





Some Western diplomatic sources have spoken out their fear of coming under potential anti-Westerners attacks on the eve of the New

A number of diplomats told the Yemen Times they would not attend Christmas celebrations at the Aden Gold Mohur Hotel after Washington had warned of anti-Americans assaults in Yemen.

The US government has advised its citizens in Yemen to use caution with regard to possible anti-US and British attacks.

The US Embassy in Sana'a has similarly sent messages to the American community warning of possible attacks on places frequented by Americans and Britons.

The statement considered Gold Muhur Hotel as a possible target for such attacks, particularly during the New Year celebrations. It also deemed the Sana'a Trade Center as another potential target.

US Department of State called on American citizens, in December 2001 not to visit Yemen owing to what it described as "potential terror-

Saturday the kidnappers of the German Engineer, Lehnerd Cart, to 20-25 years in jail. The first defendant Nasser Al-zaidi was sentenced to 25 years' imprisonment while the other three kidnappers, Mohammed al-Zaidi, Hassan al-Zaidi and Saleh Tuiman who were tried in absentia were sentenced to 20 years in jail each. Aziz Shuqil was acquitted.

The authorities have granted a 30-day grace period to foreigners to legalize their presence in the country.





# Yemen Names Two Suspects in al-Qaeda Manhunt

The Yemeni 26 September weekly on Thursday named two men the authorities are hunting down as suspected to have links to Osama bin Laden's al-Qaeda network. The newspaper identified the two Yemeni citizens as Mohammed Hamdi al-Ahdal, also known as Abu Asem al-Ahdal and Ali Qaed Senyan al-Harthi, also known as Abu Ali al-Harthi. Yemeni officials said they were seeking three suspected members of al Qaeda. Last week,

Yemen's military and security forces attacked suspected al Qaeda hideouts in Mareb region and at least 24 soldiers and four tribesmen were killed in the attack.

"Yemen will also send a team of investigators to Pakistan to help interrogate Yemenis who fought with al Qaeda and fled Afghanistan a few days after the U.S. strikes on Afghanistan started." the paper added.

# **Human Rights Regional Course Kicked off**

The Taiz-based Human Rights Training & Information Center (HRITC) organized an Arab regional meeting on human rights in which 40 trainees took part. In the inaugural celebration, Ali Mohammed al-Anessi, Director of the Presidency Office, Deputy-Chairman of the Higher Committee for Human Rights stressed Yemen's readiness to crackdown on terrorism; however, he pointed out that the campaign on terrorism would certainly put restrains on human rights, as well as the freedom of movement, investment and

The British Ambassador to Yemen emphasized that non-governmental organizations had a very important role to play with regard to the promotion of human rights. "Governments are often more willing to criticize others than to look at their own problems, and governments are sometimes worried about interfering in the internal affairs of other

states. But NGOs can act as a catalyst to draw attention to both national and international problems. And they can make sure that governments have the information on which to act," she added.

Izzaddin al-Asbahi, Chairman of HRITC, said in his speech that the course principally meant to stress the importance of working to cement the principles of human rights and promote solidarity among the Arab states.

A word on behalf of the UN Secretary-General, Kufi Anan, on the occasion of the 53th anniversary of Human Rights Declaration, was addressed by Yousef Aburass, United Nations' Office Director in

Similarly, the French Embassy's Cultural Advisor delivered a speech in which he confirmed his country's commitment to support Yemen's in the field of human rights.

# **Police Hunt Down Attackers on Police**

The Yemeni police in al-Sayani district, Ibb 195km to the south of Sana'a are still hunting out perpetrators of the attack on the police station in the area. Sources in Ibb said the police arrested one of the assailants but five others are still at large.

Last Tuesday six gunned men attacked the police station in al-Sayani to free some of their relatives detained for criminal charges. The assailants clashed with the guards of the station jail killing two of the soldiers. But, they failed to set their relative free. The police damaged their houses in two villages and are still chasing them to bring them to justice.

Official sources in the area denied any political motivation behind the attack but local sources said that Walid Shamlan, head of the attackers, had a brother that had been to Afghanistan and was wanted by the authorities. One of the assailants is also one of those who witnessed the marriage document writing ceremony of Usama bin Laden and the daughter of Ahmed Abdulfatah al-Saddah

# Clean-up Campaign in Socotra

The office of the Ministry of Public Health & Population in Hadramaut is carrying out a clean-up campaign in Socotra Island in January 2002, Salem al-Ubathan, Director-General of the office told the Yemen Times. He pointed out that the campaign would include different activities. "A number of researches and studies will also be conducted during this campaign," he added.

# **Ethio-Yemeni Joint Committee Formed**

Addis Ababa - Ethiopia and Yemen set up a joint technical committee here on Friday aimed at helping implement the protocol agreement signed between the two countries, particularly in the areas of oil gas and mineral exploration, the Ethiopian News Agency reported.

Speaking at the joint technical committee meeting, Ethiopian State Minister of Mines Sinknesh Ejigu said the establishment of the joint committee was effected in accordance with the executive program agreement signed between the two sides last February. She said the formation of the joint committee would play a crucial role in further strengthening the bilateral relations between the two countries.

According to the agreement, Ethiopia and Yemen are expected to encourage their respective private sectors to enter into joint investment schemes of mine development endeavors.

Abdulmalik Mohamed Alama, Yemeni Deputy Minister of Oil and Mineral Resources said his government had a keen desire to deepen ties with Ethiopia in the mine development sec-

# 25 Sentenced to Death for Banditry

The Penal Court of Sana'a last Wednesday sentenced 24 members of a 42-member gang to death for acts of murder, banditry and other sorts of crimes. Three persons were sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment, a person to 4 years in jail while another defendant to eight years. Eleven members of the ring were acquitted because of lack of enough evidence.

The gang which includes members

below 18 years has been carrying out several criminal acts since 1990, claiming the lives of 16 persons. The defendants all appealed the verdict.

The court also sentenced Ahsan Hussien al-Mawj to death for robbing Yahia al-Hamzi and his wife. The police is also trying to hunt down Bakel Abdullah for taking part in the same banditry five months ago in Harf Sefian in Saddah governorate.

# **Japan Grants Aid to Ibb City**

The Government of Japan has decided to extend a grant aid amounting up to USD 89,181, approximately fifteen million Yemeni Riyals, to Ibb Cleaning Fund under the scheme called the "Grant Assistance for Grassroots Projects". This grant is to cover the costs for the construction of kiosks in the central market in order to improve sanitary condition and the image of the city center so as to prevent people from worse sanitary condition and to look more beautiful. Part of the grant will also be used to purchase a number of motorcycles to support its better management of Solid Waste Project and the good cleanliness efforts that aim at making Ibb City more attractive. Both sides of this project will highly contribute to the environmental and sanitation situations in Ibb City. The Government of Japan has decided to extend the grant due to good management of the Ibb Cleaning Fund and also high awareness of people in Ibb. An agreement to this effect was signed December 25 2001 in Sana'a Deputy Governor of Bib Mr. Abdul Wahid Salah and Mr. Masamitsu Oki, Ambassador of Japan to the Republic of Yemen.

At the same time, Japan has decided to extend a grant aid amounting up to USD 29,995 approximately five million Yemeni Riyals, to Parental Council in Ibb under the scheme called the "Grant Assistance for Grassroots Projects". Parental Council constructed new facility to expand its activity to accept more children who live in the streets with bad living condition and no basic education.

This grant is to cover a part of the costs of the procurement of necessary furniture to meet urgent needs to save children providing favorable conditions that make them feel safer, happier and comfortable. The Government of Japan has decided to extend this grant to Parental Council for its good management, long, and strenuous efforts to support street children. An agreement to this effect was signed December 25 2001 in Sana'a by Mr. Abdul Kareem Moneer, Chief of the Parental Council in Ibb, and Ambassador of Japan to the Republic of Yemen.

It is worth mentioning that the abovementioned scheme of Japan's Grant Assistance aims at supporting smallscale community-based projects in basic human need fields, such as primary health care, basic education and public welfare in developing countries. in addition to other social developmental fields.

# **Polish Counselor to YT:**

# "The question of security has an utmost importance

Romanski, Counselor of the Embassy of Poland in Sana'a is a very active, dynamic and kind person. All the people of media who know him highly appreciate his personal capabilities and his distinguished character as a media per-

Although the Polish Embassy in Sana'a was opened in 1991, nobody knew well about the Polish diplomatic activities in Yemen, particularly in the media and commercial aspects, till the current staff of the Embassy were accredited in 1996 and 1997. The twoperson staff of the Polish Embassy in Sana'a consists only of HE the Ambassador Mr. Krzysztof Suprowicz, and his Counselor, Mr. Kazimierz Romanski, who is also the Consul, as well as the Commercial and Media Attaché at the Embassy.

Interestingly, these two persons also represent their country in Eritrea, Djibouti and Ethiopia, and the responsibilities entrusted to them are really arduous ones

I cannot indeed narrate all the skills and abilities of this capable person, although some people may mistakenly think that this appreciation is the result of my intimate friendship with him. However, the fact is that I could not express my real feelings towards him to its full, especially as I came to know that he was leaving Yemen only two hours before his departure.

#### Excerpts Q: When did you come to Yemen?

A: I came here in the middle of 1997. It wasn't my first mission to an Arab country. Before I came here, I had worked in Libya and also in Egypt where I lived for more than five years. I have visited many other countries like Jordan and Iraq. So I am quite acquainted with the Arab world, policies, traditions, customs and habits.

I must say that I do like the Arab world.

Q: What are your impressions about Yemen?

A: I would like first to tell that it was rather a busy mission. I have been responsible for many things including the consular, economic, culture and press affairs.

Yemen is a very beautiful country. Unfortunately, I haven't had enough time to visit all interesting places. I have many times been to

Aden, Hodeidah, Mocha, Khukha, Taiz, Ibb, Marib, etc. But I have not had the opportunity to visit Mukalla or Syoun. I wish I would be able to visit them in the near future

I highly appreciate the changes in social and political life in Yemen. I have noticed the country had been progressing. There is a real press freedom here. There is a real opposition press. This is an exception to most of the Arab peninsula.

On my mission here, I have been concentrating on presenting a good vision of Poland in Yemen. I also tried to present Yemen to Poland and the Polish people. I introduced all the business, trade and investment opportunities in Yemen to the Polish companies. In this regards, many official visits have been exchanged between the two countries. We have met many times with Yemeni delegations; we have had meetings with the press, representatives of radio, and TV to give Poland a chance to be presented.

#### Q: What are your comments on tourism in Yemen?

A: Yemen has huge opportunities to become a tourist country. Tourists can come here if they know how wonderful the country is. That is why the authorities of Yemen should first present Yemen abroad through their diplomatic missions abroad to present Yemen

As far as the tourist potentials are concerned, Yemen has many good landscapes and beaches. Many people like



to dive and I think Yemeni beaches, if utilized properly, will be a good destination for them. There are also historic sites such as the temple of Marih, But Yemen should attract tourists. Of course, I must tell frankly that one of the important conditions that must be met in

order to attract tourists is security. In this regards, I really appreciate the Yemeni authorities' approach to decrease kidnappings. Kidnappings or similar acts make tourists reluctant to come. They are simply afraid of coming here. That is why all the efforts made by the authorities to stop and fight kidnappings must be enhanced. Also the Yemeni society, the sheikhs, the people who are planning to kidnap foreigners should know that this does not serve the good image of Yemen abroad and it cuts the possibility of tourists coming here. It cuts the possibilities of earnings, because tourists come with money to spend here.

The hotels here are good, and day after day they are increasing in number. But the question of security has an utmost importance.

#### Q: A number of Polish business delegations have visited Yemen. Do they think of investing in Yemen? Are there problems blocking the way of Polish investment here?

A: We have established our mission here in 1991. The Yemeni embassy in Warsaw was opened also about the same time. There is a lack of information on the opportunities provided. What we have so far done is that we have arranged several Polish missions to Yemen. A mission from the Polish Chamber of Commerce visited Yemen last May and they had talks with their counterparts in Sana'a, Aden and Taiz. What we in the Embassy tried to do is to make it possible for the business people to get together and to talk about this matter.

I think that we have done the first step. More and more Polish businessmen know about Yemen more than before. They come, look, calculate the risks and possible profits. It is right that the Embassy cannot interfere much, because this is a private sector, but our obligation has been to create good opportunities for the people who want know their partners. We have our own Consulate in Aden. Anyone who is interested in this matter can come to get the information needed.

want to once again emphasize that we have practically finished the first stage; to make contact and to get together the businessmen. We should wait for the results. The big work has been done and the results are bound to come.

#### Q: Any last comment?

Through extensive meetings and encouragements, the minister was able to reduce bureaucracy to low levels. 3- He exerted much efforts in sending talented and promising young journalists from the government sector abroad for training. He indicated many times the importance of giving a chance to the new generation and giving way for new talents to take over important posts in the ministry and in government run media establishments.

4- He set plans to establish new media centers, such as the one in Sana'a, in other cities in the country to promote the same ideas and to bring together journalists of those cities.

5- His encouragement to the non-gov-

ernmental press was significant as he pushed hard to allocate a larger budget in the form of financial assistance to encourage the free and independent press for better performance.

6- Through continued invitations to journalists, al-Awadi was able to bring them together and have them share visions for the future of the press in Yemen. He insists that newspapers should all be treated equally no matter how critical they are of the state.

7- He brought new equipment and machinery to the state-run TV and Radio all other ministers. establishment. At the same time has been supporting its working staff financially and morally to have them cope with the worldwide global revolutions.

8- He raised life insurance of journalists and employees working in press establishments to YR 1 million, which is given to the family of the deceased after his

9- He promoted sport activities for employees of the ministry by launching various sport events, which he himself also participates in. Being a sportsperson and not being a qat chewer made him encourage his employees to give up chewing qat and instead direct their energies to sports in their leisure time. He ordered the construction of small cafeterias and green gardens at the TV and Radio establishments and the Ministry, as he did before in the Saba News Agency.



# Objectives of the U.S. War against Terror

s a consequence of the Vietnam's dilemma, the United States attempted to adopt a new political and military approach towards the Asian countries in compliance with Nexen Principle. The principle which was declared in 1966 stressed USA's commitments towards certain countries in the world through creating a nuclear shield to defend itself and its allies. But in case of nonnuclear aggressions the USA would restrict its support to providing its allied countries with military and economic aids.

The contents of Nexen Principle focused on the utilization of human resources of its allied states; however the principle did not change the fundamental objectives of the U.S. foreign policy. President Nexen himself stressed this point in an article pub-

lished in 1972, stating "We have retained the concept of USA's objectives, but had reconsidered the ways to achieve them. This will happen through customizing them in ways that suit the international variables." In reality, the US reconsideration of the means to achieve its goals focused on a set of policies, which will be elaborated in the rest of the article.


The American military leadership adopted the socalled the "Blue Water" policy which greatly relayed on the U.S. marine forces. Hence, it tended to deploy its marine fleets all over the world, particularly near the territorial waters of the developing countries as

a way of pressurizing those nations. It also sought to get facilities in sea in other part of the world.

The United States attempted to involve many regional alliances within its global political system. This was confirmed by the former U.S. Secretary of State, Henry Kissinger, when he stated that if the United States was serious to apply a fruitful foreign policy, it should be attentive to forming global coalitions that would consequently assume defending their soils with the U.S. support. He added that the USA would focus on building general systems more than occupying itself with the domestic issues of those regions. Based on this approach the U.S. administration vigorously attempted to attract both Iran and Saudi Arabia to its side. It generously provided them with all sorts of arms in a drive to realize its objectives in the region. "Selling military equipment has become an integral part for safeguarding the U.S. interests in this region," a U.S. marine forces periodical reported. Although, this approach collapsed with the removal of the Shah of Iran in

1979, the USA started its direct military expansion in the region two years earlier, namely in August 1977 when Jimmy Carter announced order No. 18 concerning strategic military issues; the Gulf region, W. European countries, Southern Korea and Israel were all considered U.S. interests zones. Accordingly, it treated any attempts to have a presence in the region as working against the U.S. top interests which should be retaliated against by all the available means, including the use of military force.

In 1979-1980, the United States went ahead with implementing its rapid intervention program which had 120,000 troopers, including motorized infantry forces, marines, tactical warplanes, and four marine fleets. The Pentagon declared in March 1980 the setting up of the command-staffs of the rapid deployment forces, which was later entrusted to the U.S. Central Command formed by the Pentagon. The scope of action of these forces covered 19 countries stretching from Kenya to Pakistan.

# Major Economic Events in Yemen during 2001

good number of economic transitions in Yemen were recorded throughout 2001. Intensive specialized symposia on investment, trade, and finance were organized. The diesel price zoomed causing resentment among people. However, the government went on carrying out the Economic Reforms Program and got a grant of \$1,180,000,000 from the World Bank to support it.

Below is a list of some of the major economic events that took place during 2001.

#### January

- The Yemeni famous dragon blood trees were given priority among all the national exports to the foreign markets.
- The Middle East Manager of the World Bank, Andrea Sud, expressed during a visit to Yemen, his appreciation of the administrative and economic reforms in Yemen.
- A memorandum of understanding between the Ministries of Oil and Mineral Wealth and Canadian Nexen Petroleum Yemen Company was signed to explore oil and gas in Hadhramaut governorate.
- The General Investment Authority (GIA) licensed projects estimated at more than YR 93 billion. The projects included the establishment of eight cement factories, oil refineries in Hadhramaut, Ras Isa in Hodeidah and other kind of projects.
- The General Corporation for Weaving and Spinning honored 466 of its retired workers in recognition of their efforts and their role in serving the good of the Corporation.
- The General Manager of GIA, Abdulkareem Motahar said in a meeting with the Belgian Business delegate visiting Yemen at the time that the Yemeni government paid special attention to the foreign

investors and that it would facilitate their jobs in Yemen.

#### February

- The General Authority of Electricity and Rural Water allocated YRs 1,500,000,000 to the implementation of 125 projects all over the country.
- The President of the Central Bank of Yemen (CBY), Ahmad Abdulrahman Al-Sammawi said the banks' reserves of foreign currency reached \$ 3, 000,000,000. He added that banks in Yemen achieved a great success as a result of the economic and financial reforms indicating that the overall banking sector' reserves starting from March 1995 to the end of 2000 totaled YR 2,800,000,000.
- Abduljabbar Hayel Saeed, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the al-Tadhamon Islamic Bank, stated that the bank's profits during 2000 mounted to YR 2 billion registering a 48-percent increase in comparison with 1999. He said the overall deposits of the bank increased from YR 9,5 billion to YR 21,6 billion during the last year. At the same time, money put for investment increased from YR 7,5 billion to YR 17,5 billion during 2000.
- Eight oil fields were explored in Ma rib. Oil experts said the production capacity of the fields was 65 thousand barrels per day.
- A joint production agreement was signed by the Ministry of Oil and Mineral Wealth, Canadian Nexen Petroleum Yemen Company, the American Occidental Company and one of the companies of the Yemeni Corporation for Oil and Gas to explore oil in Block 59 in Hadhramaut and al-Mahra which stretches over 4168 square km.
- Profits of the Amran Cement Factory during 2000 were announced to reach YR 4 billion. The production level of the same factory reached 700,000 tons while the overall revenues during the same year mounted to YR 8,500,000,000.
- The Tobacco and Matches National Company Ltd. said it last year achieved the highest level of production, marketing and profits since it

was founded in 1963. The production level reached 318 thousand cigarette cartoons registering an increase by 240, 242 cigarette cartoons in 1999. The company's profits were also announced to have increased to YR 1,903,518,000 in 2000, registering an increase by 1.8 percent in comparison with the company's profits in 1999.

 Computer Section was inaugurated at the Industrial and Vocational Institute supported by the Embassy of the Republic of China at the cost of YR 2 million.

#### March

- The Chairman of the General Union of the Chambers of Commerce and Industry, Abdullah Ali Al-Sunaidar announced the agreement to set up a Yemeni-Saudi Holding Company entrusted with implementing joint investment projects.
- A delegation from an American exploratory company arrived in Yemen to hold talks about completing the second phase of oil exploration in Shabwa.
- Geological studies confirmed that the zeolite mineral exploration sites could attract a lot of investors owing to the fact that they were near to the paved roads which facilitated transportation of the raw material to the local markets and to export harbors.
- During the first half of 2001, the overall crude oil unloaded to the Aden Refinery totaled 1,485,000,57 tons. In the same context, the overall exportation of the refined oil and its derivatives totaled 845,646 tons.
- A memorandum of understanding was signed between the Oil Ministry and a Russian oil company according to which the Russian company was given the green light to explore oil and gas in Blocks No. 37 and 39 in al-Mahra.
- An agreement was reached in Sana'a between the Ministry of Oil and Mineral Wealth and the Arab Industrial and Mineral Development Organization with the view of activating cooperation between the two sides, particularly in the field of utilizing the mineral wealth. The meeting also concentrated on continuing cooperation and joint coordination between the Organization and the Ministry to discuss the arrangements for the Eighth Conference for Mineral Wealth to be held in Sana'a in 2003.

# Apri

- The Islamic Bank delegation headed by the Deputy Manager of Projects and Operation Department, al-Mansoob Bin Fatta concluded a visit to Yemen during which they discussed projects financed by the bank.
- The Reconstruction and Development Bank of Yemen announced that its distributable profits, with tax being excluded, during 2001 reached VP 435 460 000
- Yemen participated in the second cycle of the technical committee concerned with liberating the foreign trade and economic globalization in the ESCWA countries. The event was held in Doha on 7-8 April. Participants discussed the scope of progress in the field of foreign trade for the year 2000 and 2001.
- Economic statistics indicated that the trade balance achieved export surplus totaling YR 299,296,448,000 during 2000. The value of the total exports of national products reached YR 659,831,484,000 while imports' costs totaled YR 380,535,000,000 during the same year.
- In collaboration with the Social Fund for Development the College of Agriculture in Ibb organized a course on agro-industry and home economics for districts of the governorate of Ibb. A number of lectures were delivered by participants in the field of agro-industry and home economics.
- Yemen participated in the Cairo Arab Businesswomen Conference under the theme 'The Arab Joint Market in Reality'. The conference was organized by the Egyptian Businesswomen and Development Society.
- Participants at the training course organized by the Aden Chamber of Commerce and Industry in collaboration with GTZ stressed the importance of small enterprises in supporting Yemeni market and providing job opportunities for people.

- The Ministry of Technical Education and Vocational Training organized a number of short training courses for the unemployed people at the Technical and Commercial Institute in Aden. More than 34 people from Aden, Lahj, and Abyan attended the courses.
- After the political stability was achieved, the government started to search for International as well as regional experts to help it market its agricultural, mineral and marine products worldwide.

#### May

- A number of Yemeni and Emeritus businessmen called for a wide and highly developed trade network between Yemen and the Gulf Countries with the aim of activating the role of trade and investment and the flow of commodities and servic-
- A delegation from the Sharja Chamber of Commerce and Industry toured the the Old City of Sana'a.
- Economic statistics said 17 trading companies were established in the first half 2000.
- In the sideline of the UN Third Conference for LDC held in Brussels, the Minister of Commerce and Industry discussed with Brussels PM the Yemeni investment law, as well as the facilities and privileges granted by the law.
- Yemeni industrialists called for an extensive discussion of the sales tax law draft before submitting it with its final amendments to the parliament. In a press conference held in Sana'a, the industrialists demanded more consideration for some living and investment circumstances in addition to a number of products that require more encouragement by the government.

#### June

- The hydrographic surveys of the territorial waters and Yemeni islands were completed. The surveys which started in December 2000, were conducted by a British ship under the supervision of a technical team from the Yemeni Seaports Authority and the General Authority of Marine Affairs.
- The Customs Authority concluded a custom orientation symposium organized by the Authority in collaboration with the government bodies.
   More than 35 specialists from the the authority, the Ministry of Commerce and Industry and the General Union of Chambers of Commerce and Industry participated in the symposium.
- Participants in the symposium on a stock market in Yemen recommended more efforts for completing the necessary requirements to improve the organizational, economic, legal, and legislative environment as to pave the way for the establishment of a stock market in Yemen.
- The Ministry of Water and Electricity announced that \$300 million had been allocated to reforming the electrical system and overcoming the current deficiency in generating power in Yemen.
- The Yemeni and Italian chambers of commerce and industry held a meeting in Sana'a. The two sides discussed the progress made by Yemen in different aspects, specially in promoting investment on its land. The Italian delegation was briefed on the facilities granted by the Yemeni Investment Law. Means of enhancing bilateral cooperation between Yemen and Italy were also discussed.
- The Intellectual Property Symposium was organized in Sana'a by the National Committee for Preparation for and Negotiation with the WTO and in collaboration with the International Organization for the Intellectual Property. A good number pf researchers and economists participated in Symposium.

# July

- Torrential rains caused huge damage to the arable land in Hadhramaut.
   Several people and livestock were drifted away.
- The Yemeni Minister of Commerce and Industry, Abdurahman Mohammed Othman, met in the Dutch embassy in Sana'a with the Dutch commercial attache and the Chief Executive of Fast Company implementing the technical aid project at the Small Enterprises Development Unit and discussed

- with them fields of bilateral cooperation between Yemen and the Netherlands. They also discussed the preparation to change the Unit into fund to support small enterprises.
- Under the sponsorship of the PM, Abdulkader Bajammal, the Yemen International Exhibition for Industry and Agriculture 2001 was organized. More than 150 industrial and agricultural companies and institutions took part in the event.
- The Minister of Commerce and Industry met with the World Bank representative Hogolia Deflin. In the meeting the two sides discussed the World Bank activities in Yemen and its role in the development of role of the private sector through its assistance to Yemen.

#### August

- The General Corporation for Cement Industry and Marketing was successfully able to meet its production and sales plan during the first half of 2001, registering an increase in the production by 117 percent.
- Production of the the Bajel Cement Plant exceeded the planned production level by 130 percent. Similarly, production of the Amran Cement Plant went beyond the expected production level by 112 percent and that of the al-Barh Cement plant by 114 percent. Statistics indicated that the overall cement production at the three plants reached 743 thousand tons during the first half of the current year.
- The Supreme Council for Exports Development in Sana'a held a meeting chaired by the PM in which decisions centered on the Five-Year Plan and other topics related to the development of national products as well as the possibilities of exporting the Yemeni products to the African markets.
- The Ministry of Commerce banned importation of commodities that do not bear the country of origin.
- The Commercial Court in Aden settled 543 disputes out of 777 different cases during 2001.
- The General Union of Arab Chambers of Commerce and industry condemned the Israeli aggression against the Palestinians plus the embargo imposed upon the Palestinian trade movement.
- The Yemeni Chamber of Commerce and Industry estimated the different kinds of fish available in the territorial waters along the Yemeni coastlines at 300 different kinds.
- In assessment of the Economic Reforms Program implemented since 1995 by the government of Yemen, a report by the representatives of the Arab Chambers of Commerce and Industry meeting in Sana'a said the program had helped stabilize the the exchange rate, stop deterioration of the national currency, etc. The report added that the budget deficit had also been lessened and that economic growth of 5.5 percent was achieved in 2000.
- Studies done by a team from the General Authority of Electricity and Rural Water showed that great sweet water reservoirs were found in Baghinash located in the north of Modeh in Abyan.

# September

- The Minister of Labor and Social Affairs and the chairman of board of directors of the Social Fund for Development, Abdulkareem al-Arhabi confirmed that the State had shown great interest in improving mechanisms of alleviating poverty among the lower classes.
- The Taxes Authority burned 161 smuggled cigarette cartoons which have illegally entered the country.
- In Sana'a, a training course was organized on Project planning by the Societies Development Program and the Ministry of the Planning and Development in collaboration with the United Nation Development Project (UNDP).

# October

- The Board of Directors of the Free Zones Authority discussed the annual report on the Authority's activities in the Aden Free Zone as well as the developments in the Container Terminal. The report also concentrated on the accomplished phases in the industrial zone and the new investment projects.
- The participants in the workshop on Documenting and Exchanging Experiences in the Planting and

- Production of Coffee called for the establishment of a national coffee center for promoting and developing coffee production in Yemen.
- An agreement was singed at the General Authority of Water and Sanitation in Sana'a to implement a sewage network in both al-Sabaeen and al-Sawad areas at the cost of \$ 2,955,762.
- The Ministry of Fish Wealth conducted studies and researches on adornment fish in the Yemeni territorial waters in the Red Sea with the aim of protecting them from washouts and damage.
- In Dar Sa'd, the first experiment to implement small enterprises in the educational field supported by the Societies Development Program was succeeded. The program aimed at alleviating poverty and unemployment among university graduates in Aden governorate.
- The Minister of Commerce and Industry discussed with the World Bank representative means to develop relations between Yemen and the World Bank in the field of commerce and industry.
- A memorandum of understanding was signed in Sana'a between the Ministry of Fish Wealth and the Red Sea Studies Center for Islamic and Arab Studies Center in Exeter University. The memorandum called for exerting efforts to promote the Red Sea identity at all levels, a matter that can be achieved through exchanging curricula, organizing training courses, holding exhibitions, symposia, conferences and setting up joint work teams.
- A symposium on the import of second-hand vehicles warned against the increase in the volume of imports from non-countries of origin which was estimated at YR 97 billion.
- The participants in the training course on acetifying, multiplying and paring the olive tree in Yemen stressed the necessity of taking care of the olive tree in Yemen. The course was organized by the General Administration of the Botanic Production Department in the Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation in collaboration with the Arab Center for Studying Dry Lands.
- An agreement on the expansion of the Cultural Cooperation Program between Yemen and China for the coming five years was signed between the two countries in Beijing. According to the agreement the government of China will grant more scholarships in the cultural fields for Yemenis in addition to exchanging experiences, information, documents, etc. in all different cultural aspects.
- The Supreme Council for Civil Service dropped out a number of phantom names within the framework of the administrative, financial and economic reforms implemented by the government since 1995.

# November An agreet

- An agreement to properly utilize the working force was signed between Yemen and UAE at the UAE Foreign Ministry. The agreement included organizing the Yemeni Labor in the UAE in collaboration with the Ministry of Labor and Social Affairs in Yemen.
- The World Bank and the International Monetary Fund (IMF) granted loans to Yemen totaling to \$1,18 million in support of the second Five-Year Plan (2001-2005).
   The World Bank allocated
- \$1,180,000,000 to supporting development projects in Yemen during the coming period. The bank also allocated an amount of \$50 to a project meant for the protection of Taiz from floods.

# December

- The Supreme Council of Motherhood & Childhood and the National Population Council are to continue preparations for holding the third national conference for population policies scheduled for October 2002.
- A training course on human resources administration and planning was concluded at the Ministry of Public Health. More than 40 participants from the Human Resources Administration and Planning in the health offices took part in the course.
- More than 600 handicapped were employed in a number of Yemeni cities.

he terrorists who leveled the World Trade Center, smashed into Pentagon, caused a passenger jet to be flown into the ground in Pennsylvania, and killed thousands of people in the morning of September 11, thought that they would change the world forever.

The terrorists did change the world, but in ways they never intended.

Where the terrorists sought to divide and destroy, the world has instead joined together to build a coalition against terrorism. Where the terrorists tried to sow doubt and fear, the world has responded with commitment, courage, and determination. Where the terrorists imagined they could hide, the coalition is turning them out of their lairs, and will bring them to justice.

It has now been 100 days since those terrorist attacks, 100 days since the world joined forces to eliminate terrorism. Acting together, the coalition has used its military power to pursue and eliminate the terrorists in Afghanistan. The coalition has worked together to cut off the flow of terrorist financing worldwide, and to make it more difficult for terrorists to cross borders, unnoticed, to carry out their murderous

While the coalition's military objectives - the elimination of the Taliban and al-Qaeda terrorist threat - have not vet been fully achieved, a great deal has been accomplished in this first hundred days. Afghanistan is now back in the hands of Afghans eager to rebuild their country; humanitarian aid, interrupted by the Taliban, is once again flowing to the Afghan people; girls are returning to the classroom; women are free to venture outside their homes; widows can now provide food for their families; children can once again fly kites; music is once again heard in the streets; boys can play soccer again.

Perhaps most remarkable of all, in defiance of history and with the help of the United Nations and the international community, Afghans have put aside their differences to form an interim government, and to work together to rebuild their country. Afghan women will take their rightful place in this new government, and the Afghan people will once again govern themselves.

The terrorist network in Afghanistan has been disrupted and dismembered, but there is still much to do to make sure they can never again launch their destruction on the world community. The elimination of al-Qaeda and other terrorist groups will not be quick or easy, but whether it takes a week or a year or a decade, the terrorists will be brought to justice.

The war on terrorist financing is one of

the outstanding successes in the war on terrorism. Law enforcement agencies in countries worldwide are contributing to the success of the war on terror by sharing information in order to apprehend terrorists before they strike. Yet much needs yet to be done. United Nations Security Council Resolution 1373, passed on September 28, requires all nations to adopt and implement wide-ranging anti-terrorism measures, especially those suppressing financing to terrorist groups and improving international cooperation hindering the free movement of terrorist operatives. The US stands ready to work with partner nations in accomplishing these objectives.

In addition, the twelve United Nations conventions against terrorism constitute the bedrock of the international community's response to the terrorist threat. All sates should ratify and implement these conventions.

Thanks to coalition action in Afghanistan, humanitarian aid is now moving overland to those Afghans most in need. Bridges and roads from Afghanistan's neighbors have reopened, and with the collapse of the Taliban, international humanitarian aid workers have returned to Afghanistan. Millions of Afghans, facing hunger due to the long years of civil war, drought, and Taliban misrule, must be fed through the winter if they are to survive. While the US is the largest singe donor of humanitarian assistance to Afghans, many other countries are also helping to provide the food that will save Afghan lives in the coming months.

President Bush called on the people and children of America to open their hearts and reach out to the people and children of Afghanistan. Shipment of medical aid and assistance, including school supplies, clothing and gifts are now on their way to Afghanistan. Among this outpouring of human caring are winter tents, winter jackets, and 10,000 gift parcels from the children of America to the children of Afghanistan, containing hats, socks, toothbrushes and hair brushes, candy and toys, which may bring joy to those children who have suffered such incredible hardship.

The terrorists imagined they would change the world. But they could never have imagined the way in which the world would come together after September 11. Those who committed the terrorist crimes of September 11 galvanized the international community and brought the countries of the world together, united by a resolve to eliminate the threat of terrorism.

During the first hundred days since September 11, the coalition against terrorism has already achieved what many thought would be impossible. Yet there is still much to do, and there is no going back. And in the end, the world will be victorious over terror-



ince 1976, Japan has been one of the major donor countries to extend financial and technical aid to the Yemen Arab former Republic (YAR), People's Democratic Republic of Yemen, (PDRY) and the present unified Yemen. Out of the many colorful cultural pictures of Japan, the following selected images, though a few, are enough to open a window on the richness of the Japanese culture


#### Architecture

the Japanese architecture has been greatly influenced by the Chinese style. However, many differences are to be noticed Modernization has also changed a lot of the traditional aspects in the Japanese life. For example, until 1912 most Japanese families would sit on the ground. Chairs and tables appeared after this time.

The Japanese architec-

climate. Summers in most of Japan are long, hot, and humid, a fact that is reflected in the way homes are built. the traditional houses are a bit raised so that the air can move around and beneath them.

The interior of Japanese houses in the past was virtually open, without even screens to partition off individual spaces. Gradually, as more thought was given to particular areas and their functions, such as eating, sleeping, or dressing, self-standing screens came into use. paper-covered sliding doors, which are still seen, came afterward. Even in the westernized houses, it is still usual to find a room whose floor is covered over with a Japanese mat, and it is still the custom of people to take off their shoes before entering the house.

#### Kinkakuji Temple (The Golden Pavilion), Kyoto

Kyoto, the old capital city of Japan, is very cultural. It is featured by many ancient temples. It is perhaps invidious to single out any particular ones among them, but there are some which have achieved, for various reasons, particular fame. Kinkakuji, or the Golden Pavilion, is chief among them.

The Gold-plated temple is situated in the northwest of the city. Interestingly, three different architectural styles were combined together to produce this tourist-attraction piece of art. The first floor is constructed in a palatial style; the second is a samurai house, like a temple hall and the third is austere, bare 'Zen Temple' with a statues of the Buddha of the Pure Land. Only the second and the third floors are covered with gold-leaf. The roof, upon which the Chinese phoenix settles, is thatched with shingles.

Recently, the coating of Japanese lacquer was found a little decayed and a new coating, as well as gilding with gold-leaf, much thicker than the original ones, was given to the building and was completed in 1987.

The Golden Pavilion, inscribed as World Cultural Heritage in 1994, sits

on the edge of a lake dotted with islets and surrounded by woodland.

#### Religion

Many Japanese are Buddhists. It was in 538 or 552 that when Buddhism was brought to Japan via Korea. In 741 provincial temples began to be constructed. However, today there is a verity of other religions which have the freedom to be practiced.

As far as Islam is concerned, there is no satisfactory information about the

exact number of the emergence of Islam in Japan. However, available information say the first Japanese Muslim converted into Islam in 1890 on the hands of a British Muslim in Istanbul.

It is a fact that Japan is a hard land for Islamic penetration through conventional process of preaching. Apart from the deep- Modern Trading Centers rooted local Shinto reli- in Tokyo gion, there are strong

imported religions such as Buddhism and Christianity, and also some new local religions. Added to them are imitation of western material civilization, atheism, non-religionism, or even antireligionism- all of which make it difficult for the penetration of Islam.

Among the host of religions available in Japan, it is very interesting to feel how much religious tolerance is here. "We have parties and festivals together with the Buddhists and Christians. We even call for Muslim prayers at their presence, said Fadhlullah A. Nakamichi, Acting Chairman and Director of Publication of Islamic

The Islamic Center was established in Tokyo in 1975 by the efforts of Muslim students who came to study in Japan. It

introduces Islam, translates Islamic books from Arabic into Japanese, etc. More than 40 books have been translated into Japanese. These are distributed free of charge to those interested in Islam. Dr. Fadhlullah said that these books were much more demanded by Japanese living abroad.

The first book to be translated was 'The Principles of Islam' by Abu Al-Alaa Al-Mawdudi. Presently, the center is translating 'Riadh Al-Salehin' one of the major and most trusted Islamic references. Its translator, Ashraf Yasui, a Japanese Muslim has translated many Islamic books into Japanese and has set Arabic language courses for Japanese. According to Dr. Fadhlullah, 3-10 Japanese become Muslims every

#### The Way of Tea (Chado)

The tea ceremony is the ritualized preparation and serving of powdered green tea in the presence of guests. It is a discipline nurtured and refined by the Japanese since the fifteen century.

When tea was first brought to Japan it was used as medicine. Then it came to be drunk for the enjoyment of its fla-

Tea houses are built in a special way. Doors are a bit low so that everyone bows when entering as a sign of equality of people. Each room is very simply designed. No decoration is there. In one corner of each room there is a scroll and a flower in a vase. Although any tea school is surrounded by a wellattended garden no flowers are grown

> there. The reason is not to distract the visitor's attention from the single charming flower placed in each room.

Owing to the lack of decoration, participants become more aware of details and are awakened to the simple beauty around them and to themselves. The entrance is designed to remaind them that all are equal.


selves of the "dust" of the everyday world outside the tearoom. The room is always bare, maybe to help keep it clean and tidy.

Religions mainly the Shinto, seem to have greatly influenced the Way of Tea philosophy, specially in the way nature is treated. The emphasis on purity and cleanliness also probably derives from a religious belief that true and natural beauty is not revealed if covered with impurity.

The underlying philosophy of the Way of Tea is a rich and unique synthesis of Oriental cultural and religious traditions. Its four principles are summarized as Harmony, Respect, Purity, and Tranquility. Constantly practicing these principles is believed to increase one's spiritual awareness and help one find inner peace.

Today, chado continues to be a vital part of Japanese society and culture. Its presence can be discerned in the Japanese language, contemporary architecture, and the continuing traditions of the fine and applied arts, as well as much of the etiquette that surrounds social interaction. Many tea masters believe that the Way of Tea can be a foundation of the way of life; that the peacefulness of a bowl of tea can be shared with anyone, and through this sharing all people can one day live in a world of peace.

# **Al-Hadi Mosque:**

# **Distinguished Islamic Architecture**

unique architectural attraction in Sa'ada City to the north of Yemen. The city was founded by Yahva bin al-Hussain bin al-Kasem who is also the founder of the Ziyadid Dynasty in

The mosque was established late at the end of the third century of Hejira, when al-Imam al-Hadi saw, according to some historians, at one night a light twinkling at that place, in the center of

Al-Hadi lived in the old city of Sa'ada located below Telmass mountain.

he al-Hadi mosque is a However, he passed away before finalizing the mosque. The size of the mosque at the time was stretching from al-Hadi's doom in the south and to Ahmed bin Kasem's doom in the east. The mosque extracted different styles from all the Islamic architecture for its walls which have never undergone renovation that deforms its traditional peculiarities. Near to the mosque, door-to-door rooms were built, called mash-had, in which the Imam Hadi bin al-Kasem was laid to rest. The other mash-hads contain the bodies of other Ziyadid clerics like Mahdi Ali bin Mohammed and Ali bin Ahmed al-

Some parts of the mosque were renovated by Imam al-Mahdi who expanded the mosque when he settled in Sa'ada between 751 to 753.

The mosque contains beautiful decorations and engravings. Corners of the mosque were often used for settling people's disputes and as courts during the reign of Kasimid dynasty.

Imam al-Mahdi is considered to be one of the most important Ziyadid Imams in Yemen. He started preaching his religious madhab (doctrine) in the city of Thula. After that he conquered Sana'a and captured Sa'ada and

Dhamar.

As for the ancient water basins, they were established by Judge Abdullah al-Durari Hassan according to instructions by al-Mahdi Ali bin Mohammed. New water closets were built in these places. A library was set up in the second floor. A big water tank for drinking still exist up to our very day. Similarly, a well was dug up in the eastern side of the mosque to provide it and the nearby areas with water. However, it frequently breaks down because the government pays no attention to it.

The Imam al-Hadi mosque is an Islamic university based on clear strong bases of clear thought and jurisprudence. Many scholars and intellectuals have graduated from this university. Graduates of the mosque have good knowledge of the Holy Quran, its sciences, Hadiths Prophet Mohammed's traditions) and faith and fundamentals. jurisprudence and Arabic language and its arts, etc.

The university was established in 1354 Hejira according to instructions by Imam Ahmed Hamid al-Din and Judge Ahmed Abdulwasa'a Wase'ee was appointed as director.

# Ahmad Ubad al-Huseini: The Poet & The Fedayee

ince the 1940s, a cluster of poets and singers has enriched the Yemeni songs driving them to the stage of popularity. Ahmad Ubad al-Huseini was one of those who contributed a lot to the development and enrichment of Yemeni songs, particularly in the southern governorates of the country.

Al-Huseini was born in 1944 in al-Hawttah village of Lahj. He was educated by his father, a learned sheikh, before he joined the school in al-Hawttah.

Since he was a child, it was noticed that al-Huseini did not mix a lot with children at his age to play or to spend his free time. His tendency to sit with people older then him and his love for reading and poetry made people describe his mind as bigger than his age. As he grew up, he amazed people more by his ability to compose high quality poems. He studied standard Arabic and history and became a reference in these fields for his colleagues. It can be said that the rich library of his father, was the source that he got the first streams of knowledge from. It was said that his father was keen on making his son following his father's footsteps. He ensured that his son got knowledge from many sources before he gave him the freedom to choose what suited him for his future career. Al-Huseini joined the preparatory school which was the highest level of school study at the time. After that he worked as a teacher, a job that was highly respected.

The first singers to sing al-Huseini poems were Salah Nasser Kurd and Faisal Alawi. The three formed a team working in sweet harmony. Then many

others, especially in Lahj, started to sing his songs.

When the organized resistance against the British colonization started to emerge, al-Huseini stopped writing and advocated his time to fighting the occupiers. Like many other intellectuals, he fought with a gun and a pen. Besides being a founder of the National Front in Lahj, he published the Laborer's Voice newspaper which he was running by his own.

Al-Huseini also wrote a number of dramas. One of his well-known works for the stage was 'Fedayee No. 13' which depicted the Yemenis struggle to get rid of the British colonization.

After the South of Yemen got its independence in 1967, al-Huseini held a number of government posts until he passed away on April 23, 1969.

# Tales of Ali bin Zaid's **Proverbs**

o one can ignore the name of Ali bin Zaid, the most famous wise man in Yemen, the epic hero of philosophy and proverbs whose wisdom and proverbs dance over tongues of millions of Yemenis all over Yemen through the last generations. But most of them ignore the tales behind his proverbs. Let's throw light on five tales that exploded his talent.

#### The tale of poverty and his wives:

In a year of famine in which the whole region suffered from poverty, Ali bin Zaid wanted to examine his three wives' patience. He pretended to leave the house. But he took cover in a hiding place under the stairs so that he could hear their speech during his supposed absence. They interpreted his delay with disgraceful reasons. Hababah, the first one said: "He went to steal sheep or flour and that would take time till people sleep." Fendeh, the second one, added "A theft took place in the village by an unknown man led to death. People gathered to swear to prove their innocence. Sara'h the third one declared that she saw him in the morning talking to a woman near a well and that he must have promised to meet her at night.

Having listened to his three wives, he slipped away pretending to have come from outside. He entered without food or sheep. On the day after he went to the farm and later, one of his wives brought him food. As she came nearer she heard him reciting a couplet.

> يقول علي ولد زايد من عادة الفقر الإخلاف أمسيت من فقر ليلة زانى وسارق وحلاف

Which means: Ali bin Zaid says, poverty brings family problems and because of it I was considered adulterer, thief and swearer.

Tales of two swallows: Mua'jaba and Jubran were swallows. that Ali's calves became oxen and the

Mua'jaba was always lazy that she picked some seeds during harvesting. A few days later she found nothing to eat, so she went to Jubran and begged for some but he refused asking her, "Where have you been when their was much seeds in threshing-floor. Go and learn how to save seeds for hard days?" Here Ali bin Zaid blames laziness showing its bad results. He composed his wisdom in a form of couplet dialogue between them:

> قالت (عجيبة) ربني يا (جبران) قال كانش حضرتي حل زيط الأرهان قالت: زوجي مطحل والعيال رمدان قال اصبري حتى يجيش علاًن

Though this is a story of birds it metaphorically refers to a woman whose husband was sick with spleen and children with opthalmia. Such disease were common in summer; the season of flies that cause opthalmia and drinking unclean water causes swelling. This couplet is still sung while ploughing and sowing.

## The tales of the sad tone of Muhiad:

Once Ali bin Zaid sold his ox to buy two calves so that they later be oxen. But the calves died, and he borrowed money to buy an ox. On his way he was attacked by a gang which robbed him of his money. When he came back home he found that his wife had left the house angrily because of a silly quarrel with the other wife. Being depressed, he climbed a mountain and recited this couplet with his beautiful sad voice:

> يقول ابو (سعد) ياغبنه ثلاثة غبون الغبن الأول لمن جارت عليه الديون وغبن ثاني لمن قلت رجاله يهون وغبن ثالث لمن فارق كحيل العيون

Which means: what a pity! Abu Sa'ad is suffering from debts, weakness because of no supporters and a desert-

After hearing that Mehiad, villagers gathered and sent two oxen to his house. Next they sent three wise men to his wife's father to get her back to his house without his (Ali's) notice. Later, his wife went to the mountain to collect firewood and told him she was not saying the truth. She told him she visited her father after he had told her

dead ones were his neighbors' and that her brother had found the calves without knowing the owner; therefore he had kept them for eight months. Her mother recognized them as Ali's by signs on their foreheads.

Finally he got back every thing because of his beautiful voice and wis-

#### The tale of the buried treasure:

One night Ali was sleeping when an imaginary voice called him, "Your fortune is under a rock in Rickbet Hadher (a place). Guessing that he was leaving, his wife exclaimed "Where are you going in such time?" "To a fortune," he answered, "Give me my cane, wolves are on may way."

When he got to the exact place he dug a little and found a heap of burnt charcoal. When he told his wives his mother shouted "You've divulged your secret so your find turned black." He came out with a fact that one should keep his secrets otherwise he would be disappointed then said the following proverb:

يقول علي بن زايد

which means: he who divulges his night dream should bear his misfortune and his find will be black.

## The tales of his daughter, Bedra

Bedra fell in love with a young man and eloped with him from Menketh village. The news spread and that brought shame to the father. Ali asked women of Menketh to stop gossiping promising them to cut off her head as he knew her hideout saying:

which means: "O white women of Menketh, stop gossiping, I swear you will see Bedra's head cut off. I heard people saying she lunched in Meitem and spent the night in Oudeina (anoth-

# Charitable Societies' Arduous Task

ssociations and civil society organizations in the last decade. The different missions car ried out by these organizations and societies concrete solidarity amongst members of the society and strengthen the democratic process, as well. Chairman of the society, Sheikh Mukhtar Saleh al-Wosabi, said, "Our society has constructed a number of classrooms with the view of providing students with extracurricular courses both in the mornings and at nights. Special classes for teaching the Holy Quran have been also given particular attention within these courses. A great deal of school-bags were also distributed for the needy students." He added that some of the major activities of the society had been sponsoring 150 orphans and providing poor families

with Eid's necessities. The society also set up 6 classsubstantially increased rooms for teaching illiterate people in the community.

> Dr. Abdulbari Dughaish, Secretary-General of the Society pointed out that the society would set up classes on sewing principally for unemployed women. He added that the society aimed at providing the local community there with educa-

tional and healthcare services through covering the charges of some medical surgeries and free medicaments especially for patient with dangerous diseases like cancers, heart diseases and diabetes. "A clinic which will provide around the clock and free of charge treatment for all patients of the community will be opened soon, as well," Dr. Abdulbari Dughaish announced.

The society has reached an agreement with the Electricity Corporation to provide the eastern part of Dar Sa'ad district with electricity supply, particularly as this area is till this very day


deprived of this essential service. addition, new classrooms for eradicating female illiteracv are scheduled to be inaugurated in the near future. As far as the society is concerned, the headquarters of the society will be final-





ized soon and all sewing workshops will be equipped.

Dr. Abdulah al-Dughaish expressed the society's hope to embark on building the medical clinic soon so as to start rendering health services to the patients of the society who are in a bad need for such services. # LEARNING STYLES AND STRATEGIES (3)

# How Long Should you Study?

here are usually two types of students: one, the diligent or perseverant type. Second, those who are characterized by a more or less casual attitude to studies. The first category of students are very serious about their academic achievement and work very hard to attain their goals, while for the second category of students studies takes the backseat. They tend to give priority to other things like socializing or TV viewings.

It may seem that those who spend long hours at the study table are naturally and inevitably high achievers and the ones who devote less time to their lessons are necessarily low achievers. This, indeed, is a misconception or a myth. As it is said "Stone walls do not a prison make, nor iron bars a cage", spending a lot of time is not a guarantee to produce the desired results and vice

The question is how intelligently or in how systematic and planned a manner one is going about it. One hour's concentrated study is likely to be more productive and effective than hours of inattentive, unsystematic effort.

How long should one study is therefore a question the answer to which varies from one individual student to another. It depends on one's attitude, motivation and level of commitment. Remember that you don't have to study for hours at a time to be effective. The magic potion is consistency or regularity. 'Slow and steady wins the race'. Fix up a regular study hour and stick to it. You should decide your schedule for other activities in relation to your study hour and try and not violate this time slot frequently. Focussed or intensive study is necessary to get to grips with your lessons. But if you sit down to make intensive study for long duration, it is likely to affect efficiency. On the other hand regular breaks between intensive study sessions would help you to relax yourself and stay on the task in a focussed manner. So don't forget to take breaks from intensive study sessions. In general, you should try to schedule study times of one to two hours. When you notice that you are beginning to feel bored, distracted, or tired, don't hesitate to take a break. Allow yourself 10-15 minutes to stretch, walk around, take a deep breath, talk to your friends or family members, or watch TV.

Those of you who find it difficult to concentrate on studies, don't feel disappointed. Try slowly to put your mind to the lessons for a short time and gradually increase the time

For example, in the beginning set a time limit of 30 minutes study for that length of time, take a 10-minute break, and then go back to your studies. You'll be surprised how refreshed you feel after just a quick break to increase your concentration.

Each student is a unique individual with a set of skills and strategies different from others. Obviously, each student is different in terms of how long he or she can follow information in a text and internalize that information. As such, you are the best judge to decide for yourself the best time suitable and the amount of time that is appropriate for you to devote to study.

Any lesson is a part of your continuing effort to gather useful information. So there is an essential link between lessons. Therefore, it is useful at the end of each study time to take a few minutes to plan your next session. If you do this, you will know when you begin to study, where you ended and what you have to do next. Suppose you studied today and for the next two days couldn't manage time to study. In such situations, making a list of things to do in your next study session would remind you of your previous lesson and help you to be in control of the next stage of the lesson. In this way you can save a lot of time. Learn to make use of a daily planner or appointment book available in most bookstores to make a list of things to be done everyday including the lessons to prepare. That would be a valuable help to plan your time in the best possible Happy Studying!





# Functional Structure of the Human Entity

#### Introduction

It is a matter of utmost importance to all Muslims in general and the enlightened scholars in Yemen and all the Islamic world in particular to ratify the necessity of basically reviving Islamic thinking and modernizing the Arab Islamic mind and its conceptual abilities. The dominant and prevailing understanding and perceptions need to be drastically revised and renewed.

The necessity for Islamic revival was sorted out and called for in the last decades of the last century by many Muslim scholars on top of whom was the revolutionary Arab Islamic thinker and philosopher Ustaz Mahmoud Mohammed Taha who formulated a complete new Islamic school of thoughts. He warned that the prevailing traditional Islamic concepts carry the seeds of aggression and violence and can only produce suffering and misery to Muslims and all the world. Unfortunately, he was one of victims of its grapes of wrath as he was assassinated by the traditional reactionary Islamists for his opinions and was brutally hanged in Sudan on January 18,

The necessity increased to its utmost heights after the sad events of 11 September 2001. Its demands are expanding to concern all mankind since it has revealed that the one human family regardless of all differences and variations is on the same shipcraft of the Earth. The Holy Quranic scriptures remain stable and eternal, they are the true words of God. They are unchangeable. But their meanings are infinite. What is fluctuating is the finite understanding of human beings that is changeable according to time and place.

I have developed a methodology called Cybernetics as per the three dimensional readings in time and place. The three dimensions meant are the Holy Ouranic Scripture, the cosmos (as revealed by the discoveries of science) and the Human psyche. All prophets of God, Abraham, Jesus, Mosses,

Mohammed, peace upon them, refer to this methodology in different terminology but in the same meaning. Prophet Mohammed, peace upon him, and the Holy Quran call for that: "And on Earth there are signs [of God's existence and wisdom visible] to all who are endowed with inner certainty (20) just as [There are signs thereof] within your own selves. Can you not then see (21)" verses 20-21 Surrah ADH-DHARIYAT no. 51.

Based upon this methodology I have formulated my new personality theory called the Human Optimum Psyche (HOPe) in an attempt to define the normal human state and personality, which I shall reveal and discuss in a series of articles already written in my book 'The Human Phenomena' under print. Since the methodology and the HOPe theory represent an endeavor for Islamic revival rather than a specialized academic doctrine, it actually presents a contemporaneous understanding of the Holy Quranic scripture. For that I hope to help the modern Muslims and all humans understand the nature of existence, the cosmos, the human psyche, the religion and their role in life. It presents the reality of the noble constructive peaceful Islamic religion to the whole world. I call on all humans to respect one another and operate under the umbrella of the modern common values that all wise men and women have decided to adopt, on top of that are the vital values of:

- Human rights
- Freedom
- Justice Democracy
- Peaceful coexistence

I believe that Islam message is to implement these peaceful values in the international community. I have presented this cybernetics epistemological methodology and the HOPe theory for panel discussions in the early 1990s making use of the local habitual daily Qat sessions which include all types of opinions and trends, all the rainbow of Yemeni elites: nationalists, Islamists socialists and internationals.

I have to acknowledge and gratefully

thank all good friends who have spared some of their precious time to discuss the essentials of the idea. No doubt, they have helped in the maturation of both the cybernetics epistemological methodology and the HOPe doctrine.

On top of those are three Yemeni elites and Arab Islamic scholars: Dr. Farag bin Ghanim, the former popular prime minister, Dr. Gasim Salam, member of the al-Shura Council together with the Sana'a Arab Islamic forum he patronages and brother Ustaz Abdul-Hameed Al-Hadi, member of the al-Shura Council along with his Wednesday Yemeni Cultural Forum and all the patient participants of these fora.

## **Definition of HOPe:**

HOPe, the human optimum psyche is defined as: "the highest level of integrity of optimum (normal) psycho biochemical functions characterized by serenity and positive feelings of satisfaction, security, harmony and peace, together with the absence of the main four negative psychological feelings: fear (anxiety), sadness (depression), aggression (enmity), and paranoia (irrational, pathological, delusion of

So HOPe is the healthiest psychological and physical state ideal to the human entity. It qualifies the human being and renders him capable of achieving the best and integrated functions, both lower physical vegetative and reproductive functions and the higher known seven psycho social functions (mentioned hereafter).

This state targets at providing a balanced optimum intrapsychic environment guarded by harmony, serenity and self confidence. This is important and necessary to transmit stabilized peace and to initiate constructive expressions towards all the components of the external environment. This, in tern, is expressed as good feelings (of acceptance and love,) and generous behavior addressed towards all human brethren regardless of their religions, races, cul-

## The seven higher human psychological functions:

The human entity has a wide range of properties and functions. It has the properties and functions of all creatures on earth ranging from the atoms and non living elements to the plants and animals both vegetative and reproductive. It has its own characteristics, as well. These are called the higher psychological human functions.

These higher functions are seven, which we will abbreviate here hoping to discuss them in detail in the future. They are summarized as follows:

1- Perception- both sensory and extrasensory perceptions.

2- Apprehension-both mental and emotional apprehensions.

3- Thinking- with all its sub-categories such as memory, problem solving thinking and intuitive or creative thinking etc.

4- Emotions- including the different mood aspects.

5-Volition (will power.)

6- Behavior- including all its components such as motives and goal direc-

7- Consciousness- this is the summation of all physical and psychological activities, properties and functions. It is divided into three main categorical lev-

- a) Self Consciousness,
- b) Cosmic Consciousness, and c) Gods Consciousness.

The point of maturity and convergence of these three levels of consciousness is the proper reality of ideal human life or Hayat (life) as described by the Holy Our'an. This is attained by a tone of continued awareness of God that is achieved through worshipping Him and responding to His call and the Apostle's instructions:



Today, Okunoshima Island has been developed as a National Vacation Village and has become a public health resort. There are very few reminders of the past except a gun platform, electricity generating station and a poison



# **Bracing for the worst**

# N-PAKISTANI WAR

NEW DELHI\_ The Indian Army is preparing to conduct its "biggest" exercise in 15 years in the Rajasthan desert and the plains of Punjab in the northwestern part of the country, the Press Trust of India (PTI) reported on Saturday.

The exercise, due to begin in early next year, will help evaluate India's defense capability in the event of a nuclear attack by Pakistan, the PTI quoted defense sources as saving.

Troops and defense equipment are being brought near the western borders by special trains and private trucks, while antinuke attack units equipped with radiationproof uniforms and special weapons are also being deployed in desert areas, the sources added.

It would be the first time that these newly-created units which they said can repulse a nuclear attack would be exhibiting their might in the exercises, the

Troops from all the corps of the Army would participate in the exercise, and senior army officials would also be assessing their strategies in mock battles, the PTI

The announcement of the exercise plan assumes significance in view of the recent escalation of tension along the India-Pakistan border. In the past couple of weeks following the December 13 terrorist



attack on the Indian Parliament, both sides have reportedly made their largest military build-up in 30 years in the border areas. Meanwhile Pakistan foreign minister Abdul Sattar said in a press conference in Islamabad Saturday that Pakistan does not seek any war-local or general, conventional or nuclear- it is for peace and for adherence to the norms of peaceful co-existence



and the principles incorporated in the charter of the United Nations. On his part Indian prime minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee on Saturday said that his country would do its utmost to avoid a war with Pakistan, but asked the people to be " prepared to face any eventuality. "

# Arafat, Powell **Hold Phone Talks** on Violence

GAZA Palestinian leader Yasser Arafat and U.S. Secretary of state Colin Powell discussed on telephon late Friday the decrease of violence and the resumption of peace negotiations with Israel, a senior Palestinian official said on Saturday. Nabil Abu Rudeineh, a top aide to Arafat, said that Powell spoke first with Arafat and told him that the decrease of violence between the Palestinians and Israelis would be a good gesture to resume the peace talks. Abu Rudeineh told Palestinian radio "Voice of Palestine" that Powell promised to continue urging the Israeli government to ease security and military restrictions imposed on the Palestinian territories for about 15 months. Meanwhile, Israeli radio reported that Powell had also spoke with Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon, without giving details of the phone talks. Palestinian National Authority (PNA) cabinet Friday appealed to the U.S. to send U.S. Mideast peace envoy General Anthony Zinni back to the region to start the immediate implementation of (George) Tenet's plan and Mitchell report recommendation. "The leadership is ready to send a security and a political team to Washington to explain the positions and measures taken by the Palestinian side," said a statement issued after the PNA cabinet meeting chaired by Arafat in the West Bank city of Ramallah. It is reported that a U.S. State Department official indicated earlier that Zinni would return to the region when conditions were appropriate, but noted that at the moment there were no concrete plans for the envoy's return. On December 16, Arafat called for an end to militant attacks on Israel, but Israel said that Arafat had not cracked down strongly enough on groups behind a series of suicide bombing attacks in Israel, which claimed lives dozens of Israelis. The PNA security forces had declared a state of emergency, closed down more than 30 institutions belong to Islamic Resistance Movement (Hamas) and Islamic Jihad (Holy War), and arrested more than 200 members of the two organizations

# Over 1.6 Million Iragis **Die of Sanctions**

in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip. Xinhua

BAGHDAD\_ Iraq on Saturday informed the United Nations Sanctions Committee that a total of 1,614,303 people had died due to the stringent U.N. sanctions on the country since 1990.

In a letter to the U.N. committee, Man'm al-Oadi, Irag's interimcharge d'affaires in the U.N., said that the colossal human losses, 667,773 of them are children under the age of five, the official Iraqi News Agency (INA) reported.

In sharp contrast, the report said there were only 258 recorded deaths of children under five in 1989, one year before the sanctions were imposed on Iraq. The letter slammed the "arbitrary" practices of the U.N.

committee by suspending Iraq's contracts signed with other countries to import food, medicine and other essentials within the framework of the U.N. oil-for-food program since 1996.

Iraq has often criticized the program for failing to meets the humanitarian needs of its people and complained that the severe shortage of food and medicine has contributed to the sharp increase of mortality rate of its people.

Iraq has been under sweeping U.N. sanctions since its August 1990 invasion of Kuwait.

# 1. 20,000 People Die in Violent Earthquake in

A wild earthquake measuring 7.9 on the Richer scale jolted Gujarat of India on January 26, killing at least 20,000 people and injuring 167,000 others. The earthquake severely destroyed the infrastructure of the disaster area, demolished lots of villages and towns and caused a total economic loss of more than 2.1 billion U.S. dollars. This is the strongest quake in India since the 8-magnitude earthquake in 1950.

### 2. Human Genome Sequence Revealed

The human genome sequence and the preliminary analysis result were revealed on February 12 jointly by scientists from China, Japan, Germany, France, Britain, and the United States, and Celera Genomics, a U.S. company. The human genome was proved to contain some 30,000 to 40,000 genes consisting of 3.2 billion alkali base pairs. This was another major step in exploring the mystery inside the human being. It was estimated that the work of mapping the entire human genome can be finished by the year

3. Israeli-Palestinian Conflict Severely Escalates Since Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon took office on March 7, his government has pursued a series of




ough policies which have aroused intense resent ment from the Palestinians. Some radical Palestinian military factions carried out bombing attacks at Israelis. In retaliation, Israel resorted to force by launching targeted killings, bombing Palestinian security offices, and invading Palestinian-ruled cities. The conflict has escalated to a situation unprecedented in the past decade. On December 3, the Israeli cabinet accused the Palestinian National Authority (PNA) led by Yasser Arafat as an entity supporting terrorism and then cut relations with Arafat. The Middle East peace process is currently going through a crucial period.

# 4. 0AU Transformed into AU

The 37th summit of the Organization of African Unity (OAU) held in Lusaka, Zambia, on July 9-11 ratified the transformation of the 38-year-old OAU into the African Union (AU). The 53-member AU is expected to be more capable of resolving major political, economic and social issues faced by the African continent, and of coping with globalization. This was the last meeting of leaders from the OAU members, which marked the start of the one-year transitional period from the OAU to the AU.

#### BEIJING\_ The following are the top 10 world news 5. September 11 Terror Attacks in the United States

On September 11, two hijacked American airliners plowed into the twin towers of the World Trade Center in New York which collapsed successively, and one crashed into the Pentagon in Washington D.C. Relevant U.S. authorities announced that more than 3,200 people were killed or missing as a result



of the terror attacks, and that the economic loss, direct or indirect, reached hundreds of billions of dollars. The September 11 terror attacks have been the most carefully planned in the world and aroused shock and strong condemnation by the international community.

# 6. Afghan Taliban Regime Collapses

Maintaining that Saudi-born militant Osama bin Laden, then sheltered in Afghanistan and protected by the Taliban, masterminded the September 11 terror attacks, the U.S. government launched largescale military strikes on Afghanistan as of October 7.



Meanwhile, the Afghan Northern Alliance launched counteroffensive against the Taliban militia. The Taliban gave up resistance completely in early December. Representatives of four Afghan groups reached an agreement in Bonn, Germany, on December 5 to establish an interim administration. The interim government headed by Hamid Karzai was sworn in on December 22.

# 7. Successful APEC Summit Held in Shanghai



On October 20-21, the ninth informal meeting of leaders from the 21 Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) members was successfully held in Shanghai, China. Chinese President Jiang Zemin chaired the meeting, delivered an important speech and had meetings with leaders present at the conference. During the meeting, leaders of APEC members, focusing on "Meeting new challenges in the new century; Achieving common prosperity through participation and cooperation," had an in-depth exchange of views on the current world economic situation, human capacity building and future development of APEC, reached a broad consensus and issued a declaration and the Shanghai Accord.

#### 8. China's Entry into WTO

The legal document on China's accession to the World Trade Organization (WTO) was unanimously adopted on November 10 during the fourth WTO ministerial meeting in Doha, Qatar. On December 11, China officially became the 143rd full member of the organization. During the meeting, representatives of the 142 WTO members, after negotiations on the topics and objectives of a new round of trade talks, passed a ministerial declaration and agreed to start a new round of multilateral trade talks.

#### 9. The United States Unilaterally Withdraws from the Anti-ballistic Missile Treaty

U.S. President George W. Bush announced on December 13 the decision to withdraw from the 1972 Anti-ballistic Missile Treaty, which immediately met strong criticism from the international community. Russian President Vladimir Putin said that Bush's decision was "a mistake." Many other leaders and international analysts held that the withdrawal cleared the way for the United States to deploy the National Missile Defense System and further estab lished the U.S. as the biggest nuclear power. However, it undermined the process of international disarmament and would lead to a new round of arm. race. The U.S. withdrawal from the ABM also severely damages the foundation of international security and strategic stability, and will bring unexpected effect on the future world order.

# 10. World Economic Slowdown

Since the beginning of this year, a most serious economic slowdown in 20 years has occurred in most areas of the world. The U.S. economy started recession in March; affected by the U.S. economic fallout, the 15-member European Union underwent a sharp economic contraction; the Japanese economexperienced a further deterioration; the Asian economy, which was on recovery from the 1996 financi. crisis, also slowed its pace of growth; and Latin American economy plunged into difficulty, with political disturbance breaking out in Argentin owing to the country's economic crisis at the end of the year. The September 11 attacks not only dealt a blow on the U.S. economy, but also severely affected the economies in other parts of the world. The International Monetary Fund estimated that the world economy would grow by only 2.4 percent that year, 2.3 percentage points lower than last year.
