then reinforced. Our main aim is

to bring intimacy, affinity and harmony because Yemen is like one family.

Q. Is there any consultative body at the House? Have you any relations with foreign and international organizations such as Human Rights Organization?

A. At the House we have wise people, sheikhs and advisors. All are qualified and efficient men. Once the affairs of this very House are organized, we shall have contacts with foreign and international bodies. Until now everything is going well.

Q. What are the nature of crimes in your

A. Mostly, we have murders, rape, seduction and breach of human rights.

Q. Any irritating memory of certain case?

A. Yes. Some cases of murder and fatal injuries; but these come within the tribal norms jurisdictions. Some of such cases are still pending but we are determined to sort

Q. Any statistics?

A. Of course we keep a record of all cases. These are written and endorsed in our registers. Most of these have been published in

Women Press Absence: Reasons And Suggestions

decade has elapsed since the declaration of unity and emergence of democracy, associated with freedom of opinion and expression. Numerous newspapers are being published by political, as well as independent parties all of which have made every effort to woo the reader. More than 70 daily and weekly newspapers are published in Yemen, most of which are controlled by men. A few independent women newspapers have been issued during the last decade, such as Al-Mar'ah (The Woman,) Al-Yamaniah (The Yemeni Woman,) which is published by the National Committee for Women and Adam wa Hawa (Adam & Eve.) However they haven't dealt with women's issues as they should.

Local analysts and observers are of the view that control of the state over women's newspapers constitutes the main block on the way of real women's press, while it is attributed by others to cracks in women's

While many women deny that, some of them think that lack of qualified cadre is all that matters.

Recent statements of Minister of Information show an official trend towards encouraging the establishment of non-governmental women press. So far there have been no signs of credibility and sincerity in these pledges. There is an intended official ignorance towards this issue, a number of women say.

satisfying themselves with allocation of a quarter or half a page for women's matters, opposition parties

have not been more considerate in this regard. There have been no sign of encouragement to women writers. It is really a tragedy. Still more tragic is the fact that available women's papers fail to present women as active participants in the political life and development

Local observers indicate that women's share in democracy is little and that many hurdles make them no more than blind tools exploited by parties. A legal observer wonders why women' unions and committees have not presented a serious women's press or call for it.

For collection of more information on our topic I met a number of women writers in different press channels. To my astonishment, "WE WANT TO LIVE," was the first response I got from one of them before she went off. She was afraid of her position, I thought.

At Saba news agency, the only official news agency in the country, I met Ikram Al-Akouri, editor who said that lack of women-specialized press was attributed to the over all lack of specialized press in general. It is men who control press and it is they who think women's issues are not worthy to be written about she said

Asked about whether available women newspapers have demonstrated serious and successful attempts to bring women's issues to light, she said that they tried their best. However, she added that lack of experience prevent the excellent and objective projection of such issues. "The only paper controlled by the government suffers lack of support and it does not mirror the real condition of Yemeni women. This is the case of the other two newspapers. The problem is that women newspapers, like others, appeared without

concrete studies of women's attitudes, desires, worries that they want the society and the world to read about. Ironically, some people call for women writers to write about women's issues, as if women's issues are confined to women. People should feel that women's issues touch the whole society. Therefore they should not be confined to women with their little experiences. Men should not put them in a challenge, they are required to help," she concluded.

'Al-Ro'iah' (The Vision) is the title of one of the women newspaper that emerged in the 1990s; it closed down after a short time owing to lack of funding. Its chief-editor, Huda Al-Hamdani, said Al-Ro'iah did not focus on only women issues and that the largest part of its staff were men. Existence of a real women press should be associated with real objective and accurate journalism and above all is associated with a sincere official commitment to support it,

she said. Absence of women newspapers is attributed to the attitude of society towards women, she added, All authorities concerned should join efforts in order to get rid of that problem. We pin great hopes on the Minister of Information who always encourage press in general and women writers in particular, she con-

The Ministry of Information is not serious in creating women's press, said Samiah Al-Aghbari of(Al-Wahdawi). Women writers are teased, interrogated and even threatened of death. She said that opposition parties do not publish specialized women newspaper due to lack of facilities. Some opposition newspapers ask donators for support in its

first pages she added. Eftikar Al-Qadhi of Al-Thawrah official newspaper referred to lack of women cadre and financial support.

Whether or nor the available women newspapers and magazines in the market touch women's issues, she said that they focused on secondary things such as make up, fashion and outward appearance. I wish to see real press that is concerned of Arab women's rights before what is new in the world of mode, she commented. There must be specialized and qualified cadre to be able to establish women press, she added.

Kawkab Al-Wadee, editorial secretary of the Al-Yamaniah said lack of women newspapers was because of lack of women jour-

nalists. Journalism is a very difficult and tiring job that needs devotion and continuous search for information, she said. She added: "Our work does not end by leaving our offices. Unfortunately the society still look down upon women working in this field." In addition she said that women's experience in this field was still young. Only three newspapers are there namely, Al-Yamaniah, Adam and Eve, and Al-Mar'ah, all were founded in the 1990s, she explained. Funding is also another stumbling block in the way of establishing more women's newspapers, she said. "Women have faced many economic, social, legal and health challenges. I can not say that the newspapers mentioned already tackle such problems boldly and sincerely. Those newspapers are run by individuals who are more keen on and aware of materialistic gains even at the expense of women affairs and con-

As far as Al-Yamaniah is concerned, though published by the Women National Committee and supervised by the cabinet, none imposes any kind of limitation on its freedom. It has dealt with many vital issues that are of great concern to women such as violence against women, child labor, necessity of women existence in the security corps, women's rights concerning inheritance, etc.," she

Unlike others who have spoken to us, she said that it was lack of good readers which was the real problem of women's press. She suggested holding a seminar on press problems in our country to discuss means of improving and developing journal-

Manal Al-kindi, journalist for Al-Yamaniah newspaper said: "Lack of women's newspapers has many reasons such as the general belief that women are unable to hold high positions and make decisions, lack of facilities and inability of colleges to graduate women cadre, etc." She suggested a thorough study on women's issues and means of solving them and realizing the importance of the existence of women's press.

What next?

Women's press remains a controversial issue in opposition and governmental organs. The official authorities should give the issue of women's leadership full attention. Among tens of newspapers only 6 are managed by women. Unfortunately even these newspapers do not tackle women's issues. The problem is there, and the solution can by through the government and opposition parties adoption of women press that is concerned

Ath-Thawri weekly, organ of Yemen's Socialist Party August 17 2000.

In its editorial the newspaper has expressed its surprise and astonishment over what it has been described as " the official media's unfair campaign against the Yemeni Socialist Party." The editorial says that official media have not explained the reason behind this sharp temperament that has overcome the authority without preliminaries or justifications.

Ath-Thawri editorial has further said that all the socialist party's activities over the past six years have been encountered with similar hostile propaganda. This reflects a hidden intention of some influential circles in the government to undermine the socialist party movement and paralyse its activity to create proper atmospheres to abolish its role.



Al-Ayyam independent weekly of August 16, 2000 has tackled in one of its arti-

cles the question of national reconciliation in Yemen. The article says that it appears that president Ali Abdulla Saleh is now determined to channel his concentration and focus of interest

towards the country's internal issues after he has finished demarcation of the international borders.

Author of the article proceeds from this development to call for holding the national reconciliation as a yardstick showing the seriousness of all of us in building the homeland.

The article affirms that the process of national reconciliation is not a concession on part of the present leadership to those who were defeated in 1994. It is rather construction and ascension to higher levels of the science of unity politics. It is a comprehension of the present in the nick of time.

The process of reconciliation means toleration and construction simultaneously. The two processes could not be separated from each other for this is impossible. Construction may not be achieved without toleration, and the latter represents the main buttress of construction

The national reconciliation would rid us of something still impeding the prosperity of our unitary potentials. We shall continue calling the political leadership for reconsidering its attitude towards the national reconcilia-

Any political observer would easily find out that president Ali Abdulla Saleh is at the head of the procession anticipating a future free from all mistakes of the past and the present. A future founded on inevitability of civilizational change



RAY weekly, organ of Sons of Yemen League Party of August 15, maintains in

its editorial that the president's convictions are being translated into respectable positive steps. The most recent of these steps is the conclusion of the border treaty with Saudi Arabia. This action has confirmed the depth of his understanding of the present era requisites and his capability of dealing RAY'S editorial on the other hand regrets the fact that against the president's stands, there is the present component of the ruling system. It is chained by individuals and power centres still being tied to past and clinging to keeping the tensioned reality in its state. They are steered by an illusion in that any change for the better with whatever mechanism, would undoubtedly be at the expense of their self interests. They would not recognise that personal interests can be realized without being in conflict with the national higher interests and without being a discount from other's interests

RAY's editorial affirms that is destined to play an important role in the regime's future, but this contradiction inside the government structure constitutes a massive tumbling stone on the road of this role.

One of the leading articles of Sahwa weekly of August 17 2000 is devoted to discussing the Palestinian cause. The article stressed that since 1948 war, the Palestinian cause has been experiencing tragic phases. In 1948 a state for the Jews has become a reality after it was merely ideas and wishes haunting the minds of the Zionists. In 1967 the Arabs sustained the worst defeat in their modern history when Israel could occupy the West Bank, East Jerusalem, Golan Heights and the desert Sinai. The Arab main concern since then has been restoration of the territories that Israel occupied in 1967 war, and to concede that the rest of Palestine is a right to the Jews.

The article goes saying that the way the Arabs have followed was neither right nor peaceful. The political solution has not led to a result. Abandonment of resistance option in the course of looking for secure peace has weakened the cause and the Palestinians' power.

The weapon of resistance is a pressuring card that can serve the Palestinian negotiator who is attending conferences while being armless. He no longer has anything or any concessions to offer, save to frankly announce that he has no right to dignified life, nor to the land or to Al-Quds. The reason is that he has already paid all contents of the bill.



Al-Mithag weekly, organ of People's General Congress party of August 14.

An article published in this edition has discussed the question of the elapse of ten years since the 2nd Gulf war. The article expounded on the oppressive policy the west has imposed on the people of Iraq and managed to give legitimacy to the iniquitous blockade. The article calls on the Arab nation and her leaders to "benefit from those ten years' lessons and realize the outrageous results of the western designs." The article also urges the Arab leaders to "discover the conspiracy and sense the danger of weakness and to realize that all the Arabs are exposed to foreign hostility." They have to realize that the game of interests has made Iraq one of the first targets of the west. Other Arab countries could not avoid that same fate unless they unite their ranks and restore their solidarity."

Under a title of "Democracy's Predicament" Shoura weekly, organ of People's Forces Union of July 13 2000, published an article tackling the impasse of democracy in the region and in the country in particular.

Of the problems facing democracy is the nature of rule characterising Arab regimes. For in addition to autocratic rule, Arab republics are controlled by despotic military ruling systems. Thus the nature of Arab ruling systems, whether monarchic or republican, blocks the way before the peaceful transfer of power. To change the rulers there is only the option of coups, violence and power. Against this, Arab opposition parties deal with democracy in an immature double standard. In the name of democracy, these par-

ties oppose authority and endeavour to topple it, but internally they refuse or rather abstain from practicing it with their members.

As in our country, ignorance, poverty and tribal fanaticism are problems added to the above ones which impede development of democracy. This means the dominating force and control of the ruling party over the state resources and media and using all that

to deprive the citizen of his dignity and self-respect. Such regimes think that the good citizen is he who is obedient and applauding the rule.



Al-Wahdawi weekly August 15 2000 published an article on the

continued sanctions imposed on Iraq and its linkage with the U.S. elections.

After the elapse of a decade on the 2nd Gulf crisis the world, the whole world, shouted in one voice" Lift the blockade against the people of Iraq." All voices have sounded in harmony and been unanimous on refusing the humiliating of an entire people. Such voices have this time been issued from inside the countries whose rulers had led the aggression and imposed the uniust blockade; the U.S., Britain, and France. Throughout the whole globe nobody has lagged behind this stance and called for maintaining the aggression and blockade against Iraq but a few "some" rulers, the article says.

Amidst the U.S. presidential and parliamentary elections campaign there are voices condemning the blockade and calling for lifting it. The fear is that this rejection may extend further, whether inside or outside the U.S. Such development would form an extreme embarrassment for the present or coming US administration. U.S. administration finds in the issues of Iraq and Palestine the only themes for appeasing world Zionism. Since the outbreak of the Gulf war up till now,Iraq has become the arena where every U.S. outgoing or coming president shows certain heroic feats to be registered in the bloody colonialist history of the west.

Iraq has implemented the UN resolutions despite their severity and dishon-

esty, signed an unjust border agreement and accordingly has given up half of its sea port Um Qasr, and above all lost more than a million and a half of its people as victims of starvation. illness and air bombardment.

"Yemen Times" on Yemeni-Saudi Arabian Borders:-

Wa'eela Tribe Has 22 Military Positions. Entire Villages Bestowed With Saudi Nationality

Yemeni-Saudi Arabian borders is not that much easy. Difficulties faced in reaching there are not confined to the unevenness of roads but many other obstacles which hinder a safe arrival there. All citizens living there are well armed with light and heavy weapons. Thirty-five-km-range field artilleries fill all positions on hill tops. State presence is absent. It is only the tribesmen who take positions on hill tops. They live at slopes and in valleys in primitive cottages.

Here a lot of cases of murder and road blockade with the purpose of robbery are witnessed. The reason behind these is the old vengeance between the tribes here and there.

It was almost 19:00 hours Wednesday when we arrived in Al-Hauth town. We were on an asphalted road with Sa'da City at distance away when 20 tribesmen from a certain tribe blocked our way. They checked our identity. We felt panicked but then we learnt that they wanted to revenge from another tribe. By 22:00 hours we reached Sa'da City where we spent the night.

Early morning Thursday we headed towards the land of Wa'eela tribe - a three-hour drive from Sa'da to YemeniSaudi Arabian borders. The road was fraught with dangers. Had it not been for our determination and the tribal guide who accompanied us, our mission would have not been successful. We reached the land of Wa'eela tribe at noon and met its Chief Shaikh: rounded by his followers and body-

guards. He has his own stance towards the recently signed Jeddah Treaty; he rejects it strongly as it "cruelly partitioned his tribe between Yemen and Saudi Arabia."

Nature here is very harsh. No rains for the past two years. Only one drinking water well meets the needs of about 45,000 inhabitants of Wa'eela and the neighboring areas' inhabitants. Other wells give salty water. There is not any trace of cultivation or green nature here owing to lack of water and rains. The

tribesmen live in a quasi-arid desert. Their area is adjacent to Rub' al-Khali. Along the border line there live ten tribes: Dhu Hussein, al-Zawamielah and others, all of whom come under the flag of Wa'eela. Besides Wa'eela lives "Dhm" tribe which has a government camp holding 3,000 army men under the command of Brig. Gen.

> Abdullah Dares. Despite the rigidity of



Military Positions of **Border Tribes**

Surprisingly, we found a lot of light and artillery shells. Everyday many are



heavy military equipment etc. We could not find out how all these weapons came into this area and why there were not any government camps on the two sides of the borders. If any tribe claimed that "there is something" or expressed opposition on certain point, it is not so easy to deflect it; but it impossible to do so.

Wa'eela tribe possesses more than 200 armed military groups. Close to it is Dhm tribe with official support in form of army men, armed groups and weapons. Wa'eela tribe also has 22 well-equipped military positions which makes one suspicious of everything along the border. These positions are located on the peaks of mountains. From those heights you can see the interlocked Saudi Arabian-Yemeni positions. One can see Saudi Arabian tanks forcing their way in the sands, crossing the border line towards 25km south in directions. Tribal military positions along the bor-

der have become one of the reasons for confrontations between tribesmen. Both Wa'eela and Dhm's disputes are Accompanied by Shaikh Sha'jay, we renewed day by day. Sunset observes went to these military positions, the beating of drums of war......with

Last week there were clashes between the two tribes which resulted in 24 killed from Wa'eela side and 15 from Dhm where a government camp exists. Of course, tribal clashes these enjoy official support and state funding against

Indeed Yemeni borders are open and absolutely without any defense - an affair which encouraged Saudi Arabia to swallow a large part of these border areas including Najran and Aseer cities, and allowing it penetrate deep into the Yemeni areas of Al-Boqou and Sa'da through use of force and funds. No one can deny that the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia supports a large number of tribesmen and sheikhs residing along the

Wa'eela tribe bitterly complains of Dhm's government camp, commanded by Brig. Gen. Dares and demands its dismantling because, according to Wa'eela tribesmen it is used to suppress them and not to defend the Yemeni land and borders. Wa'eela tribes are only 10km away from the borders.

recipient of dual funding from both the Saudi Arabian Kingdom and Sana'a regime. Be the situation whatever it be; but what is obvious is that the seeds of Dhm tribe and the camps attached to it have now grown up as strong plants difficult to be eradicated. It is a secretion of both Saudi Arabia and Yemen. The Saudi Arabian regime used to push the borderline tribesmen as a means to put pressure, in form of opposition on the system in Yemen and to carry out disturbances, kidnappings, killings and perpetuating crisis. At the same level, Yemen supported these tribes through weapons and funds to put pressure on the Saudi Arabian side in form of creation of a state of chaos and skirmishes. On the other hand, a disturbing inquiry remains dominant. Wa'eela tribe has 22 military positions with no less than 20 personnel in each position. They are armed and need daily meals and receive monthly remuneration. Where from all these come? Tribesmen have confirmed that any offi-

cial attack is, ostensibly preceded by a tribal attack under the pretext that Wa'eela were the first to attack.

Believe it or not, each member of the Yemeni border guards under the command of Brig. Gen. Abdil-illah Aatef receives only YR.600 per month. They complain of poverty and hunger.

An Entire Yemeni Village Enjoys

Arabian Nationality.

A Yemeni village, "Bazan" is situated in the midst of Al-Aqiq Wadi of the Yemeni area of "Al-Atfain". All its residents are Saudi Arabians. The "Yemen Times" visited the village and met its residents who mostly obtained the Saudi Arabian nationality for their livelihood. Political risks behind this is greater now after the June 12 Jeddah Treaty as one of its clauses stipulates tribal affiliation to be the source of any dispute.

A 22-year-old Rasheed Rashed, said: " Nationality was granted to all members of my family in 1978 after our parents met the Amir Al-Sudairi of Aseer area and demanded nationality. Their request was met. Now all my family members hold the Saudi Arabian nationality. We live in a village known as "Najran" in Al-Atfain area; but we belong to Wa'eela tribe. The bachelor added: "We go into Saudi Arabia and cross the check points without any inconvenience; but here in Sa'da City posts we go through interrogations. We are asked to prove our identity. Despite producing our Saudi Arabian identity we are not spared. We insist that we are in Yemen to visit our relatives; but to no avail. More than 500 citizens live amidst Wa'eela area's Najran village holding Saudi Arabian nationality. Honestly speaking we are asked to opt between Saudi Arabia and Yemen, we shall prefer the former which guarantees jobs; subsequently providing a livelihood to us. The latter does not provide us any thing in form of health, education or telecommunications services. Most of us are employed as border guards, traffic policemen, civil policemen, Air servicemen and guards to the Royal Amir. Saleh Ahmed, 24, married said: " My

father was in the Saudi Arabian Army. We use the Saudi Arabian nationality for our livelihood. Yemen no doubt is our country. We cannot dispense with it; but it is important to be an Arab first. Affiliation does not matter. When asked what would he do in case a confrontation breaks out between Yemen and Saudi Arabia. He replied: "That would be a war between two governments. As citizens we shall not take sides." When asked where shall he fall in case problems and skirmishes take place between the Wa'eela tribe now divided between Yemen and Saudi Arabia. Puzzled, yet he replied: "It depends."

Musfar Muhammed, father of six said: "Virtually we do not benefit from Yemen in any way. Health care and social security are not available. Here in our village we have more than 300 disabled elderly and widows who do not receive any care from Yemen. We are naturalized since long. We support Saudi Arabia. Saudi Arabia is not only a source of income but, during crises between the government and the tribes-







Technology Shapes our Language

t is English and only English that I want to talk about. Which English? British English, American English, Indian English or African English? Or is there any other classification of English like this? No one can deny that there used to be variations in the speeches of Americans, Scotsmen, Englishmen, Irishmen, Canadians, Indians, Australians, South Africans, etc. Do they have any currency at the moment? It is the vanishing differences and the developing universal nature of the language that tickles our

It is a plain truth that America's economic and political dominance accounts for its creativity in the production of new words, phrases and usage. The Oxford American Dictionary (OAD) was published in 1980 to help the American users and is made available to the British reading public as well. Since America is culturally dominant, at present, among the English-speaking nations, we are constantly bombarded in literature, film, TV, newspapers and radio with words and phrases which are either peculiarly American (e.g. sneakers, rain check) or have different meanings in American English from the ones we are familiar with (e.g. vest). The OAD instills doubt into a student as he begins to think about the variants of English. New students find themselves puzzled on the first Oxford African Dictionary! How much will you be persuaded if I say that India, where books are relatively cheaper, is too poor to publish a dictionary of their own? Can't be confused. It is the acceptance of the peculiar Indianisms in English among the English users that matters.

The fast moving world is getting changed every now and then due to modern scientific and technological development. You cannot help noticing new words and expressions coming up almost every day. So many words connected to computer have come to the language in the latter part of the last decade when the world went digital. The development in science and technology has gone a lot ahead to make the machines understand us. The information revolution coined a lot of new words in the last decade of the past century. You can see so many words with the new prefix 'cyber' like cyberwar, cybercafe, cyberspace, and cyberotic- all connected to the digital equipment (computers) and its use. Because of Internet, the importance of English has skyrocketed throughout the world overnight. Once it was the political power of England that determined the spread of English in all the colonies. And it is the colonization that lifted English to the position of an international second language. As a result of the colonial heritage, a sort of cultural colonization was attributed to those who use English to look down upon the country cousins who could not understand English. Many English users were a bit proud to be attached to the English culture. Gone are the days of such pseudo elite. The craze for the American English and American accent reminds us of the Anglo-mania which was dominant among a few English users till recently. Now, the vanishing distances and national boundaries caused by the on-going information revolution make English a global language. If it was colonialism that gave the position of an international second language to English in the past, it is the development of science and technology that lends a hand to keep up the status.

As these changes influence the language in its vocabulary, syntax and usage, an unnoticed and remarkable change occurs to make you redefine and identify the new English. The vista opened up by the Internet reduces the gap between peoples and nations and thus a close tie in the linguistic and cultural aspects paves the way for us to be the ones to determine the nature of the language we use. When you use the media to communicate with outsiders, you can use your expressions and your own peculiar words and phrases as you want. Money will talk: your preferences will be considered. So a change in the nature of the language is inevitable. The vocabulary, accent, usage and everything of the international second language might change in the due course. The domination of the rich or the politically influential nations is going to be ignored as far as the fate of English is considered. More and more people study English in all the developing countries. English language teaching institutes and computer institutes are mushrooming in countries like Yemen where they were considered a luxury of fancy of the rich in the past. The increasing demand for English everywhere in the world and the way people learn it in different parts of the world predict a drastic change that is going to take place. The outcome will be a new language that can be called 'English', not British, American, Indian or African English. The increasing universal nature of the language will ensure the users to have their say. Universality, thus, takes the place of

Using an international language like English in getting and transmitting information will create interest in its literature as well. If you are interested in literature you will read and write, and your reading and writing will influence the other users of the language. So a change in the trend of the English literature wouldn't be a surprise.

Many non-native-English-using countries have already started to make their imprint on English. India is the best example. A block-busting trend was reachable in Indian English writing as the twentieth century came to a close. It is a clarion call as far as the non-native English users are concerned. The youngest generation of writers took the trend-setting steps in 90s giving new dimensions to English literature. They declared a cultural decolonization that can be a model, to many a non-native English user, to follow in the years to come anywhere in the world. Leaving the world to wonder and ponder, the new generation in the post-colonial English writing in India made a curtain raiser. No wonder it has become the talk and toast of Indian English literary scene with the universal acceptance of the works of Vikram Seth and Arundhati Roy. The media attention given to them reinforce their being the apostles of a new identity in English writing. It is not the Booker Prize that matters to a non-native English user -it is the acceptance of his English. Its distortions and queerness are all accepted by the English readers throughout the world.

The new generation of the young writers showed the courage to shatter the shackles of the colonial clutches of English, and they no longer use even the term 'Anglo-Indian literature' to mean the writing in English by Indians. The diminishing marginal colonialism left among the English users in India and elsewhere is fast disappearing. It is high time young talents started making such attempts wherever people learn English as a second language. English is no longer a whip in the hands of a few elite. The new generation of writers breaks the rules and adopts anything that they need to express themselves in the medium. It is not Anglo-mania that gives mandate to English. We look into readiness to accept English as a language to communicate and correspond with our fellow beings in the world.





However, nothing has been done. If we compare bragging of our officials about what they have fulfilled in reality, we will conclude that there is a big gap between both of them. As a live example of this is the situation of the main road of Taiz. The Construction Office has, many times, repaired and paved this road with asphalt. However, few weeks later wide cracks occur on the road, rendering it impassable. Even during construction of these roads the office spends quite a long time to fix it which consequently leads to traffic jams and sometimes acci-



Another example is Taiz- about 25 years ago during alhujaria road. It was paved the late leader Ibrahim Al-



Hamdi. However, so far it has never been properly maintained. Holes could be clearly seen on the road due to a number of reasons including water spilt from trucks which carry water to the city and floods coming down from mountains, especially from Saber and al-Rahish mountains. These floods carry down sands, stones, tree trunks and large branches that block the road, causing some road accidents. Many travelers to villages are forced to go back to town to stay until the road is cleared. Even in emergency cases when sick people from villages urgently

need to be taken to hospital in town, they also have to stay until these floods are over. Many times I have seen families waiting in agony and pain till these floods are over!! This has been going on for a long time. However, the authorities seem to be indifferent. These authorities have to reconsider this issue and give it the attention needed so as to relieve suffering of the residents of the area and decrease the possibility of car accidents.

Hashem Ali: Great Yemeni Talent of World Reputation

Hashem Ali a pioneering Yemeni plastic artist was born in Hadhramout in 1945. He then moved to Taiz where he was brought up and established an apparent interrelationship with it. His connection with the city is so strong and clearly depicted in his paintings which bear testimony to this. Since his early childhood, he has been fond of practicing art as a branch of self-learning through perseverant research and study. He is catego-



rized as one of plastic art founders in Yemen. That is, he is the pioneer in establishing plastic art in Yemen. His first exhibiion was held in Taiz in 1967. He organized many other exhibitions in the Middle East, Europe and USA. His paintings were nighly appreciated and

obtained in many national and foreign museums. He won many medals and certificates of merits. He was granted the Literature and Arts' Medal of the first degree in 1989. He was held as the godfather for most artists who highly appreciate and hold him high.

Dr. Jack Fairman said "Yemen has a culture rich with poetry, music, architecture, philosophy and history. Hashem Ali is the first Yemeni artist in this field. He is a great Yemeni international talent."

Dr. Abdulaziz Al-Makaleh said "If the Arab nation seeks to enumerate her talented pioneers, it is certain that master Hashem Ali will be among the top of these pioneers who seek to create something new and add beauty and amazing touches to this world that is becoming narrower and is about to collapse."

Yemen Times met with Mr. Hashem and filed the following interview:

Q: Who were you influenced by and did you follow any artistic school?

A: I have been influenced by the natural, historic, and humane Yemeni environment. I have been also influenced by the Yemeni architecture and by the archeological objects that are found in mosques. I have been influenced by Taiz city, Saber mountain and the plain girl of Saber with her traditional costume. All these are some factors that I was influenced by.

As for the school I might have followed, there are a triple of schools for plastic arts, influencing the Arab art in particular and the international art in general. These schools are the Babylonian, the Pharaoh Egyptian school and the Southern Arab peninsula school, i.e., the Yemeni school. The Yemeni school is a very ancient artistic school that has clear impact on modern schools. The European schools had been deeply influenced by these schools.


Q: Why, how and to who do you paint?

A: I paint because I love to paint. It is almost everything in life for me. I can't stand the idea of being away from my painting brush and canvas and boards. My attachment to painting is just like the attachment of fish to water. As to how I paint, a quiet place is essential so as

to ponder over what I am doing. Sometimes it takes me almost one year to finish only one painting. Some other times I fail to paint what is burning within me so I become very much upset and I stop eating and talking until I find my way to what I want to paint. And as to who I paint, I paint for the man.

Q: What are the issues that are depicted in your paintings?

A: The main thrust is that of aesthetics which are fundamental for man. Literature and arts have a strong impact to form the essence of man, as different to other



sciences such as political, economic and engineering sciences. Plastic art is an independent science called the aesthetic science.

Q: How do you assess plastic art in Yemen? and How do you view new artists in this field?

A: Probably there is not any real and quick response to this literary form in comparison with other forms of art such as poetry and short story. However, many people have started to apparently understand the nature of plastic art which is a good omen of a better understanding of this art in times to come.

The problem lies in the authority that until recently used to consider arts as banned and prohibited. The Ministry of Culture works to create hurdles and obstacles for artists rather than helping them. It provides these arts and artists with nothing to be appreciated or mentioned. New artists are showing profound interest in plastic art. They are promising of better times to come. Now we witness more exhibitions organized in schools, universities and cultural centers. There is a criticism movement in newspapers, magazines, writings and TVs, etc. All these factors together help improve the understanding of people to plastic art.

I advise new artists to go on painting and there will be one day when people would understand the meaning of plastic art and how important it is for the society.

Q: What about the role of Plastic Art Syndicate? A: The syndicate is part and parcel of plastic art movement to create an understanding among the people to this art. We do not rely neither on the government nor on the syndicate. We should depend on the movement itself and every one should shoulder responsibility to improve this art.

Q: There was some news about collecting all your paintings in a special museum. What is new about it so far?

A: So far nothing has happened. It was an idea adopt-

ed by some official, popular, and literary sources. I assert that the existence of this museum is pending on the authority understanding of the importance of plastic art. This has also a tourist appeal for such museums will attract more tourists to the country, consequently boosting the tourist drive in the country. I hope the authority will be aware of this, despite the fact that officials at the Ministry of Culture are always turning a deaf ear.

Q: Do you think that architecture is part of plastic

A: It is, of course. After all it creates some kind of beauty. Architecture is not a mere structure of buildings for making constructions and designs is an art which also affects man from inside.

Q: What are your future ambitions?

A: My ambition is to be an artist for up till now I do not feel satisfied with what I have produced. Real artist is the one who feels that he can never quench his desire and suffers more whenever he achieves something.






