The government of Yemen again requested the British government to extradite Mustafa of Ansar Al-Shariah Group based in London. Yemen accuses him of inciting terrorist attacks in the country. Official sources confirmed this request to Britain, asking for the trial of Abu Al-Hamzah before a Yemeni court for involvement in terrorist acts in Yemen during the last few years. The sources said Yemen now has enough evidence to prove his connection to these acts, such as the kidnapping incident of 16 tourists in Abyan in which three Brits and an Australian were killed. 



USA Mourns USS Cole Victims

Dreaming of the State of Law and Order

n every passing day, I look up to the sky with hope that Yemen will someday become a state of law and order. I have tried with my pen and newspaper to bring this issue into focus: Yemen cannot develop unless law and order are enforced. That is the limit to what I can do in this cause. Besides, I can only hope. We have suffered from lawlessness for too long. We are sensing the pain that has been inflicted on the public after years of neg-

lect and disrespect to the laws of the country. Thousands of laws and regulations are destined to stay on paper without implement tation on the ground for tens of years.

No one can deny that this has led to corruption in public funds, injustice in national courts, and despair in the Yemeni people What are we waiting for? Why are we waiting?

Mighty, rich, and influential people in the country have been exempted from almost all rules currently applied to the poor and weak. Injustice, evident everywhere you go, reflects the need to look back and see where we were wrong. Why have the Yemeni people become so poor, so illiterate, and so abandoned in a time citizens of the First World are in luxury? What is it that we are missing? Is it the natural resources, the labor, or the will? Or are we just missing the point?

As the Five-Year Plan was discussed on TV, I saw a poor beggar in the street watching the TV with a look of desperation. He said: This is what they have been doing for years. Talking, talking, and talking. I know that they will do nothing to improve our life standards, but I pray to God that they will not devastate us further." Just a few weeks ago I wrote in this very column about the incident of the traffic officer who couldn't stop an armed tribal gang in the street and ask them about their car's plate. Today, I can see the very same traffic officer still unable to fulfill his job. He still cannot enforce the law on this powerful tribal sheikh.

Amid the efforts to combat global terrorism, Yemen continues to fail to enforce the simplest rules and regulations. We continue to live in a country that has no control over the problem of weapons and no control over tribesmen. We cannot deny this fact, but instead we should work with others to bring an end to such phenomena.

Until the day when laws are enforced on all people, strong and weak, civil or tribal, and poor and rich, I will continue to dream of the day Yemen becomes a state of law and order.

Yemen Renews Demand of Extraditing Abu Al-Hamza'a

The British Ambassador to Yemen, Ms. Frances Guy, in an interview that the Yemen Times published in the beginning of this month, said the Yemeni government requested the extradition of Abu Al-Hamza'a some months ago. "The answer is that he is a British citizen, and we have no extradition treaty with Yemen," she observed. She said they encouraged the Yemeni authorities to give them as much information as possible about Abu Al-Hamza'a so that they can deal with him in Britain in light of the new anti-terrorism legislation issued last February. "We have some information, but unfortunately, not enough to arrest him," she noted, adding, "We have attempted to find a case against him that will stand up in an English court, but we have been unable to do

When the request of Yemen was first refused, Yemen suggested that Abu Al-Hamza'a be tried in Britain, but with no response. They previously offered London extradition of their prisoners in Aden, who would spend their the rest of their sentence in British prisons in return for the extradition of Abu-Al-Aamza'a to the Yemeni authorities. But to no avail!

This is why the Yemeni government has not responded to the appeal message relating to the release of the British prisoners in Aden. The appeal letter was officially sent to the Yemeni government last year, yet, the British ambassador confirmed, "There has been no official response to it."

The Yemeni-British relationship has been greatly affected by the Abyan terrorist incident. However, since last year there have been intensive efforts on both sides to bridge the gap and start on a new foot.

The Minister said the Aden-Abyan Military Army was no longer existing, pointing out that it was there during a particular time with a terrorist purpose against Yemen, but it was stormed out during the Abyan fiasco that killed four foreign tourists Some of its militants have been detained and produced before justice. > However, this statement couldn't provoke any feelings of hostility against the USA. Even the official media neglected it completely and not much attention has been paid to it. This is because the Yemeni authority seems not to object the military strikes that the USA is carrying out against Afghanistan

To this end, President Ali Abdullah Saleh and the Vice President met last Wednesday with religious scholars. leaders of political parties, parliamentarians and social dignitaries. The meeting concerned the current situation in the world in light of the attacks against the USA. The participants stressed that civilians in Afghanistan should not be hit, increasing their ever-lasting pain. They emphasized on the necessity of differentiating between terrorism and nations' struggle for freedom, independence and resisting of occupiers. Terrorism should not be also associated with any religion or nation. They also said the fight against terrorism should have limited targets and not be left open.

President Saleh reconfirmed Yemen's condemnation of terrorism, pointing out that Yemen is a victim of this infamy. The President said we need patience and wisdom in order to cure this epidemic, giving no chance for perpetrators of terrorism to incite conflicts and hostility between religions, cultures or human civilizations. He said all people share in undertaking this responsibility. He further stressed that having a fair and just solution to the Palestinian issue, enabling the Palestinians to establish their state with al-Quds as their capital, will further peace and stability in the region and the world at large. The president told the participants that it was very necessary that all people join hands and unite, serving the higher interests of Yemen.

The official media, on their part, continued to stress the clear-cut stands of Yemen towards terrorism and the need to fight it worldwide through the UN.


The release urged on the two parties to observe self-control and stop the counter media campaigns prior to the ruling of the court.

The Minister didn't comment on the arrest of bin Laden's father-in-law, Ahmad Abdulfattah Assadah, who was reportedly arrested in lbb. Reports say he married his daughter to bin Laden over one year ago. He have already been detained, but reports say he denied marrying his daughter to bin Laden. He said his daughter is married to a person who is studying in Pakistan.

In response to the American strikes against Taliban. scores of students at Hajjah College of Education staged a demonstration last Thursday to protest the US and British attacks against Afghanistan. However, the police intervened and stopped the protesters, detaining four of them. The detainees belong to the Nasserite Unionist Party, including the secretary of the party in Hajjah.

During Friday prayers, preachers' sermons condemned the US strikes against Afghanistan and called for resisting collaborating with the USA and its allies. They considered the strikes as a Crusade against Muslims everywhere. They recalled the sufferings of the Palestinian people who are being slaughtered by the Israeli military forces on a daily basis. However, no demonstrations were staged in any of the Yemeni cities. Nonetheless, stiff security measures have been taken around the US and UK embassies in Sana'a. Western citizens have been advised to take stiff security measures and to be on high alert. Moreover, it has been reported that some of these people have left Yemen for their respective countries

Around 172 religious scholars issued a religious fatwa discouraging any cooperation with the USA and its alliance in their war against Afghanistan. They called all Muslims to stand by the Afghan people in their plight. The scholars said in a press release that facilitating the war of the USA against Afghanistan is a big conspiracy, and asked Muslims to support Afghans morally, financially and through prayers. Yemeni scholars demanded that Arab and Muslim leaders do not follow the USA blindly in its war and that terrorism should be spelt out clearly, with consideration to the Israeli atrocities in the Palestinian territories which have been supported by the USA. They also pointed out that the word "Crusade" uttered by the American President, George Bush, was not a slip of a tongue, as the USA is mobilizing its troops toward Muslim countries. They urged Muslim countries not to accept a coalition with the USA that allows no alternative but to be with the USA or with terrorism. They

Furthermore, economic officials said Yemen would be very much affected by the terrorist attacks on the USA in terms of its economy. This will hit three fields - oil, tourism and marine shipment. Yemeni oil exports will be affected owing to the fall of oil price to \$22 per barrel from \$28-30. Yemen heavily depends on the revenues of oil exports. The tourist sector, whose revenues is estimated at \$90-100 million annual, has also been greatly hit.

Court Commutes Sentence Against British Embassy Bombers

The first two attackers confessed to carrying out the bombing operation of the UK Embassy to protest the Israeli atrocities against the Palestinians, considering Britain the major cause of Muslim's plight. Later, Masud denied his confessions in court and said he was used by the ex-Interior Minister, Hussein Arab, to settle his scores with Jayol. He added that he attempted planting bombs beside Arab's house in cooperation with one of his guards to hold Jayol accountable for the operation. Masud also said he informed Arab two days earlier of the bombing attacks that took place in Aden last January, but Arab absolutely denied such allegations. No comments have been made by the UK embassy on the verdict. However, the British Ambassador to Yemen, Frances Guy, told the Yemen Times two weeks ago that they are happy with the verdict of the primary court and the speed in which the case has been moving, as well as the way the investigations into the bombing have been carried out. She also pointed out that officials from Scotland Yard helped the Yemeni police in the investigations. They handed their results to the Yemeni authorities. These documents were used by the people in the court for consultation.



O: After the rapid growth of the Free Zone project, work began in Aden to establish an industrial zone. What about this project?

A: According to the general plan, this project will be completed in four phases spanning a 25-30 year period. The plan was outlined in the beginning of the 1990s on the basis of administrative, technical, economic, and financial surveys. Despite the fact that the foundation of the plan is still valid, new developments have been made in technology, administration and construction which necessitate revising the original plan. The estimated necessary financial investment has also increased. For example, what cost US \$5 a decade ago, costs US \$7-10 today.

Q: Aden has a great tourist potential. How do you assess related investment in this city?


A: Many local as well as foreign investors have been showing interest in Aden in general and in the Free Zone in particular for the last ten years. This can by attributed to a number of factors, such as Aden's strategic location, its old fame, and its reputation as an important seaport. The investment projects that have been achieved thus far and the continuous investment requests indicate that new projects are arising day after day. Let me take this opportunity to welcome local, Arab as well as foreign investors to Aden and assure them that they will be provided with all possible incentives to make their jobs easier.

Q: Can you give us a brief idea about the new projects in Aden?

O: What about security?

A: I would not be exaggerating if I said that Aden is the most secure place in Yemen. People are peaceful, and there is a good cooperation between security forces and the population. This makes the job of security forces easier and helps to maintain stability.

All threats of sabotage, such as those perpetrated in the past by a number of traitors, have vanished. The fruitful cooperation between security people and citizens resulted in the disappearance of such irresponsible actions and the arrest of their perpetrators.

To further assure stability and peace in the city, we have worked on different policies to solve all kinds of problems land disputes. No organized crime can be found, and individual crimes, such as killing or robberies, are very rare. But this does not mean that there are no social problems, as these are issues that are found in all societies and families. Such problems do not pose a threat to the security and peace of the city.

Q: How do you evaluate the city's role in development? How do you foresee its future?

A: Aden has played a vital role in development of Yemen in general. It has been a cosmopolitan city that embraces all Yemenis, regardless of














Rashed Mohammed Thabet to YT: "The internal and external factors played a major role in realizing the unification of Yemen"

ashed Mohammed Thabet was born in al-Shawefa district in Taiz in 1943. He departed his hometown to Aden while he was just three years old. At that time, Aden used to be the only city in Yemen where education was available. Moreover, his father used to work there as an engineer for a big ship maintenance company. Rashed started working while he was young after completing his secondary school because of some personal matters. Then, he worked as an accountant and a supervisor for the free markets company at Aden Airport.

Rashed Mohammed Thabet started early his struggle against the British colonialists when he was in charge of the Popular Union and then of the military affairs of the resistance forces. After leaving the British jail, he worked in many fields, including journalism, as he used to work for many local newspapers like al-Ayyam and al-Yaqada. Similarly, Rashed was a distinguished lyric writer and poet.

After independence, he assumed several posts like director-general of radio & television, minister of information, minister of supply & immigrants affairs, ambassador to Cairo, office manager for the secretary-general of the YSP, minister of culture and minister of unity affairs up till the reunification of Yemen.

Mr. Rashed narrates some of his memories about many issues and events, which he experienced since his youth. as well as about some figures who took part in removing the Imamate tyrannical regime. Mr. Rashed praised the role of the patriotic people who took part in the realization of our revolutions.

Mr. Rashed remembers the great Yemeni freedom fighter, Mr. Mohammed Ahmed al-Noman, saying that the British authorities expelled Mohammed Ahmed al-Noman when he was taken by the police to the airport, where a mass of people had assembled to bid him farewell. Answering a journalist question about the real reason behind his expulsion from Aden, al-Noman said, "Is it easy for a person whose mouth is full of water to speak." This situation was similar to what happened to Mohssen al-Ayeni when he was asked to leave Aden where a mass of people, including Sheikh Senan Abu Luhoum, gathered to protest against this decision. Following 26th September Revolution, many people from the South came to northern Yemen to participate in the defense of the newly-born revolution and played a major role in mobilizing

the people's efforts in the North. At that time, a war started in some regions of Mareb and Bida in addition to contiguous areas with the South. Thus, the leadership at Sana'a along with the other national forces and parties in Aden started thinking of how to resist the Anglo-Sultanate forces and decided to adopt the armed resistance as the principal tool for liberating the South. The 14th October Revolution erupted from Radfan mountains against the British colonizers in Radfan region and the other areas in the South where the British military bases existed.

Then, the national forces started thinking about moving their struggle in the South to the major cities. In fact, I was one of the people who initiated the attacks against the British troops stationed in Aden and these are some of the memories I still remember from the eruption of 26 September and 14 October revolutions.

Rashed Mohammed Thabet lavishly spoke about the 14th of October Revolution against the British occupation of South Yemen, remembering some of the troops which had been formed in Aden after the proclamation

of the revolution. "I still remember the names of the first group of fighters, who sparked the first fight against the British forces stationed in the cities of the South, like Mohammed Saleh Mote'a, Ahmed Mohammed Saeed al-Maqatri, Qaid, Abdalla Abdulhakim al-Odain, Abdurahaman from Mohammed Haza'a from al-A'aruq and Abdula Ghaleb from the city of Aden," Rashed said. All these men were affiliated to the Teachers League in Aden, which used to be chaired by Abdulaziz Abdulwali. The number 1 responsible of the League in al-Mua'ala was Abdulaziz Slam al-Qubati, one of the first patriots who participated in firing the first shots against the British colonialists. Mr. Abdulaziz al-Qubati is one of the forgotten patriots of the revolution who joined the National Guard which rushed to defend the newly-born revolution.

Within the Arab League, I still remember Abubakar Shafiq, Dr. Abdulkarim Ahassan, Ali al-Zaghir al-Duba'ay, al-Shahid Bader al-Shahid, Mahyoub Qasem al-Sharabi, and the martyr Abud. At the beginning, the league was headed by Nor-Eldin Qasem and then by Alwi al-Salam, before Abdulfatah Ismail came along with the Abdulrazaq Shaif and Hussain al-Jabiri.

After that, Mr. Rashed talked about the unification of Yemen which had been achieved on the 22th of May 1990 and said, "The issue of unity is the direct result of the suffering of the Yemeni people prior to the independence when the British colonialists used to discriminate the people who came from the North against the other protectorates in the South, considering them as foreigners. We suffered a lot from this discrimination as we used to dream of getting education in Aden but it was inaccessible for us at the exception of the people who could trick the British authorities by obtaining a birth certificate from Aden authorities. One thing that helped the people coming from the North to get education in Aden was the availability of private schools which hosted the students coming from the North and the other people from the protectorates of the South. Indeed, the protectorates were completely deprived from basic services like education and health care.

As far as the leadership of the Labor Union is concerned, Mr. Rashed said: "Abdullah al-Asnag, Ali Hussain al-Qathi, Abdu Khalil Sulaiman and Mohammed Salim ba Sundwa were the real leaders of the labor movement, which had been calling for the unification of Yemen since 1957. Mr. Mohammed Saeed al-Hakimi, was one of the prominent leaders in the labor movement. Mohammed Ahmed al-Noman and Muhssen al-Ayni played a major role in the foundation of the Labor Union along with Mohammed Salem Bawazir. Similarly, the Arab Nationalists Movement along with the Bath Party had a great effect on the members of the Union."

Concerning the steps preceding May 22. Mr. Rashed said that this issue was very urgent for the people of Yemen. However, it was hindered by some external circumstances that imposed themselves on the leaderships of the two parts of Yemen. When the pressure got tighter on the two leaderships, they started to think seriously of rapprochement. Furthermore, the international factors played a major role in this regard.

He added, "In 1972, I remember the committee who prepared the documents related to the unification in Cairo as there was a great opportunity for the two leaderships to move ahead with the unification.'

According to Mr. Muhssen al-Ayni, former prime minister, there had been external pressures on the government not to go ahead with the unification, particularly from the shura council at that time. Moreover, the leadership of the shura council demanded the resignation of Muhsen al-Ayni who in turn tried to bridge the gap between the shura council and the government.

Then, Muhssen al-Ayni, who left Cairo to Algeria, submitted his resignation to Abdulrahman al-Iryani. The latter

requested Mr. al-Ayni to change his mind and to go to the United Nations in order to attend its round of negotiations and stay there for a while. Abdulrahman al-Irvani could try to calm down the shura council. chaired then by Abdula bin Hussain al-Ahmar who strongly opposed any unification with the South. Yet, Muhssen al-Ayni openly pointed out that Abdula bin Hussain al-Ahmar was


against the unification.

He came back to Sana'a after taking part at the U.N. talks while the campaign against the unification was in full swing and insisted again on his resignation. He left for Italy sending his letter of resignation in which he said that he could not stay in a situation full of dangers with a risk of conspiracy against him. Actually, this came after al-Ayni signed the Cairo Agreement which had been strongly opposed at that time by the shura council and the tribal leaders who had gone in so far as to consider the signing of the agreement as a high treason. Frankly speaking, Iraq played a crucial role in reaching this agreement through Abdulkhaliq al-Samora'y who was the second person in charge during the rule of Ahmed Hassan al-Bakar. Al-Samora'y paid many visits to Aden and Sana'a in this regard.

Of course, the great role of the Arab League shall not be forgotten. Different committees to prompt the unification were formed. The relations between the two parts used to go up and down until a clear split occurred and led to the second war in 1979. As a result of the different international pressures, the two leaderships in the North and the South and reached an agreement stipulating the realization of unification within a period of 6 months. However, the anti-unification forces in the North and the South worked actively to break any attempt that could lead to re-unifying Yemen and went as far as to threaten the assentiment of President Ali Abdula Saleh

A very important thing that should be reminded here is that, in a meeting between ex-USSR head of state Mikhail Gorbachev and president Ali Salem al-Bith during his visit in Moscow, Gorbachev spoke about the crisis in Yemen in particular and said that, "Yemen is located in the Arab peninsula where lots of American interests reside. We do not have any interest there so that you can determine what you want by respecting the will of your people." By that, Gorbachev advised Ali Salem al-Baith to improve his relation with the regime in the North. Therefore, the leadership in the South got the green light from the USSR to proceed with the unification process. In fact, without this particular international climate, the re-unification of Yemen could have not been achieved in such a peacefu! n/anner.



Yemen to Implement an Ambitious Five-year Plan



ccording to the 5-year plan for 2001-2005, GDP per capita is expected to raise up to YR 84448 in 2005 compared to YR 75276 in 2001, growing at a yearly average rate of 2.3 percent. The plan also forecasts a rise in the balance of payments to YR 457.8 billion.

The plan focuses on a continuing government support to enhance the economic stability and augment labor force in the national economy by 876,000 workers between 2001 and 2005. The government is optimistic about this plan and says the economic growth would create about 896,000 work opportunities.

It expects to attract foreign capital to increase investment in the available domains by 28.6 percent by 2005.

The plan also aims to control unemployment and inflation rates related to non-oil GDP.

Expenditure on the final consumption is likely to rise from 71.8 percent in 2000 to 72.4 percent in 2005. The augmentation is attributed to an increase in governmental expenditure by 12 percent to cover the demands of implementing the local council system and improve the administrative system of the government and its staff.

The government is targeting GDP growth of 5.6 percent yearly as well as an increase of non-oil economy from 66.3 percent in 2000 to 74.3 percent in 2005. It is also working to provide the necessary resources, expected to amount YR 3 trillion in 2005, for a comprehensive development.

Around YR 198.821 billion (23 percent of total public expenditure and 11 percent of the GDP) has been allocated to education until 2005. In addition, about 6 to 7.6 percent of total public expenditure has been allocated to promote health services.

The first 5-year plan of 1996-2000 was said to have achieved an annual growth of 5.5 percent out of 7.2 percent target-ed.

The first plan achieved a 21.3 percent rise in investments and a 44.2 percent increase in exports. The increases in oil prices greatly helped converting the 5.2 percent deficit of the budget in 1995 to a 7.1 percent surplus in 2000.

The new five-year plan seems more ambitious in economic and development growth rates. However, anticipation of the plan's efficiency to solve and overcome the economic problems and challenges remains to be determined by its implementation. den sea port, which has lately tried to revive its past glory as a navigation transit point, faces tough competition from Salalah, Dubai and Djibouti.

Since the terrorist attack on USS Cole in October last year, local authorities of the Aden Sea Port have been studying a promotional plan to restore confidence in the harbor. The plan includes converting the port into an important export center and achieve a good rank among the other important seaports in the region.

Aden port has an advantage over Dubai port which is the saving of two sailing days through the Ormuz Straits to the Arab Gulf. However, it still needs a more developed infrastructure to compete against the 23 titanic cranes featured in Dubai port.

Like Aden seaport, the Omani Salalah port enjoys an excellent strategic location. The Omani authorities have been working hard to develop the container terminal in Salalah in order to offer better services for the Gulf and the Indian Ocean. The port sees about 1.5 million containers transiting per year and features 12 gigantic cranes.

Economists believe that Aden port come from Djibouti if a free zone is



established there.

Aden Sea Port:

Competing with the Gulf Ports

Navigation sources say Aden port serves huge vessels that are usually served by a few great ports, which means that this will affect both Dubai and Salalah ports as transit companies will shift their activities to Aden. It is expected that someday Aden port will be a very busy and active trading center that will help Yemen gain revenues to strengthen the general budget. To achieve such a position, authorities should work out plans to attract the huge vessels and develop the port services.

New Opportunities to Develop National Industry

arketing experts believe that the local industrial sector has a good chance to increase its production of foodstuffs, home appliances and fashion to cover the needs of the local market owing to the high prices of imported goods as a result of the rise in US dollar prices. The increase in the prices of imported goods following the September 11 events demands local alternatives at lower prices.

Increases in prices was accompanied by the Yemeni Riyal losing 3 percent of its value since September 11. Dollar exchange rate has mounted to YR 172 from YR 169 two months ago, leading to a 3 to 4 percent increase in the prices of imported goods. Marketing analysts think that

increasing production of local facto-

ries will help the private sector compete with the export sector and win consumers' confidence. However, the industrial sector seems likely to be unable to improve its production due to the stagnant market and push on imports.

They also say that the bad performance of the industrial sector in Yemen started during the freeing of foreign trade, which was accompanied by a sharp decrease of national imports and production. Studies show that growth of the industrial sector is not improving because of the high cost of workers and fluctuation in the national currency exchange rate. Furthermore, neglecting the role of investment in improving industrial production also created a lot of problems for the local industry.

Industrial people accuse traders of creating a liquidity crisis by purchasing hard currencies which affects the available cash. Traders respond by saying that purchasing hard currencies enable them to continue dealing with foreign companies, which is a matter that always affects the national industry. However, market researchers recommended the industrial sector to activate demands on their products, attract foreign investors to local industry, direct resources to increase industrial production, and increase exports to for-

eign markets.

The government plans focus on increasing non-oil exports by an annual growth of 17.1 percent through promoting tourism and the Aden free trade zone.

Therefore, there is a chance for the industrial sector to increase its production under the current circumstances which make it difficult for importers to offer lower prices.

Rod Barbo to "Downward-Spiraling Newspaper": "I am treated unfairly or with prejudice here in Yemen"

Times received the following letter from Mr. Rod Barbo, an American working in Yemen, who called YT a "downward-spiraling newspaper" and based on the freedom of press and the right to reply, we publish it in text with no comments.

I got mad reading your steadily downward-spiraling newspaper and wrote an article for submission.

I read the Yemen Times article "I am as American as the next guy is!" and was struck by what this author did NOT say. As for most Arab news I have watched lately, there was no open condemnation of both the hijackings/ bombings and the calls by some Muslims for Jihad. Instead, the cruel actions and the hatred and revenge underlying them are tiptoed around and treated as understandable and tolerated. The "I am as American..." author instead railed a whole lot more against a couple unstable Americans making relatively insignificant evil acts against individuals and the country's misguided foreign policies. Why is blame avoided on one side, but not on the other? It surely sounded to me like one side sense of injustice and anger is OK, and opposing biases held by other Americans were not. What kind of a double standard is being promoted among Arab Muslims? The author Shaker Al-Ashwal was an

American Yemeni Muslim. He thankand American as can be a Chinese

Muslim radicals?

I am treated unfairly or with prejudice here in Yemen on a regular basis. In stark contrast to the Quran ("Wail Al-Mutaffafiin" begins the applicable Sura), I pay more for bus or airline tickets, visas, work permits and a bunch of other things than does a Yemeni. 97% of the population here is always trying to charge foreigners more on the street just because they think all white folks are rich and ignorant. Could this be a Zionist plot to make me resent Arabs and their culture? Rubbish! It is just the universal problem of selfish people with more of a desire to get for themselves, or at least for their brother, than to care for outsiders or do what is right. We all at times can feel angry at selfishness and injustice just like a Palestinian... But as a human being, I am an individual responsible for my self and my own response. I do not blow up the Sana'a Trade Center some evenings just because tax collectors, customs officials, or government employees have repeatedly blackmailed our company. I do not kidnap neighbors or guests because several Yemeni companies ordered equipment from my company and never finished paying for it. Of course, I do not because God has clearly said that I am responsible for myself and for my own actions. When someone behaves badly towards me (and they do here in Yemen every week in a hundred small ways). I have a moral choice to not become just as evil as the original perpetrator by responding with evil. We would all say I am wrong if I bring home a problem at work and yell at my kids because of it. Even if it is understandable, it is wrong. I become a bad person if I let problems around me being my excuse for comfully can be just as American as I am, mitting a similar evil act. Or, even doing a much greater evil action like the secretly-admired hijackers did to New York. Let us openly call the attacks and their perpetrators what they are - an evil hypocrisy rather than a staging ground for a Jihad. Osama and those like him, who want to start a Jihad, are nothing more than selfish and evil people just like those Jews and Americans they hate. Although I admit that I am not always good at it, I try to not be overcome by evil and so become evil myself. Rather, I find that I can live here in Yemen a lot more peacefully and contentedly if I respond to evil with good instead. 



By the end of the third day, the number of phone numbers reached 10, including different cellphone numbers. I was still unable to get through to the minister or even receive a negative response. My friends kept telling me to give it up. "If you don't know any of his relatives or close friends, don't fancy to get his reply," they told me. But, I went on trying, waiting for at least: 'No, he is busy.'

The new wind of change and its consequences make some officials more wanted by reporters thirsty for information on thoughts of what is going on regionally and internationally. Reporters come from the US or the United Kingdom looking for a chance to meet with such important people in order to come close to Yemen's commitment to fight terrorism. Not all of them succeed in their mission. Some get bored of calling a lot of phone numbers and getting only more phone numbers. The few, who succeeded, were accompanied by a big number of people from the Ministry of Information wherever they went. A CNN reporter, commented "I think the Ministry of Information has the biggest number of employees."

Journalists here have always been complaining about officials screening news that is, most often, disclosed by foreign news agencies. Some officials say some news circulated internationally are misleading. I wonder then why they do not try to give the true news on time, before giving others a chance to use their wildest imagination.


Journalists have the right to get information from its sources. Their iobs should be facilitated instead of made difficult. And, after all, Journalists are not spies who should be dogged wherever they go.

born Buddhist, a Hindu from India, a Pilipino Catholic, or even an Israeli born Jew. In contrast, I as a white American living in Yemen for over 8 years can never be a Yemeni. A white Christian American like myself can never be a Saudi, an Omani, or ever any other Arab or Islamic citizen. If I asked, "Is it racist and prejudicial of all these Islamic countries to not let me become a citizen?" I suspect all Arabs would all loudly call "No, it isn't! That's something different!" But really, how different is it?

Suicides in Aden: Shocking Facts & Figures an issue



uicide is a widespread phenomenon which affects the lives of people of various age groups regardless of being males or females. The motivations that may force a person to commit suicide vary from one person to another, based on the psychological and social environment. Moreover, the reason behind suicide could be a psychological disorder, which may not noticed by the persons living along with the person who commit suicide. In an attempt to know more about this phenomenon through different points of view, we paid visits to some departments closely linked to contemplating the reasons leading to suicide. Based on the studies conducted by the Department of Planning & Information at Aden Security Department, the reasons behind committing suicide appear to be moral weakness and lack of religious discipline. In addition, suicide is one of the most mysterious and incomprehensible acts committed by human beings.

while in 1996 the number of suicides reached the number of 14 with 20 suicide attempts. In 1997, there were 18 suicides and 30 suicide attempts, for 17 suicides and 25 suicide attempts in 1998. In 1999, the number of suicides and suicide attempts totaled 15 and 19 respectively. Thus, the total number of persons to have committed suicide or to have attempted committing suicide in the period running from 1995 to 1999 totaled 191.

Consequently, suicides have witnessed a significant increase from 1995 to 1998 as the highest number of suicides was registered in this period. The highest number of suicides was in 1997 totaling 18 suicides, for 15 suicides only the following year. Similarly, the suicide attempts also rose in 1997 to 30 attempts, while dropping to 19 attempts in 1999.

The reasons and motivations leading to committing suicide can be outlined in the weakness of religious discipline, psychological disorders, social problems, and suffering from incurable diseases.

As for the methods used in committing suicide, they range from shooting a gun, hanging, taking drugs and toxic substances, setting the body on fire, and jumping from high buildings. As



Aden Governorate totaled 77 suicides and 114 suicide attempts from 1995 to 1999. In 1995 alone, Aden witnessed 13 suicides and 20 suicide attempts,

for sex differences, the year 1998 can be taken as an example. Out of 15 suicides, males and females accounted for 10 and 5 respectively. Out of 25 suicide

females.

Concerning the age groups of the persons who committed or attempted suicide, the age group from 18-30 years witnessed 16 suicides (14 males and 2 females). In the age group from 42-50 years, there had been 17 suicides (13 males and 4 females).

The educational levels of the persons who committed or attempted suicide are as follows: from the 1st grade up to the 7th grade there had been 10 suicides (8 males and 2 females); from the 8th grade up to secondary school there had been 18 suicides (12 males and 6 females); at post-secondary education only 2 suicides were witnessed; in the level of illiterate people, 10 committed suicide (3 males and 7 females).

As far as techniques used for committing or attempting to suicide, 11 suicides were carried out by absorbing large quantities of drugs (3 males and 7 females), 14 suicides by setting body on fire (5 males and 9 females), 3 suicides by shooting a gun, 5 suicides by cutting veins, 3 suicides by jumping from high places, 2 suicides by hanging, 1 suicide by drinking toxic substances, and one by stabbing the stomach with sharp glass.

Now let us have a look at some cases. A.A., 35 years old, holder of a diploma from the police college and who used to work for the police, shot himself causing immediate death. He left a farewell message to his wife in his pocket. After checking the personal record of that person, it was confirmed that he was unsociable and extremely loved his wife but thought she did not care for him.

Another person: N.A., 34 years old, a secondary school female teacher who used to work for a nursery, was found dead after she set herself on fire. It was confirmed that she was suffering from chronic psychological problems and that her body presented deformations since her birth. In addition, she appeared to be ugly and to have only one eye.

attempts, there were 10 males and 15 We interviewed many specialists about this alarming phenomenon in an attempt to discuss the reasons behind suicide and to find appropriate solutions to this problem. Here are some excerpts of the interviews:

> Abdulwahid Abdurahman Ahmed, professor of psychology at Aden Faculty of Education, points out that suicide is a social

phenomenon prevailing in many societies because of several reasons linked to the social fabric of those societies. Suicide is the act of killing oneself intentionally by using a certain method of his own and without the intervention of other persons. Moreover, suicide is a behavioral phenomenon in response to certain social circumstances. It is also noticeable that suicide among males is more common than among females.


Some studies reveal that suicide increases when one gets older. However, there are noticeable differences in this regard due to the biological, psychological and social structure of people. Similarly, there are many ways for committing suicides, that are mostly related to gender and age. Concerning the reasons and motivations behind committing suicide, they vary from one society to another. It is obvious that the main reasons behind committing suicide are family breakups, divorce, economic hardships, social problems, pessimism, failure, feeling to have sinned or to be guilty, self-hatred, self-denial, and psychological instability. Similarly, the reasons leading to committing suicide are principally caused by depression, which result from failure in love relation, disappointment, losing a job or the death of a dear person. Indeed, all what has been mentioned before are direct consequences of depression and stress. It has been proved that the depressionrelated diseases are amongst the most fatal diseases and even more serious than heart and cancers diseases. This is

major concern. Psychological disorders should be given proper attention and not separated from the physical illnesses. Almost every psychologist along with other specialists acknowledge the strong relationship between the psychological mood and the immunity system since depression, worry and stress are closely related to physical illnesses, such as diabetes, high blood pressure, rheumatism and some cancer diseases.



Sheikh Abdulbari Mohammed Othman noted that the suicide phenomenon is a clear manifestation of the person's inability to assume

his duties and responsibilities in life. In fact, this is just a reflection of the pessimism and melancholy in which the person who committed suicide used to live. The spirit of the person who commits suicide is full of psychological illnesses and complexes. Furthermore, the person who does commit suicide is an abnormal person lacking faith in God and sees everything as dark and bleak. Interestingly, suicides are seldom taking place in Islamic societies since the person who dares committing suicide should have no faith in the almighty God. The Holy Quran stated that if anyone killed a person not in retaliation of murder, it would be as if he had killed all mankind, and if anyone who saved a life, it would be as if he had saved the lives of all mankind.



Office in Aden, Colonel Abdulhadi Ghaleb0, says that this phenomenon is not widely spread in Aden. We can call it a phenomenon found within the family context. We

observed that this phenomenon was restricted only to some people who always fell under the influence of chronic psychological disorders or excessive use of drugs. All these issues from any act of suicide.



have negative consequences and result in committing suicide consciously or unconsciously.

Love and infatuation among the youth is the major cause of suicide. When they are suddenly informed that their marriage proposals are rejected, whether they are males or females, they may choose suicide.

Those who tried to commit suicide by absorbing toxic substances are usually saved. Therefore, our duty is to treat them well, calm them down and find the main causes of their suicide attempts by meeting their relatives and their parents. By this, we can given them the chance to look for better solutions and better treatment.

He added that such problems must be tackled immediately by informing and spreading awareness among the people. The security departments as well as the media have thus to assume their respective duties effectively in this respect.

Taking as a whole, the proper education of our children and involving them in the different difficulties and tribulations of life will give them the chance to be more patient and efficient in tackling their daily life problems. As we must support them, we must let them' know the true principles of Islam, fear of the Almighty God and trust in Him, which all will function as deterrents

Ahl Alkhf: People of Cave Reawaken in Saber

aiz is distinguished for its strategic location. It is situated in the northern slopes of a very high, skyward, and well-known mountain called Saber Mountain at an altitude of 3070 meters. Saber Mountain by itself is a wonder as it embraces the city in its arms. Many springs and streams run on its sides and give a heavenly beauty to the villages located around. Until recently, you could only see darkness when you looked at them at night. However, the situation considerably evolved as a result of an amazing road which was paved from Taiz to the top of the mountain. Most of the villages have been since then provided with electricity. By seeing all this at night, you cannot help admiring the captivating and beauty of the whole scenario. Indeed, some people climb this majestic mountain to enjoy a spectacular scenery. It is said that the inhabitants of the Saber Mountain have transmitted from one generation to another the knowledge of the presence of the Cave in their region, as mentioned in the Holy Quran, inside a small old mosque. The mosque is known as the mosque of the People of the Cave (Gamae Ahl Al-Kahf). It is situated in south of Taiz at the top of the Saber Mountain in a

blessed venue where the Young Men, Ahl Al-Khaf or (Alfetia), came for peace and devoted themselves for the services of God. During their time and for hundreds of years, the people used to be pagans.

Their story was narrated in the Holy Quran in a Surra called Ahl Al-Kahf (the People of the Cave). The story was chronologically placed after the story of Noah and the flood, a worldwide deluge which was mentioned in the


Mountain in Jordan, while other sources indicate the Cave to be in Iraq or in Syria.

In Yemen, it is believed that the real spot of the Cave is in Saber Mountain in Taiz. Researchers confirmed this hypothesis through recent discoveries and historical evidences. The head of the mosque there, Móhammed Abdu Al-Faqee, said that the task of his family has been to inform people of the exact location where the People of the Cave stayed for a long time. The place (the Cave) exactly lies under the mosque. Moreover, there is a person who shows people where the People of the Cave lived. His job, called Al-Mansoob, has been inherited by oral tradition from one generation to the next.

The small white mosque located in Al-Meeqab village consists of two adjacent buildings. One of them is smaller and older. It presents only one room and a hole in the corner of the mosque. This hole is roofed with stones and is enclosed by a decorated wooden cage. It is believed that the old mosque's Kiblah direction pointed toward

Jerusalem in Palestine, before being directed to the Kabaa in the North. The establishment of the old mosque dates back to the pre-Islamic era and its repairs go back to around 800 years. Historical sources mention that the new building was erected by Ahmad Bin Alwan, the leader of the mystic (Sufi) movement in Yemen and is characterized by its decorated wooden pillars.

Yemeni historians indicate also that a small suburb in Taiz was called Degianos, as it is believed that the People of the Cave emerged during the reign of the king Degianos. He was described as the " the liar" who forced the Young Men to flee the city. While the Young Men believed in God, their companions were pagans as the king. It is said that these Young Men were threatened by the king who wanted them to worship the pagan divinities and abandon their own God. Consequently, the Young Men had to leave and climbed the mountain for protection. The People of the Cave hid



The cave's entry is located in the mosque and interestingly a gentle wind coming out from the hole can be felt. The population of the village think that there is a another cave situated at the bottom of Saber Mountain communicating with to top where the People of the Cave might have staved. Many visitors from all over the world come regularly to pay a visit to this historical site.

Book Review

Yemen, Jewel of Arabia

By Charles & Patricia Aithie **Reviewed by Karen Dabrowska**

etween a travelogue and a socio-cultural history of Yemen, the book by Charles & Patricia Aithie is beautifully produced with over 350 colour photographs and an insightful text.


In the introduction, Mark Marshall, a former British ambassador to Yemen provides a brief historical resume for the general reader. He concludes that the authorities in the Yemen Arab Republic held that in Yemen unity was impossible without democracy but that any attempt to break up the union would also amount to an attempt to impose at least partial dictatorship. When the ex-leaders of the Peoples Democratic Yemen Republic, having lost the election, tried to recreate their ex state, their failure to do so was at least in part due to popular revulsion at the idea of losing the two values, unity and democracy. That the Republic of Yemen survived this rude test in its infancy, is why today as in the mythical days of Qahtah and so rarely since, the land of Yemen is once again united under Yemeni rule.

The introduction is followed by a chronology stretching from 5000 BC to the present day - the final entry reading: 2000 northern border agreed with Saudi Arabia.

The book is divided into three sections: The Highlands, the Tihama and the Hadramaut, the south coast and Aden. Sadly, the authors neglect Socotra, a pictorial gem and do not do justice to the old city of Sana'a with its numerous markets and colorful characters. The photographs of the scenery, especially the mountains in the north and the harbor of Aden are as breathtaking as the subject matter but there is little empathy for the people: the book is a book which delights in scenery and buildings rather than the country's inhabitants.


The authors must be congratulated for their penetrating flashes of insight into Yemeni life: they talk about agriculture. architecture, crafts, religion, qat, coffee and even ghost crabs which are able to run forwards, backwards or sideways across the sand at speeds of up to 16 kilometres an hour.

The introduction to the highlands reminds the reader that the rough ter-



world. The authors have combined their photographic skills with assiduous research. In their description of The Tihama they mention the Danish expedition led by the explorer Carsten Niebuhr in 1763. At that time al-Luhayya and Mukha were described as the main ports of the Tihama, the lowland strip that lies along the Red Sea coast. Since then the coffee trade has declined and the shift from dhows and fishing boats to modern shipping and oil tankers has seen Hodeidah take over as the main port: the city has seen much expansion in recent years. Yet much of the Tihama beyond Hodeidah is still rooted in the past and communities have continued to sustain a way of life that existed for centuries - and one unlike that of other parts of Yemen. In addition to the main narrative, the story of the country is told through photo captions: in the section on the Hadramaut and the south coast, next to a photo of dangerous looking horns, we learn that today there are still dances in the interior of the Hadramaut at which the dancers hold ibex horns above their heads in a ceremonial reenactment of a time when the ibex hunt was a commonplace event. The ibex hunt ceremony was part of an ancient ritual to invoke rain to water the crops. Some topics, such as Hadramaut honey, the Tawila Tanks in Aden and the geological story are separated from the narrative by boxes.

The book takes the reader on a journey through the country which the Romans called Arabia Felix - Fertile Arabia -



capturing a way of life which changed little over the centuries until the 1970s but is now being eroded.

Many of the cities are described in great detail where the present is always cross referenced with the past. Taiz, for example, is a tremendously energetic city. "It has been inhabited since pre-Islamic times and has been a capital for various periods during its history. Today it is a centre of modern industry and commerce and buzzes with life. It sits on a plateau about 80km northeast of Mukha at an altitude of 1,400m. The citadel perched on its own volcanic cone, is tucked under the cliffs of the 3,200-m high Jebel Sabr, a granite mountain. During the reign of Imam Ahmad bin Yahya Hamid ad Din who died in 1962 it housed the hostage relatives by whom he sought to secure the allegiance of the tribal leaders. The city sprawls beneath it".

Like the country they are describing, the authors have a multi-faceted background: Charles Aithie was born in Edinburgh and studied geology at Aberdeen and Oxford Universities before working for BP for ten years, in Scotland, the UAE and Indonesia. Patricia Aithie is a Fellow of the Royal

Geographical society and a member of the British Guild of Travel Writers. She was born in Cardiff and studied Fine Art and History of Art at the Canterbury College of Art before studying at the Glamorgan School Journalism.

They both lived and worked together in the Middle and Far East for more than five years travelling extensively with their cameras. They now work from their home in Wales, where in addition to their researching and writing work they maintain an extensive photographic library serving publishers and the visual media.



It is said that this kingdom appeared in the 8th century BC after the collapse of the state of Shammar Yuharish.

The recently discovered site is fully fenced. Its location between the kingdoms of Sheba and Himiar indicates that it had been the trading market of

both kingdoms. As approaching the area is still not allowed, I could not take any photos from the site. All the traces uncovered indicate establishment of a very strong kingdom there. The archeologists dug out a fence, old cities, palaces, markets, temples, wells. Part of the fence, two gates that are believed to lead to the Himiarian kingdom were found.

Unfortunately, a lot of people are still ignorant of the great value of such sites. Many ancient palaces have been destroyed by people who wanted to make use of their nice ready stones for building. Others, seeking gold treasures, destroyed whatever they found




motivation and so forth. To put it in a

The US authorities did not inform us about their cases. Initial information says that there are more than 3,000 Yemenis without legal residence permits currently living in the USA.

The number of Yemenis interrogated or interviewed by the US authorities and later released totaled around 18 Yemenis, 10 immigrants and 8 students including Omar Bakir, Mihdhar Mohammed Abdullah, Abdullah Al-Maouri, Ahmed Al-Ammari, Mohammed Jazim, Abdullah Jazim, Ghassan Jazim, Hussein Al-Attas, Yahya Saleh, Akram Abdullah Rashid, Adnan Hawwash, Hamdoun Qalalah, Raid Al-Wusabi, as well as others.

Yemenis?

A: Yes indeed. There were small damages caused to 6 stores belonging to Yemeni merchants in the state of Michigan, in NY, and Chicago. Hassan Al-Baadani's fuel station in Chicago was set on fire but did not result in great damage. Two Yemenis in Detroit were attacked and windows of houses where Yemenis live in the states of Michigan and New York were shattered. Ahmed Issa, an American of Yemeni origin, was fired from his company in the state of Michigan after working there for 15 years because of his employer's "hate towards Muslims".

On September 17th, Mohammed Abdullah Ismail along with his wife and kids were interrogated at an airport for a short while and then released. Unfortunately, even the honorary consul and representative of the ministry was harassed by officials at the airport after arriving to help in the Yemeni family's case. Five Yemeni immigrants were also prevented from taking the flight back to their homeland because the airport officials claimed that the airplane did not have guardians. 
There were also several reports of other harassment cases against Yemenis. Many Yemenis were physically assaulted, threatened, irritated by hatred phone calls, and interrogated by the FBI. Many of those incidents occurred in NYC against immigrants and merchants.

Q: What about incidents against Yemenis in other countries?

A: There were a few cases in the city of Manchester in the UK. There were six reports of harassment incidents. On 13 September, a Yemeni lady was harassed while bringing her children home. On 14 September, a Yemeni girl was attacked while on her way to college. On September 17th, an attack was launched against the Islamic Center and Mosque causing substantial damage. On 18 September, a child was assaulted while playing in the playground. On September 19th, an elderly Yemeni was harassed on his way home after evening prayers at the mosque.

There were also several attacks against Islamic and Arab centers and mosques in some suburbs of Manchester. However, most of the attacks did not result in substantial damage.


Dear Editor.





Dawha-based Al-Jazeera Satellite TV channel, the most respected independent TV channels in the world has proven during the last developments that it is a truly professional and independent media organ. Al-Jazeera has been directly and indirectly criticized by the USA for broadcasting certain "taped" material representing the statements of Osama bin Laden. However, as an indepenent newspaper, we feel that preventing the public from viewing any material on TV is clearly an act against the freedom of the press.

The US government had requested major international networks to exercise judgment in airing statements by al-Qaeda or Osama bin Laden broadcasted on Al-Jazeera.

"At best, Osama bin Laden's messages are propaganda calling on people to kill Americans..At worst, he could be issuing orders to his followers to initiate such attacks." " intoned White House spokesman Ari Fleischer.

The US believes that bin Laden might be using the tape to convey coded







messages because al-Qaeda's own means of communication are limited.

The five US major television news organizations reached a joint agreement on Wednesday to follow the suggestion of the White House and abridge any future videotaped statements from Osama bin Laden or his followers to remove language the government considers inflammatory.

The Western media have also implicitly expressed their jealousy of Al-Jazeera's success in covering the recent issues. Prominent journalist, Janet Fine said, "The Taliban is giving the broadcaster releases and interviews because it trusts it more than Western networks. And while decrying its broadcast of Osama bin Laden tapes, President Bush is eager to have pro-U.S. interests represented on it as well. With its special access to Afghanistan, the Arabic-language Satellite News Channel has been edging out the BBC and CNN in its distinctive coverage of the Sept. 11 attack and the U.S.-led retaliation."

Free Press Columnist, MIKE WENDLAND said, "Bin Laden is a master propagandist who regularly uses the Al-Jazeera network to reach an Arabspeaking audience of estimated at 35 million, prompting some critics to call it the "bin Laden Satellite Network." In January, Al-Jazeera broadcast video of bin Laden attending his son's wedding in Afghanistan."



He, by his own confession, was an al-Qaida operative, who from about 1996 had been trained in al-Qaida camps in Afghanistan in explosives, hijacking, kidnapping, assassination and intelligence techniques With Osama bin Laden's express permission, he fought alongside the Taliban in Afghanistan. He had met Osama bin Laden personally in 1996 and asked for another 'mission.' Osama bin Laden sent him to East Africa after exten sive specialized training at camps in Afghanistan

44. As the truck approached the Embassy, Al 'Owali got out and threw a stun grenade at a security guard. Assam drove the truck up to the rear of the embassy. He got out and then detonated the bomb, which demolished a multi-story secretarial college and severely damaged the U.S. embassy, and the Co-operative bank building. The bomb killed 213 people and injured 4,500. Assam was killed in the explosion

45. Al 'Owali expected the mission to end in his death. He had been willing to die for al-Qaida. But at the last minute he ran away from the bomb truck and survived. He had no money, passport or plan to escape after the mission, because he had expected to die.

46. After a few days, he called a telephone number in

er attack on the World Trade Center in 1993 as "role models". He went on to exhort his followers "to take the fighting to America."

23. From the early 1990s Osama bin Laden has sought to obtain nuclear and chemical materials for use as weapons of terror.

24. Although U.S. targets are al-Qaida's priority, it also explicitly threatens the United States' allies. References to "Zionist-Crusader alliance and their collaborators," and to "Satan's U.S. troops and the devil's supporters allying with them" are references which unquestionably include the United Kingdom.

32. Since 1989, Osama bin Laden has conduct stantial financial and business transactions on behalf of al-Qaida and in pursuit of its goals. These include purchasing land for training camps, purchasing warehouses for the storage of items, including explosives, purchasing communications and electronics equipment, and transporting currency and weapons to members of al-Qaida and associated terrorist groups in countries throughout the world.

33. Since 1989 Osama bin Laden has provided training camps and questhouses in Afghanistan, Pakistan, the Sudan, Somalia and Kenya for the use of al-Qaida and associated terrorist groups. We know from intelligence that there are currently at least a dozen camps across Afghanistan, of which at least four are used for training terrorists.

34. Since 1989, Osama bin Laden has established a series of businesses to provide income for al-Qaida, and to provide cover for the procurement of explosives, weapons and chemicals, and for the travel of al-Qaida operatives. The businesses have included a holding company known as 'Wadi Al Aqiq', a construction business known as 'Al Hijra', an agricultural business known as 'Al Themar Al Mubaraka', and investment companies known as 'Ladin International' and 'Taba Investments'.

Osama bin Laden and previous attacks

35. In 1992 and 1993 Mohamed Atef traveled to Somalia on several occasions for the purpose of organizing violence against United States and United Nations troops then stationed in Somalia. On each occasion he reported back to Osama bin Laden, at his base in the Riyadh district of Khartoum.

36. In the spring of 1993 Atef, Saif al Adel, another senior member of al-Qaida, and other members began to provide military training to Somali tribes for the purpose of fighting the United Nations forces.

37. On 3 and 4 October 1993 operatives of al-Qaida participated in the attack on US military personnel serving in Somalia as part of the operation 'Restore Hope.' Eighteen U.S. military personnel were killed in the attack.

38. From 1993 members of al-Qaida began to live in Nairobi and set up businesses there, including Asma Ltd, and Tanzanite King. They were regularly visited there by senior members of al-Qaida, in particular by Ater and Abu Ubadiah al Banshiri.

39. Beginning in the latter part of 1993, members of al-Qaida in Kenya began to discuss the possibility of attacking the U.S. Embassy in Nairobi in retaliation for U.S. participation in Operation Restore Hope in Somalia. Ali Mohamed, a U.S. citizen and admitted member of al-Qaida, surveyed the US Embassy as a possible target for a terrorist attack. He took photographs and made sketches, which he presented to Osama bin Laden while bin Laden was in Sudan. He also admitted that he had trained terrorists for al-Qaida in Afghanistan in the early 1990s, and that those whom he trained included many involved in

Yemen to have money transferred to him in Kenya The number he rang in Yemen was contacted by Osama bin Laden's phone on the same day as Al 'Owali was arranging to get the money.

47. Another person arrested in connection with the Nairobi bombing was Mohamed Sadeek Odeh. He admitted to his involvement. He identified the principal participants in the bombing. He named three other persons, all of whom were al-Qaida or Egyptian Islamic Jihad members.

48. In Dar es Salaam the same day, at about the same time, operatives of al-Qaida detonated a bomb at the U.S. embassy, killing 11 people. The al-Qaida operatives involved included Mustafa Mohamed Fadhil and Khaflan Khamis Mohamed. The bomb was carried in a Nissan Atlas truck, which Ahmed Khfaklan Ghailani and Sheikh Ahmed Salim Swedan, two al-Qaida operatives, had purchased in July 1998, in Dar es Salaam.

49. Khaflan Khamis Mohamed was arrested for the bombing. He admitted membership of al-Qaida, and implicated other members of al-Qaida in the bombing.

50, On 7 and 8 August 1998, two other members of al-Qaida disseminated claims of responsibility for the two bombings by sending faxes to media organizations in Paris, Doha in Qatar, and Dubai in the United Arab Emirates

51. Additional evidence of the involvement of al-Oaida in the East African bombings came from a search conducted in London of several residences and businesses belonging to al-Qaida and Egyptian Islamic Jihad members. In those searches a number of documents were found including claims of responsibility for the East African bombings in the name of a fictitious group, 'the Islamic Army for the liberation of the Holy Places

52. Al 'Owali, the would-be suicide bomber, admitted he was told to make a videotape of himself using the name of the same fictitious group

53. The faxed claims of responsibility were traced to a telephone number, which had been in contact with Osama bin Laden's cell phone. The claims disseminated to the press were clearly written by someone familiar with the conspiracy. They stated that the bombings had been carried out by two Saudis in Kenya, and one Egyptian in Dar es Salaam. They were probably sent before the bombings had even taken place. They referred to two Saudis dying in the Nairobi attack. In fact, because Al 'Owali fled at the last minute, only one Saudi died,

54. On 22 December 1998 Osama bin Laden was asked by Time magazine whether he was responsible for the August 1998 attacks. He replied: "The International Islamic Jihad Front for the jihad against the U.S. and Israel has, by the grace of God, issued a crystal clear fatwa calling on the Islamic nation to carry on Jihad aimed at liberating the holy

. يستخدم مكتب التحقيقات الفيدرالي برنامج كمبيوتر قوي يحمل اسم دي سي إس مئة أو كانيفور، للتجسس على شبكات الكمبيوتر في الولايات المتحدة.

ويعمل البرنامج بالطريقة التقليدية التي تعمل بها برامج البحث في الإنترنت، حيث يضع المستخدم كلمة رئيسية ليجد كل المعلومات التي تحتوي تلك الكلمة في الإنترنت. ويعمل البرنامج بسرعة لا تصدق، مستخدما عددا ضخما من ما يعرف بـ السوبر كمبيوتر، أو الكمبيوترات الخارقة، التي تملكها الحكومة الأمريكية.

لكن العائق الذي يواجه تلك العملية هو أنها تبحث عن المعلومات أثناء تبادلها، وليس عن المعلومات المخزنه ،والبحث عن اتصالات سابقة عن الاختطاف من الأسبوع الماضى أو ما قبل ذلك ممكن، لكنه ابطأ ومعقد بشكل أكبر ويشمل هذا شركات خدمات الكمبيوتر التي تتعامل مع المعلومات التي تخص تحديد الأماكن التي أرسلت منها الرسائل.

ويستطيع من يرغب في الهروب من مثل تلك الملاحقة إرسال رسائله من أي مقهى للإنترنت. وأكثر من ذلك يمكن تشفير الرسائل المرسلة.

برامج كمبيوتر تكشف الكسالى في العمل

ظهر في الأسواق الأمريكية برنامج كمبيوتر يتيح كشف المواقع التي يزورها مستخدمو الإنترنت، فتهافت لشرائه المديرون الحريصون على عدم استخدام موظفيهم لشبكة الإنترنت لغير غايات العمل، والأزواج الخائفون من خديعة الشريك.

يقول الإعلان عن هذا البرنامج "أعرف كل ما يقوم به المحيطون بك على الإنترنت أكانوا من العاملين معك أم من أولادك أم شريكك في المنزل».

ويبدو أن هذا البرنامج لقى في البداية رواجاً في أماكن العمل ويقول (أندرو كونري موراي) الصحفي العامل في مجلة نتورك ماغازين أن تطور الإنترنت في مكان العمل كان مؤذيا جدا حيث يستخدم الموظفون الشبكة العالمية إما لقراءة رسائلهم الخاصة أو لشراء أغراضهم وربما لزيارة مواقع اباحية.

وكشفت دراسة قامت بها مؤسسة (أي دي سي رييسرتش) أن ما بين ثلاثين وأربعين بالمانة من نشاط الموظفين على الإنترنت لا علاقة له بالعمل مما أدى إلى تراجع الإنتاجية في الشركات وقد اقترحت شركات برمجة على أرباب العمل برامج مراقبة وبعد تحميل كمبيوترات الشركة أو شبكة

الاتصال فيها هذا البرنامج يصبح بالإمكان تخزين عناوين المواقع التي يزورها الموظفون، ومعرفة ما يكتبونه عبر مراقبة استخدامهم للوحة المفاتيح وحتى الحصول على صور لما يظهر على شاشات الكمبيوترات الخاصة بهم.

ويستطيع رب العمل ساعة ما يشاء كشف كل ما قام به أي موظف طوال النهار على الكمبيوترات خاصته.

وقال أندروشوين من شركة الكترونيك برايفيسي انفورميشن سنتر: «قد ازداد عدد الشركات التي تطلب شراء هذا البرنامج بشكل هائل». وبعد أن كان أرباب العمل والأهل الحريصون على معرفة طريقة استفادة أولادهم من شبكة الإنترنت أهم زبائن هذا البرنامج، وجد صانعوه شريحة جديدة من الزبائن هم الأزواج المخدوعون.

ويروي دوغ فاولر مدير عام شركة سبكتورسوفت التي انتجت هذا البرنامج أن نساء بدأن بشراء هذا البرنامج لاكتشاف مغامرات محتملة قد يقوم بها الزوج أو الخطيب.

وقال أنه أجرى اختبارا فوجد أن الإعلانات التي تروج لهذا البرنامج

على أنه يكشف الخداع الزوجي وجدت زوار بلغ خمسة أضعاف الإعلان الذي يقدم البرنامج على أنه وسيلة لتمكين الأهل من مراقبة عمل الأولاد على الإنترنت.

وكشف أن نصف زباننه حاليا هم من المتزوجين الشكاكين.

إلا أن ريتشارد ايتون المسؤول في الشركة أوضح ضاحكا أن الأزواج الشكاكين يشكلون ما بين ١٠ و ١٥ بالمائة فقط من الذي يشترون هذا البرنامج إلا أنهم يحتلون ثمانين بالمائة من الاتصالات الهاتفية التي تطلب المساعدة الفنية وأوضح أن الكثير من الذي يشترون هذا البرنامج وهم من ربات المنزل اللواتي لم يستخدمن قبلا الكمبيوتر .

وتجنبا لأي مشاكل في المستقبل تضع الشركة تنبيهاً على البرنامج جاء فيه أنه «يمنع تحميل البرنامج على أي كمبيوتر ما لم يكن الشخص المستهدف عالما بالأمر».

وختم قائلا «أما إذا أراد الزبون تجاهل هذا التنبيه فهو حر في ذلك إلا أنه يتحمل عندها مسئولية ما قد ينتج عن كشف معلومات تخص الشخص الخاضع للمراقبة".





تنتاب الولايات المتحدة حالياً نوبة من الذعر والفزع بسبب احتمال انتشار مرض الجمرة الخبيثة (Anthrax) بعمل إرهابي. خاصة بعد وصول طرود بريدية تحوي بودرة بيضاء لمكاتب إعلاميين في مدينة نيويورك، مما أدى إلى إصابة إثنين بهذا المرض القاتل.

بهذا أصبحت حصيلة المصابين في أمريكا خمس حالات، ثلاثة في فلوريدا وإصابتين في نيويورك. كما تم الإعلان عن خمس حالات يشتبه في إصابتها في إيطاليا بعد أن وجدوا أن جميع هؤلاء الأشخاص قد تلقوا طرودا بريدية فيها مسحوق أبيض يشتبه في أنه قد يكون فيروس الجمرة الخبيثة الفتاك. وقد أدت الإصابة الأولى لوفاة صاحبها، ويخشى الشارع الأمريكي أن يكون العشرات غيرهم قد أصيبوا خاصة وأن اكتشاف المرض يتطلب جهدا كبيرا وبعد اكتشاف أعراضه. وزاد من تخوف الشارع الأمريكي تصريحات نائب الرئيس الأمريكي، ديك تشيني، يوم الجمعة الذي قال أنه للأمريكيين أنه لن يندهش إذا تم اكتشاف أن منظمة القاعدة كانت وراء نشر مرض الجمرة الخبيثة. وقد ذكر محللون سياسيون أنه قد يكون ذلك تمهيدا للإعلان فعلأ عن أن المرض نشر من قبل من تشتبه الحكومة الأمريكية بتورطهم بهجوم سبتمبر.

وقد ذكرت الحكومة الأمريكية أن جميع الأدلة المتواجدة حتى الأن تنفي علاقة الربط بين الهجوم الإرهابي على نيويورك وواشنطن في 11 سبتمبر مع هذا العمل الجناني الذي كشف أنه متعمد. ولكن هذا التطمين لم يكن كافياً لإقناع
